Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the County Auditor of Charles Mix County at Wheeler South Dakota until 1 o'clock P.M. on the 24th day of February 1913 for the erection of all necessary steel and concrete bridges to be constructed upon the roads and highways within said county during the year 1913. in accordance with the conditions herein after contained and in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the office of the County Auditor of said county. All bids to be based upon said specifications and said plans. Said bids to be per lineal foot for the building of all of said bridges that may be required within said county for the year 1913. A certified check on some bank in South Dakota for \$500⁰⁰ must accompany each bid as a guarantee that the bidder, if awarded the contract for the bridges will within ten days execute and file with the County Auditor a surety bond to be approved by the County Commissioners in the amount of 5000⁰⁰ otherwise his check will be forfeited to the county as liquidated damages. All other checks will be returned to the bidder on the day the contract is awarded. The successful bidder or bidders for the construction of said bridges shall commence active work on the same ~~and~~ within sixty days after the date of contract and shall complete all work contracted for. on or before the 15th day of October 1913

After the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. the board. Convened. as a Board of assessment, at which meeting the assessors of ten townships were present.

The laws of assessment and taxation for the year 1913. was discussed Hon J. G. Jones, assessor for Signal township appeared before the Board. and presented the following resolution Where as:

The Constitution of the State of South Dakota limits the rate of taxation, and the basis of bonded indebtedness to a fixed amount of the assessed valuation and,

Where as: It was at the time of the framing of the Constitution, and for time immemorial thereto the established custom to assess property for the purpose of taxation in the same manner and upon the same basic values, and,

Where as: The Legislature at the late session did create a Tax Commission, and the said Tax Commission has taken step to secure an assessed valuation treble the customary basis for taxation and other purposes and.

Where as: This procedure will virtually treble the rate fixed by the Constitution violently arrogating powers not granted by the Constitution, and which if acceded to by all the counties of the state will deprive the people of the most sacred safe guards of the Constitution.

Therefore: Be it resolved; That we the Commissioners of Charles Mix County do hereby advise and direct the Assessors in and for Charles Mix County to assess all property as has been the custom and was the custom and long usage. When the Constitution was considered framed and adopted by the people of the State of South Dakota to the end that Charles Mix County shall not be a party to a dangerous and revolutionary evasion and abuse of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota.

The Board after carefully considering the same, upon motion ordered the resolution spread upon the record with the minutes of the meeting, and while the sentiment of the resolution was fully endorsed by the Board. favorable action could not be granted according to the provisions of the South Dakota Tax Commission Law: the same was therefore voted down.

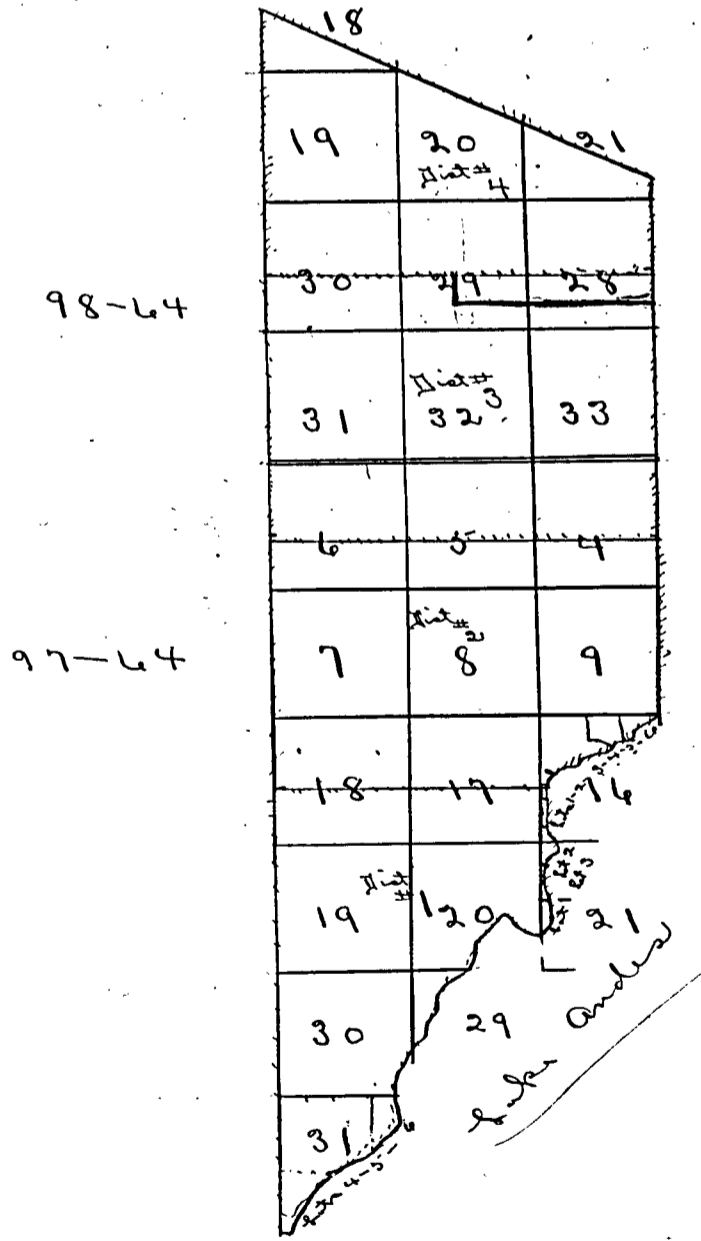

The application of Mrs. Allie Trewartha for a refund of taxes for the year 1910 and 1911 on the NW of SW 1/4 sec 15-99-70 was allowed, for the reason that final proof has not been made on said land.

On motion the County Treasurer. was instructed to redeem from tax sale of 1913 the NW of SW sec. 15-99-70 same being erroneously assessed to said.

On motion Wm H Brazzill, was appointed a committee of one to negotiate with the County Commissioners of Bon Homme County, with reference to a change in the division of the County line for Bridge work. by substituting one section line in place of another heretofore bridged by the Commissioners of Bon Homme County.
