THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLES MIX COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, MEET IN REGULAR SESSION--NEW CHAIRMAN ELECTED--Numerous Bills Allowed.

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, January 5, 1926.--The board of county commissioners met in regular session for the January meeting 1926. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Harm Meyerink. On roll call all members being present, McBride, Meyerink and Baxa.

The first matter taken up was the election of a chairman for the ensuing year. A motion was made by McBride and seconded by Meyerink that Joseph Baxa be made chairman for the coming year. On roll call all members voting "aye."

The minutes of the last meeting were read and upon motion duly made were approved.

A number of the members of the Charles Mix County Fair Association were in waiting and called upon the board. They were asking for an appropriation of \$902.55 to pay off the premiums of the fair association for 1925. A motion was made by Meyerink to appropriate the above sum, but it received no second. A motion was made by McBride that the board take the matter under advisement and bring the matter up later on in the meeting. This motion was seconded by Baxa. Upon roll call McBride voting "aye," Baxa voting "aye," Meyerink not voting.

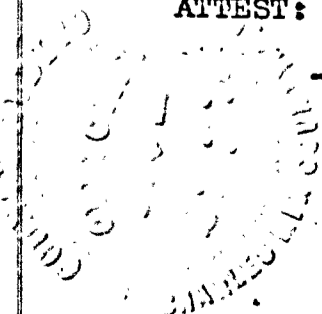

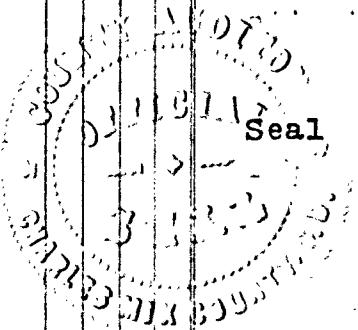

WHEREAS, A resolution has heretofore been adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix county, fixing the compensation of the Sheriff of said county for his services in the capacity of County Jailor, at the sum of \$100.00 per month, without regard to the number of prisoners confined in the county jail, and such arrangement not appearing to be for the best interest of the county, it is,

RESOLVED, That the salary of the county jailor of \$100.00 per month heretofore allowed to the sheriff of the county be discontinued, and that, in lieu of such salary, there be allowed and paid to the sheriff, if he elect to act as jailor in person, or to a deputy sheriff appointed as such jailor such reasonable fees and expenses as may be authorized by law for such services and as may be found to be reasonable and proper.

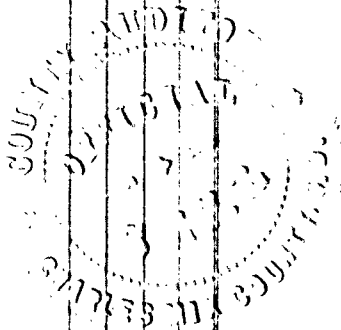

ORDERED, That the section line highway beginning at a point 200 feet east of the northwest corner of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 22, in township 95, north of range 62, west of the 5th principal meridian in Charles Mix county, South Dakota, and running thence east for a distance of 2287 feet, more or less, to a point where State Highway #203-a intersects with the said section line ~~#####~~ excluding that portion of the said section line at the intersections of sections 14-15-22-23, in said township and range, which excluded portion is a tract of land 66 feet square, be, and the same is hereby vacated and discontinued as a public highway. The said resolution can be found on file in the office of the County Auditor and has been made a record in the office of the register of deeds of Charles Mix county, South Dakota.

There being no further business before the board at this time upon motion duly made and carried adjourned to meet at 9:00 a. m. on September 7, 1926.

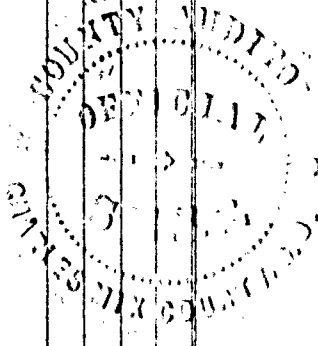

RESOLVED, That the State's Attorneys office be, and it is hereby instructed and directed to forthwith institute and prosecute in the name of the county, civil actions for the purpose of recovering any and all of such claims and accounts where it may appear that such insane persons have property or estates liable for the payment of such claims, or against the persons legally charged with the support of such insane persons.

-----  
 A petition was presented to the board signed by sixty-one legal voters of Jackson township asking for a division of the township so as to make two polling places. The matter was taken up with the deputy state's attorney who ruled that the said township could not be divided at this time, giving as his reasons that it would require that "each organized civil township constitute one election precinct, until such township shall have cast five hundred or more votes, and that no division could be legally made unless the required number of votes are cast." Jackson township has never cast the required number to be listed as such township. Therefore, the board was forced to reject the application.

