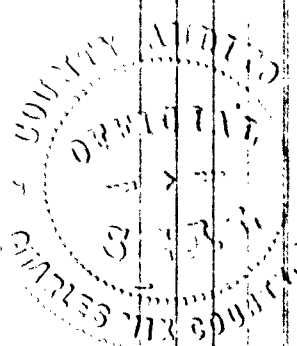

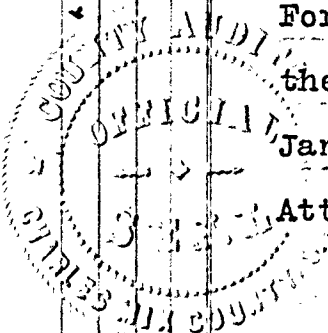

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

The following amendments to the Constitution are submitted by the Legislature to a vote of the people. The Legislature recommends the adoption of these amendments.

A

A JOINT RESOLUTION, Proposing and Agreeing to an Amendment to Section 11, of Article 8 of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, Relating to the Investment of the Moneys of the Permanent School and other Educational Funds.

Explanatory Statement by the Attorney General:

The existing Section 11 provides that the moneys of the permanent school fund and other educational funds shall be invested in farm mortgages, and certain bonds, and that all moneys of said funds which from time to time be designated for such investment, shall be divided among the organized counties of the state, in proportion to population, and that the county shall hold and manage the same as trust funds, and shall be and remain responsible for the principal and interest of all such funds; that the rate of interest shall not be less than five percent per annum.

The purpose and legal effect of the proposed amendment is to provide for the investment of the permanent school and other educational funds by the Department of School and Public Lands, only in first mortgages on farm lands, within the state, bonds of school corporations, organized counties, townships, or incorporated cities, the United States or securities guaranteed by the United States, leaving the interest rate on all investments except the bonds of the United States or securities guaranteed by the United States to be fixed by the legislature; requiring the legislature to provide legislation necessary to secure safe, continuous investment of such funds; relieving the counties of the burden of investment and handling of such funds as trust funds, and the responsibilities connected therewith.

A vote "Yes" is in favor of a change in the Constitution as above indicated; and a vote "No" is in favor of leaving the Constitution as it now exists.

A JOINT RESOLUTION, Proposing and Agreeing to Amendment of Sections 1 and 3 of Article 14 of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, Relating to State Institutions.

Explanatory Statement by the Attorney General:

The existing Section 1 designates the penitentiary, insane hospital, school for the deaf and dumb, school for the blind, and reform school as the charitable and penal institutions of the State of South Dakota, which institutions are under the control of the Board of Charities and Corrections.

The existing Section 3 places the state university, the agricultural college, normal schools, and all other educational institutions sustained wholly, or in part, by the state, under the control of a board of five members, known as the Board of Regents.

The purpose and legal effect of the proposed amendment is to designate the penitentiary, insane hospital, school for the feeble-minded, and the reform school, as the charitable and penal institutions of the state, under the control of the Board of Charities and Corrections; and places the school of mines and technology, the school for the deaf, and the school for the blind, and all other educational institutions, under the control of the Board of Regents.

A vote "Yes" is in favor of a change in the Constitution as above indicated; and a vote "No" is in favor of leaving the Constitution as it now exists.

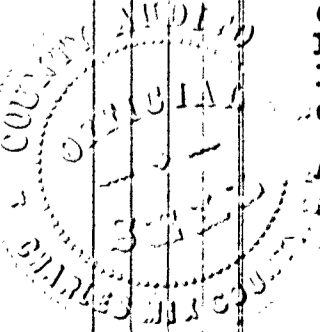
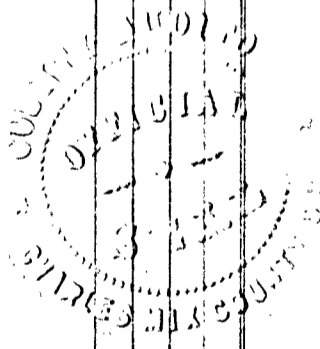

