

RESOLUTION

Whereas, on November 4, 1922, there was presented to and filed with the County Auditor a petition signed by more than ten legal voters residing in Wahehe School District No 4. and Wahehe School District No 5, of Charles Mix County, South Dakota petitioning the Board of County Commissioners and the Superintendent of Schools for a change of the boundary line between said school districts under the provision of section 7447 of the South Dakota Revised Code of 1919, so that the boundary line of each of said School Districts would be as follows :

WAHEHE SCHOOL DISTRICT NO.4.

The the South and west boundary lines remain the same as now established; that the northern boundary line at the east end as now established should terminate at the Northwest corner of Lot number Two (2), in Section 21, Township 94, North of Range 64 west of the 5th P.M. and that the east boundary line should commence at the said Northwest corner of said, of numbered 2. in section 21, Township 94, North of Range 64, West, and thence run directly South to the Missouri River.

WAHEHE SCHOOL DISTRICT NO.5.

That the South and east boundary lines remain the same as now established: and that the Northern boundary line be extended directly west to the Northwest corner of Lot number Two (2) in Section 21, Township 94, North of Range 64, west of the 5th P. M. and that the West Boundary line should commence at the said Northwest Corner of said lot number two (2) in Section 21, Township 94, North of Range 64, West, and thence run directly South to the Missouri River.

AND WHEREAS, it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board of County Commissioners that due notice of said petition has been given to the School Boards of said districts, and the Superintendent of Schools being present; and it appearing to the satisfaction of said Board of County Commissioners and the Superintendent of Schools that such change is for the best interest of the patrons of the respective school districts, it is therefore
