The Board of County Commissioners met with all members and Auditor present.

And now on the 2nd day of January A.D. 1901, G. P. Starben, H. F. McCall, Irving H. Welch, J. C. Smith, George Cool and others by their attorneys G. P. Starben, appeared before this Board and presented their application for the Incorporation of the town of Platte, together with an accurate survey and map of the territory intended to be embraced within the limits of said town and an accurate census of the resident population of such territory, and the same coming on regularly before the board for hearing, the applicants were first required to produce, and did produce in compliance with such requirement, proof by the affidavit of H. A. Kuiper, post-master of the town of Platte, that such survey, map and census when completed and verified as required by law were left at the post-office at Platte a convenient place within the territory to be embraced within the limits of said proposed town of Platte, for examination by those having an interest in said application for a period of thirty days as required by law and the board having examined said map, survey and census and heard the petition and proofs, and being satisfied that the requirements of Article 2, Chapter 11 of the political code compiled laws of 1887 have been fully complied with - It is therefore on this 2nd day of January A.D. 1901 ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of said county that the following described territory, to-wit: Beginning at the North east corner of the South east Quarter of the North west