After examining the petitions the following resolution was presented to the board by Commissioner Baxa:

"WHEREAS", The crops for the preceding year, 1926, in the county of Charles Mix in South Dakota have been a partial failure because of the drouth which prevailed throughout said county last Spring and Summer, and

"WHEREAS," A petition in writing duly signed by fifty or more freeholders, resident in the said county, and same duly filed with the County Auditor of said county on the 8th day of March, 1927, asking said Board of County Commissioners to issue bonds or warrants of said county and with the proceeds from the sale of same to purchase seed grain for the inhabitants of said county who are in need of seed grain and are unable to procure the same, and,

"WHEREAS", Now on this 15th day of March 1927 at a meeting duly called by the County Auditor of said county, said Board of County Commissioners taking up and examining said petition and duly considering the same and the qualifications of the signers thereof, and said board being satisfied that said petition is regular and is as required by law, particularly as required under the provisions of the SEED GRAIN LAW, comprising Sections 5824 to 5843, inclusive, and acts amendatory thereof, and

"WHEREAS", Petition has been duly filed in the office of the County Auditor and presented to this Board asking that this Board issue the seed grain bonds or warrants of the County, and said petition has been duly examined and considered, now, therefore, be it,

"RESOLVED", By the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, that during the year, 1926, there was a total or partial crop failure in said county by reason of drouth, hail and other causes; that said petition is signed by at least fifty (50) freeholders resident of said county and is in all things sufficient and proper, and should be and is hereby granted.

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That sealed bids shall be received by this Board at the Court House in the City of Lake Andes, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, until the 28th day of March, 1927, at 2:00 o'clock p.m. for the purchase of either seed grain bonds or seed grain warrants of said county in the amount of \$300,000.00; that at said time and place said bids shall be opened and considered by said commissioners; that in case this Board shall determine to issue bonds the same shall be dated April 1st, 1927, and shall mature April 1st, 1929; and that if warrants are issued they shall be dated on the date of actual issuance and delivery and shall be payable when there are funds available therefor in the County Treasury, upon (15) days' notice thereof mailed to the payee, such warrants to be registered and endorsed as presented for payment and not paid for want of funds on the date of such issuance; and that whether bonds or war-

rants are issued they shall be in denominations of \$500 each, shall bear interest at the rate specified by the purchaser, but not exceeding six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semiannually; and that both principal and interest shall be payable at any suitable bank or trust company in the United States, designated by the successful bidder.

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice or receipt of said bids by publication of the Notice hereinafter prescribed in at least two issues of the legal newspapers published in said county the first publication to be at least ten (10) days prior to said date for last receipt of bids, exclusive of the date of such first publication, which notice shall be in substantially the following form:

Notice is hereby given that the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, will meet at the court house in the city of Lake Andes, South Dakota, on the 28th day of March, 1927, at two o'clock p.m. for the purpose of opening and considering bids for the purchase of \$30,000.00 of seed grain bonds of said county, said bonds if issued to be dated April 1st, 1927, and to mature April 1st, 1929. Sealed bids will also be opened by said commissioners at said time and place for the purchase of \$30,000.00 of seed grain warrants issued in lieu of such bonds, such warrants if issued to be date on the day of their actual issuance and delivery to be registered as presented for payment and not paid for want of funds on the date of such issue and to be payable when funds are available therefor in the County Treasury upon fifteen (15) days' notice mailed to the payee or other payment dates designated at time of opening bids. The following Commissioners voted in favor thereof: L.W. Riffle, and the following voted against the same: Joseph Baxa, A.G. McBride, whereupon such motion was declared lost.

