The Board of County Commissioners in and for Charles Mix County, South Dakota, having on the 3rd day of October 1916, met in regular session for the transaction of business at the Court house at Wheeler, South Dakota and said meeting having been duly adjourned by motion made, passed and entered thereat, until the 9th day of November 1916, and said Board of County Commissioners having pursuant to such adjournment duly assembled and met for the transaction of business at the Court House at Wheeler, South Dakota, on the said 9th day of November 1916, and said session having thereat been duly adjourned by motion made, passed and entered until the 28th day of November 1916 and.

Now to wit on this 28th day of November 1916 by said Board of County Commissioners having met and convened pursuant to said adjournment legally taken at the Court House at Lake Andes South Dakota, for the transaction of such business as may legally come before the Board, and.

Whereas it appears to the Board of County Commissioners that Charles Mix County is a County wherein there resides over five hundred legal voters and that said County has been organized for over four years past; that the County Seat of said County has now been permanently and legally located as provided by law at the City of Lake Andes, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and that the building now occupied by said County for Court House, office and jail purposes to wit, the building known as the Carnegie Library Building at said City of Lake Andes, is inadequate to the wants and needs of said County and is unsafe owing to the extraordinary risk of fire and it appearing to the Board necessary for the proper protection of the County records and for the transaction of County Business that a new Court House and jail be built as soon as practical

Be it therefore resolved and it is accordingly ordered that Charles Mix County issue its Bonds in the sum of \$1,000.00 such sum being less in amount than five per cent of the valuation of said County as shown by the last assessment made of said County and including all the outstanding

indebtedness of said County, said bonds to be issued in the manner provided therefor by law, and.

It is further resolved and it is accordingly ordered that an election be held according to law for the purpose of determining by a vote of the electors of Charles Mix County South Dakota, the question of bonds being issued by said County for the purpose of erecting a Court House and jail at the said City of Lake Under, South Dakota, such election to be held in the manner and upon the notice prescribed by law for other elections and the notices of election as published to state the maximum amount of bonds to be issued and the purpose for which said bonds are to be issued and the ballots at said election to have printed thereon substantially the same language as is included in the said notice of election and at the foot thereof shall be printed the words "Shall the above proposition be approved and the bonds issued" with the word "Yes" and "No" printed immediately at the left thereof, each of said words to be preceded by a square wherein the voter can place a cross opposite the word "Yes" for voting in favor of the proposition or a cross in front of the word "No" for voting against the said proposition, and.
