That there is hereby granted and given to said Wagner, Lake Shore and Armour Traction Co., its successors and assigns permission and the right to use the highways herein after particularly described for the purpose of laying either single or double tracks thereon as said corporation shall determine and running cars thereover for the carriage of freight and passengers, to be propelled by animal, electrical and other mechanical power with all the necessary turnouts, curves and switches with the right to erect trolley poles, wires and other conveniences for the transmission of electrical power and the laying and operation of said railroad along and upon said highway.

Sec. 2. That the grant of the use of said highway to the said corporation and for the purpose aforesaid shall extend for a period of twenty years from and after the 7th day of May, A.D. 1907, and for no longer.

Sec. 3.