Motion made by Baxa and seconded by Riffle that the plan for letting out seed grain by the county to needy farmers resident in the county be as follows: "That such accepted applicants execute a contract in the form of a mortgage lien contract giving the county a first lien upon the crop and that said contract be also executed by the owner of the land upon which such seed is to be sown or planted, and such applicant must submit therewith a release of any and all liens by persons having any interest or lien in or upon the crop to be grown on the land upon which such grain is to be sown or planted, so that the county will have a first lien upon such crop for the year 1927, and such contract shall provide that the county shall have a valid tax lien upon the land upon which such seed is sown or planted for said year."

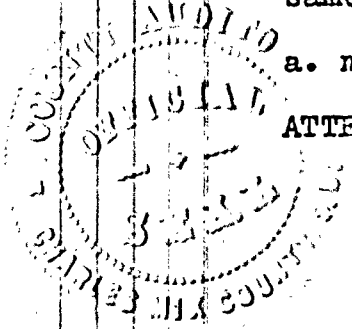
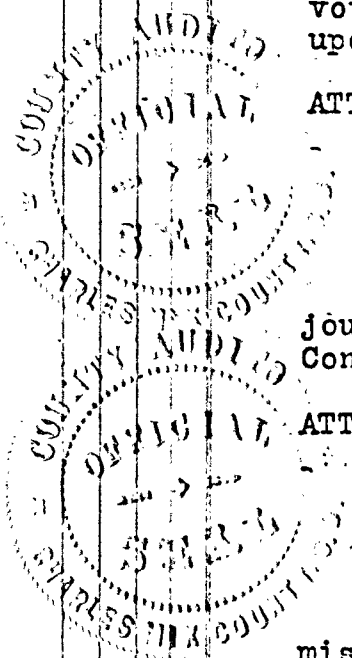

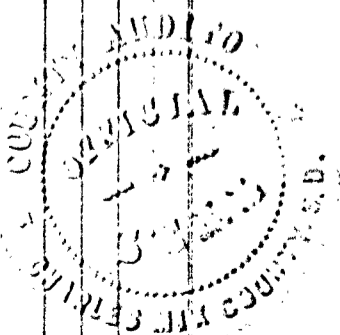

Application of Ed. Kreeger for abatement of taxes for 1926 on part of Out Lot 'A' in Ravinia, was allowed, on account of double assessment.

Application of Ed. Kreeger for abatement of taxes for 1920 and 1921, 1923 & 1924 on part of Out Lot 'A' in Ravinia, was allowed, such taxes being wholly erroneous owing to double assessment and full tax having been paid.

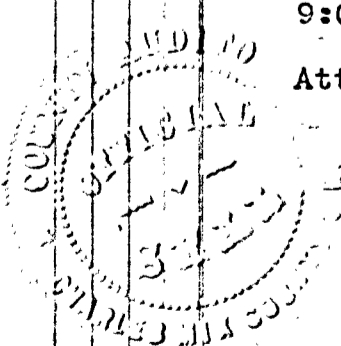

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, The County of Charles Mix heretofore acquired title to a tract of land containing One and Sixty-eight Hundreths (1 - 68/100) acres located in Lot Nine Hundred and Four (904), Township Ninety-four (94), North of Range sixty-two (62), West of the 5th P.M., being a strip of land Sixty-six (66) feet in width and extending across the corner of the land described as shown on the record of the highway plat as recorded in Book 39 of Deeds on Page 481, thereof, being land transferred to Charles Mix County, for road purposes by the United States By and through the Department of the Interior.

AND WHEREAS, Said road over said land has now been abandoned, and the owner of said quarter has deeded to the County of Charles Mix, other land which has been used in the construction of a new highway,

AND WHEREAS, Said land is no longer used or needed for highway purposes or for any public purposes, and it is to the best interests of the County to sell such property,

BE IT RESOLVED, That it is for the best interests of Charles Mix County to sell the real property above described, and that the same be offered for sale in accordance with the provisions of Article 7, of Chapter 1, of Part 7, of Title 6, of the Revised Code of the State of South Dakota, of the year 1919.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, That before said property is offered for sale that the same be appraised by a board of appraisers to consist of the Superintendent of Schools, the County Treasurer and the County Auditor, and that no sale shall be made for a less sum than the amount of such appraisement. That notice of Sale be published in each of the official newspapers of the county at least once each week for three successive weeks before the day of said sale.

