Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners of said County having heretofore determined, that the present buildings used and occupied by said

County for Court House and Jail purposes were inadequate for such purposes and are exposing the County to extraordinary risks from fire and otherwise, and having heretofore pursuant to the power and authority derived from sections 970, 971, and 972 Political Code 1903 and Acts Amendatory thereof, by proper resolution of said board made and passed on the 28th day of November, 1916, called a Special Election of the electors of said County on the 19th day of December, 1916, in each and every voting precinct of said County, for the purpose of determining by a vote of the electors of said County the question of issuing the bonds of this County in the maximum sum of \$150,000⁰⁰ for the purpose of erecting a Court House and Jail for said County at the City of Lake Andes, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and