The application of John A. Stork for a refund of the 1922 personal tax in the City of Geddes was re-opened for hearing with additional affidavits having been filed. The same was rejected for the reason that the board felt as though they had given the matter due consideration on the first hearing.

The application for a refund by the Lakeside State Bank on the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 35-96-66 for the year 1923, was granted for the reason that said land was not patented until May 25th, 1923, and was not assessable for that year. The amount of tax being \$30.31. The auditor was instructed to issue refund order for same.

The application of the Secretary of the I.O.O.F. Lodge, No.149, Platte, South Dakota, for a ~~refund~~ refund was presented to the board for consideration. Said refund being for the last half of the 1922 taxes on Lot 8, Block 22 in the City of Platte amounting to \$56.97 and the full tax on the same description for 1923 amounting to \$116.99 making a total of \$173.96. The matter was referred to the deputy state's attorney for an opinion and following will be found his reply in part: "It would therefore appear that this application should be rejected as to the years named, and on the further ground that the only remedy for the recovery of a tax illegally paid or levied, is by payment under protest and suit to recover brought within thirty days." The board rejected the said application.

The application of Wesley Metz for a refund of \$6.79 on the E $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 4-96-63 for the first half of tax for the year 1925, was granted, for the reason that the said Wesley Metz was not the owner of said tract of land at the time same was assessed against him by the assessor of Bryan township and also that no patent has ever been put on record in the office of the register of deeds of Charles Mix county, South Dakota, up to this date, on this particular piece of real estate, it being Indian land, and not subject to taxation.

The application of Geo.L.Chesley, holder of 1925 Tax Sale Certificates numbered 130, 133 and 134, for refund of the amounts paid for said Certificates was, upon recommendation of the Deputy States Attorney, rejected by unanimous vote of the Board. Such application was made upon the theory that the lands covered by such Certificates were not liable for taxation for the year for which the Certificates were issued, but it was made to appear to the Board that the lands had been patented in Fee and that the attempted withdrawal of same from the tax lists by the U. S. Indian Department was illegal and void.

The petition of Mike Koupal and others asking for the vacation of a public section line highway in township 94, range 62, in Charles Mix county, having been at this time presented to the board for action, and it appearing from the return of Joseph Baxa, chairman of the board of county commissioners of Charles Mix county, that due and legal notice of the hearing on said petition has been posted as required by law for more than thirty days, the said petition was brought on for action, and Joseph Baxa, A.G.McBride and Harm Meyerink, members of the board of county commissioners, were appointed to make report and recommendation in the premises. The commencement and the termination of the highway proposed to be vacated being established, the employment of a survey is dispensed with. Order for vacation of section line highway 66 feet wide between Sections 16 and 21, township 94, range 62, will be signed by the chairman of the board at this meeting on September 8, 1926, at 3:00 p.m.

INSANITY REPORT.

L.E. Corey, deputy state's attorney, made a complete report of all transactions of the state's attorneys office in relation to claims due to the county for the treatment and maintenance of insane patients at the State Hospital for the Insane at Yankton, S.D. Said report being on file in the office of the county auditor. From such report, the following is a recapitulation of what has been accomplished:

At the close of the quarter ending June 30, 1926, there were in the Hospital as patients from this county 28 persons and the total amount owing to the county on account of the care of these patients was \$36,209.03.

Settlements have been made of these claims to the amount of \$5,615.57.

Settlements in connection with the above mentioned accounts to the amount of \$1999.33 are pending with reasonable prospects of satisfactory conclusion.

Cash collections on old claims for care of patients previously discharged have been made to the amount of \$100.00.

Old claims are in process of adjustment to the amount of \$1864.99, with suit pending on one of these in the amount of \$1242.67.

Of the patients included in the charge made by the State Hospital on June 30th, two have passed away and one has been discharged. Since that date two new patients have been admitted.

From the investigation made by this office it would appear that there are now in the Hospital 20 persons who are county charges and 7 persons who are financially able to pay for their treatment and maintenance.

Total of settlements effected at this time \$5, 715.57.

The County Auditor may make or receive for substitutions other securities of equal amount in place of securities desired or asked to be withdrawn by any bank or depository desiring such withdrawal for collection purposes or for legitimate business purposes, ~~#####~~ upon the written consent and approval of the County Commissioner from the Commissioners District in which any such bank or depository is located together with the consent of the County Auditor; such substitution may be made at any time, Provided that such substitution shall be subject to the action of the entire Board of County Commissioners at its next regular meeting thereafter, when such substitutions may be approved or rejected.

It is further resolved, that at any regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, upon application by any bank or depository, excess collateral securities of any depository or bank by action of the said Board of County Commissioners, shall be returned to any bank or depository down to an equal amount to the amount of money on deposit in such bank or depository.