Motion by Baxa and seconded by Riffle that the foregoing resolution be approved and upon rollcall, all members voting "aye."

A petition signed by a number of the freeholders of Carroll township was presented to the board by the County Auditor asking for the erection of a steel bridge between Section 19-100-67 and Section 20-100-67 the estimated cost of said bridge to exceed the sum of \$200.00. The board tabled the petition and will investigate the matter at once.

The bond of Louis Engelhorn as treasurer of Plain Center township was approved.

The bond of William H. Gollinger as assessor of the Town of Ravinia was approved.

The bond of B.F. Roblins as Justice of the Peace of Rouse township was approved.

The extension certificate on the bond of Louis Dvorak, treasurer of White Swan township was approved.

The private bond of Ada E. Loken, for County Superintendent of Schools was approved and to take effect at the close of business at 6:00 p.m. on June 7, 1926.

The following resolution was presented to the board for their approval by the members of the Isaac Walton League of the City of Lake Andes:

"At a meeting held on June 2nd, 1927, by the Lake Andes Chapter #47 Isaac Walton League at which time some thirty-five members were present the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

"Be it Resolved, That this branch of the League respectfully petition and request that the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, open or cause to be opened all public roads or section lines leading up to the shores of Lake Andes, many of the said section lines are now closed by the owners of the adjoining land thereby making it impossible for the public to reach the shores of said lake without transgressing on private lands, causing much inconvenience to all concerned. This league wishes to plant trees on all said section line stubs so opened, leaving a roadway thereby permitting travel to and from said lake shores.

"We the undersigned committee selected ~~#####~~ by the said chapter to present this resolution do most respectfully urge that this necessary request be granted." L.S. Vandall, C.L. Farrell, G.H. Patrick, Committee.

After due consideration the Board instructed the County Auditor to put the following notice in the official newspapers of Charles Mix County for at least two successive issues:

"It having been brought to the attention of the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, by the Isaac Walton League of the City of Lake Andes that certain section lines leading to the shores of said Lake Andes have been closed by fencing or cultivation, therefore be it,

"Resolved, That all of said public highways not legally closed be opened to the public travel and all fences be removed at once. By order of the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota.

Motion made by Riffle and seconded by Baxa that the Board of County Commissioners buy one scarifier for the Adams grader in Commissioner's District No. 1, of the J.D. Adams Co., to be delivered in the City of Wagner, S.D. for \$131.00. On roll call all members voting "aye."

The application of A.L. Vanderboom Agent for Charles B. Smith, and his resident agent and manager of his business at Platte, S.D. for an abatement of grain tax in the city of Platte for the year 1926, amounting to \$218.79 was granted for the reason that the manager in giving in the assessment made his figures too large and was unaware of the fact until notified of the large tax placed against said C.B. Smith.

The application of J.F. Sattler for a refund on the erroneous assessment of Lots 1487 and 1498, Section 25-94-62, for the year 1926 was granted for the reason that said lots were Indian allotments and was not subject to taxation for that year, also that said J.F. Sattler was not the owner of said lots at the time of assessment. Said refund being for the first half of tax paid by said affiant and after the full tax on Lot 7-Section 25-94-62 is paid for 1926, the refund should be \$18.72, said first half was paid by receipt #2995.

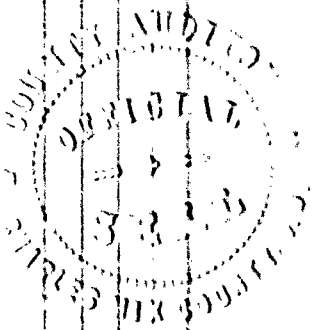

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLES MIX COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, MEET IN REGULAR SESSION--ALSO MEET AS COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION FOR YEAR 1927.

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, July 5, 1927.--The board of county commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, met in the Court House in the City of Lake Andes, on Tuesday, July 5th, 1927 and convened as a county board of equalization. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, A.G.McBride. Upon roll call all members reported present: Joseph Baxa, L.W.Riffle, A.G.McBride and C.H.Robertson, county auditor, who is clerk of the board.

There being no business before the board of equalization at this time on motion duly made and carried the board adjourned and reconvened as a county board of commissioners.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and upon motion duly made and carried was approved as read.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING COUNTY TREASURER TO TRANSFER COUNTY FUNDS.

WHEREAS, On July 5th, 1927, there being a deficiency of \$4,895.63 in the General Fund of the County and that the Board of County Commissioners deem it necessary and advisable to make a transfer of money to meet the oncoming business of the county until the taxes can be collected in the fall, Therefore, it is hereby

RESOLVED, That \$14,000.00 be and the same is hereby transferred from the Bridge Fund of said county to the General Fund of said county, Also, be it,

RESOLVED, That \$1,000.00 be transferred from the Bridge Fund of Charles Mix county to the Mothers Pension Fund of the county for the reason that it is deemed necessary and advisable to make such transfer to be able to keep such fund from being overdrawn until taxes come in this fall, Also, be it,

RESOLVED, That \$500.00 be transferred from the Rouse School District Bond and Interest Fund to the General Fund of the County for the reason that on January 1, 1925, the said \$500.00 was transferred from the County General Fund to the Rouse School District Bond and Interest Fund to meet and emergency at that time.

And that E.E.Wilson, County Treasurer of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make such transfer on the books and records in his office and report the same to C.H.Robertson, County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, who shall likewise note the transfer on the books and records of his office.

On motion by Riffle and seconded by Baxa it is asked that the above transfers be made. Upon roll call all members voting "aye," Riffle, Baxa and McBride.

Mrs. C. Vanderboom, chairman of the Charles Mix County Home Extension Service appeared before the board and asked for an appropriation for the year 1927-1928. Upon motion by Baxa and second by Riffle the board appropriated \$300.00 for that purpose, by a unanimous vote of the board. The auditor was instructed to pay over the same when the proper claim was filed in his office for such purpose.

Motion was made by Riffle and seconded by Baxa that the county auditor be instructed to advertise for sealed bids for the purchase of 120 tons of soft coal, same to be used in a down draft furnace. All deliveries to be made f.o.b. Lake Andes, South Dakota, and time for delivery will be made at time of letting, which will be set for August 2, 1927 at 3:00 p.m. at the court house in the city of Lake Andes. The board having reserved the right to reject any and all bids. Motion carried.

On June 14, 1927, the Sheriff of Charles Mix County, filed the appointment of Clarence Hammer and Edwin Hammer as deputy sheriffs to assist in the general duties of that office. On July 5th, 1927, the appointments were presented to the Board of County Commissioners for their approval and after giving the same due consideration it was moved by Riffle and seconded by Baxa, that the Sheriff of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, be allowed four regular deputies to handle the business of his office for the remainder of his two years for which he was elected or until January 1, 1929, and the services of such deputies to be paid out of the regular fees of the office. On roll call all members voting "aye."

RESOLUTION FOR VACATION OF HIGHWAY SECTION LINE.

WHEREAS, An agreement has been entered into by and between the Township Supervisors of Bryan Township, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railway Company, by the terms of which the said Railway Company is to construct a detour highway at a point where the railway track crosses the section line between Sections 32 and 33, in Township 96, North of Range 63, West of the Fifth Principal Meridian, in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, so as to provide for a crossing of the right of way of the said railway company under the railway track, and under and through the bridge of trestle across which the said railway track now passes, near to such section line, in the approximate course that has been traveled as a public road or highway for more than twenty years past. Such detour highway to be constructed from the point where the same departs from the section line to the north of the Railway Right of Way to the point where the same re-enters the said section line to the south of the said Right of Way, without expense to the said Bryan Township, to the County of Charles Mix or to the State of South Dakota, and at the expense and charge of the said Railway Company.

Such detour highway is to be constructed and to consist of a good and substantial grade, with a substantial and permanent bridge or culverts, and to be raised approximately three feet above its present level, with such guard rails and protections as may be necessary for safe and convenient travel thereupon; the grade to be of a width of not less than twenty feet, and to be surfaced with cinders so as to protect same from destruction or damage from rains or melting snows, and to be so constructed as to be reasonably passable at all seasons of the year.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Charles Mix, State of South Dakota, in regular session assembled, that, in consideration of and upon the full completion of such detour highway as aforesaid by the said Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railway Company, that that portion of the Section line between the said Sections 32 and 33, in said Township 96, North of Range 63, which is with in and upon and across the Right of Way of the said Railway Company, be, and the same is hereby vacated and closed, and that the course of the said highway be, and the same is hereby, changed to follow the detour herein before described.

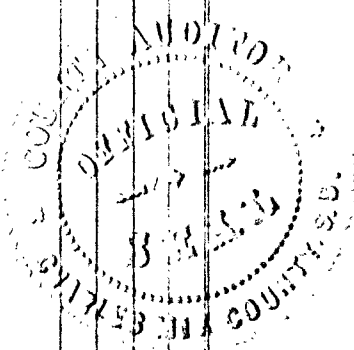

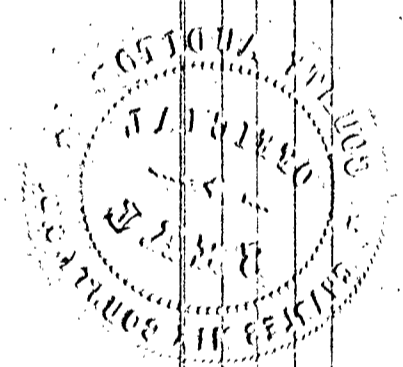

And it satisfactorily appearing from said report and the proofs submitted therewith that said described land was appraised in accordance with law at the sum of \$75.00, and in pursuance of the resolution of the board here tofore passed by this board on the 7th day of June, 1927, that the notice of sale of said described land was duly published for three weeks in each of the three official newspapers, once each week prior to the date of said sale; that said land was offered for sale at public auction to the highest bidder for cash, at the front door of the court house in the City of Lake Andes, South Dakota on the 20th day of August, 1927, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock P.M., in accordance with said Notice of Sale; and that upon said public auction sale, J.V. Janda of Wagner, S.D. was the highest bidder, he having bid the sum of \$75.00 cash for said land, and deposited the same with the County Auditor, and,

Janda, in accordance with the provisions of Section 5801 of the South Dakota Revised Code of 1919.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said consideration be deposited by the County Treasurer to the credit of the County General Fund as required by Section 5804 of the South Dakota Revised Code of 1919.

Motion made by Baxa and seconded by Riffle that the above resolution be approved. All votion"aye", Baxa, Riffle and McBride.

A petition was filed with the County Auditor by a resident of Lone Tree township and signed by a number of the prominent citizens in the east end of the county asking the board to work in conjunction with the board of county commissioners of Bon Homme county in opening up a public highway on the Section line between Section 25-95-62 in Charles Mix County and Section 30-95-61 in Bon Homme county. The matter was taken under consideration until September 7 for action.

The next matter taken up was the Petition of White Swan School District No. 9 and Wahehe School District No. 3, for to change of boundary lines. The board called the County Superintendent into the meeting to act with them on the matter. The county auditor having notified all school officers in the two districts the legal number of days before such action was to be taken. L.E. Jordan filed a petition in opposition to the changing of the boundary lines signed by 31 legal residents of said district. The first petition filed to change the boundary lines was signed by 25 legal voters of the two districts. After giving the matter due consideration a motion was made by Riffle and seconded by Baxa that the petition be rejected. Upon roll call all members voting "aye," Baxa, Riffle, McBride and Loken.

Edna F. Shell, the owner of the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$, 4-96-63, filed an application for abatement of interest on the taxes on said land for the years 1919 and 1920, and offered to pay in full settlement of such taxes the face amount thereof, \$124.54. Taxes for each of the years since having been fully paid, and applicant holding clear receipts therefor, and such application having the approval of the States Attorney, the same was, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, allowed.

The claim of R.L. Sheetz Bank Vault Service Co., was rejected for the reason that said company did not fill their agreement with the county on service. Amount \$65.00.

The application of Wallie Price for an abatement of road poll tax in the City of Wagner for the year 1926 was granted, amounting to two dollars, for the reason that the same was approved by the City Council of the City of Wagner.

The petition signed by a number of the citizens of Choteau Creek township asking for a graded road and gravel from the Douglas county line south of Delmont to the south end of Choteau Creek township was presented to the board for their consideration. It was decided to table the petition at this time and will be taken up at a later date.

There being no further business before the board at this time on motion duly made and carried the board adjourned to meet on September 7, 1927 at 9:00 a.m.

The following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, A petition has been filed with the County Auditor and presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, S.D., setting forth among other matters the necessity of opening the highway or placing same in a passable condition, the Section line between Section 25 in Township 95 North, Range 62 West of the 5th P.M. in Charles Mix County on the West and Section 30 in Township 95 North, Range 61 in Bon Homme County, on the East, but alleging that said line for the greater part of its length coincides with Dry Choteau Creek which forms the boundary line between said counties, which would necessitate the expenditure of large and almost prohibitive amounts of money to build grades and several large bridges; and said petition asking for the abandonment of said line as a highway jointly with said Bon Homme County; And asking that instead that title be acquired to a strip of land for such road purposes on and upon the boundary line between the west half of the East half of said Section 25 and the East half of the East half of said Section 25 above referred to, and to be jointly acquired purchased and constructed by said Charles Mix County and said Bon Homme County equally, in the place of the said highway lying between said counties heretofore mentioned; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners in regular session this 7th day of September 1927, having examined said petition and the signatures there-to, and the same being signed by a large number of persons in this county who are directly interested in having such road opened and made passable, and said petition also being signed by a large number residing in said Bon Homme County who are likewise interested; and the Board of County Commissioners having duly considered the matter and the need and necessity of such a highway, and being satisfied in the premises:

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY RESOLVED, That it is expedient and necessary that said petition be granted, and that said Board proceed to acquire title to the strip for highway purposes, of the proper width, upon the line between said West half of the East half of said Section 25 and the East half of the East Half of said Section 25 as above described, and acquire the same by negotiation or in the manner as provided by law in such cases; and that they proceed to abandon the former highway or Section line between said Section 25 in Township 95 North, Range 62 West of the 5th P.M. in Charles Mix County, S.D., and Section 30 in Township 95 North, Range 61 West of the 5th P.M. in Bon Homme County, S.D. according to law in such case made and provided for vacating or abandoning highways.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution is not and shall not be effective until the Board of County Commissioners of Bon Homme County, S.D. have accordingly acted favoring said petition, and have by proper action sufficiently assured Charles Mix County of their joint action in the matter and the equal assistance in the expenditures required in the obtaining and construction of said highway, together with their vacating and abandonment,

of the said former Section line. If the said conditions are not mutually performed by the 1st day of January 1928, then this is to be of no force or effect from and after said date.

Motion by Baxa and seconded by Riffle and all members present and voting aye, that said resolution be and the same is adopted.
