

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLES MIX COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, MET IN REGULAR SESSION--NEW CHAIRMAN ELECTED--NUMEROUS BILLS ALLOWED.

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, January 3, 1928.--The board of county commissioners met in regular session for the January meeting 1928. Meeting called to order by the Chairman, A.G. McBride. On roll call all members reported present, McBride, Baxa and Riffle.

A motion was made by Riffle and seconded by McBride that Jos. Baxa be made chairman of the board of county commissioners for the year 1928. On roll call all members voting "aye."

After the new chairman had taken his seat the minutes of the previous meeting were read and upon motion duly made and carried were approved.

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, January 7, 1928.--The board reconvened as per adjournment of January 6, at 9:00 a.m. All members present.

The board finished checking the County Auditor and then took up the following matters of importance:

The county auditor was instructed to advertise for sealed bids on (three) carloads of bridge plank 3x12x16 feet; Fir, standard sawn, bids to be opened on Tuesday, February 7, 1928 at 2:00 p.m. One car to be delivered at Flatte, S.D.; one car at Lake Andes, S.D.; one car at Wagner, S.D.; freight prepaid. A certified check must accompany all bids to the amount of 10 per cent of bid.

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The County auditor was instructed to advertise for sealed bids on (one) carload of cypress bridge piling of different lengths, bids to be opened on February 7, 1928 at 3:00 p.m., to be delivered at Lake Andes, S.D., freight prepaid. A certified check for 10 per cent of bid must accompany all bids.

The county auditor was instructed to advertise for sealed bids on repainting the interior walls of the court house in the City of Lake Andes. Bids to be opened on February 7, 1928 at 4:00 p.m.

Motion was made by Rifflev and seconded by McBride that Z. Zachariasen be paid \$100.00 on January 1, 1929 for hauling all freight, express and parcel post packages from the court house to the depot and postoffice and from the depot and postoffice for the year 1928 to the court house. Motion carried.

The application of F.B.Morgan, examiner in charge of the Wagner State Bank for a compromise on the delinquent taxes on Lot 3, Block 1, B.W.LaShiers First Addition to Wagner City for a number of years was rejected.

The bill of Henry Ashes for \$10.00 for burying dead horse near the Mission south of Ravinia was rejected for the reason that said bill should be paid by the township and not by Charles Mix County.

A petition from Rouse township signed by Frank Pesek, et al. asking for a snow fence between Sections 8 and 17-94-62 was presented to the board for consideration and same was tabled for the present time.

A bridge petition from Rees township signed by R.S.Steele, et al. asking for a bridge on Spring Creek at a point between Lot 629 and Lot 668 in township 93, range 63, Charles Mix county, S.D., was presented to the board for consideration. It was decided by the board to investigate the same before any further action was taken.

A resolution having been heretofore adopted by the Board of County Commissioners designating The Wagner Eagle, a newspaper printed and published at the City of Wagner, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, as one of the official newspapers for the said county for the year 1928; and it appearing that the said newspaper has been merged with the Wagner Post, a legal newspaper printed and published at the said City of Wagner, in said county, such newspapers hereafter to be published under the designation of The Wagner Post,

Be it therefore Resolved, That the resolution heretofore adopted by the Board designating the official newspapers for the year 1928, be, and the same is hereby amended by the substitution of the Wagner Post for The Wagner Eagle in such resolution, and that the said Wagner Post be, and the same is hereby, designated as one of the official newspapers for Charles Mix County for the year 1928.

Motion by McBride and seconded by Riffle that the above resolution be passed. Motion carried.

The application of the City of Lake Andes for a compromise of taxes on the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of block 28 of the City of Lake Andes was presented to the board for consideration, said taxes having not been paid since the year 1919, said city tendering the county \$200.00 in full payment of said taxes. The same was approved by the board.

In the matter of the applications of the State Bank Examiner, F.R. Smith, in charge of the Security State Bank of Dante, S.D. for refund of claimed excess taxes paid in past years, it was moved by McBride and seconded by Riffle that said applications be laid on the table for the time being. Motion carried.

W.H.Frei was granted a refund of \$7.72 for double payment of taxes on Lots 3 and 4, block 11 and Lots 9 and 10, block 9, LaShier's Addition to City of Wagner for the year 1926.

Atlee Schubert was granted a refund of \$7.08 on the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31-100-69 for the year 1926, on account of overpayment to the County Treasurer.

First State Bank of Wagner, S.D., was granted an abatement on the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 19-94-63 for the year 1926 on account of double assessment.

RESOLUTION.

Whereas, The State Highway Commission of the State of South Dakota, have prepared a map of a survey for a highway and are requiring the procuring or acquiring of a right of way for a Highway and the construction of same, between the city of Platte, S.D. and the Wheeler Bridge in Charles Mix County which is designated as Highway No. 47, and:

Whereas, it appears that it will be necessary to purchase and procure therefor about 48 acres of land by purchase or condemnation, and that the right of way for said Highway proposed to be purchased is more than one mile in length, to-wit; approximately six miles in length which will necessarily need to be purchased by negotiation or acquired by condemnation proceedings the cost and expense of which will amount to approximately \$6000.00 or \$7000.00; and,

Whereas, the acquiring and construction of said Highway, and the said expenditures which would be necessary therefor was not contemplated by the Board of County Commissioners of said Charles Mix County, S.D., heretofore nor at the time of making the levies for County expenditures nor at the time of preparing and adopting of the County Budget for the year 1928 of said County, and that therefore said County is financially unable to at this time proceed to acquire said right of way;

It is therefore, hereby Resolved, that the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County cannot at this time, for the reasons aforesaid procure the said right of way for said Highway, and therefore refuse to do so, and it is therefore further Resolved that the State Highway

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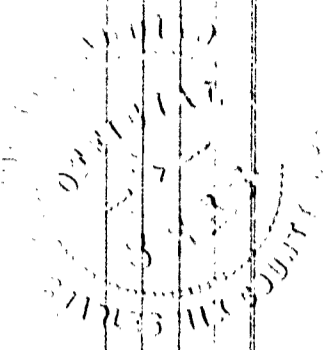
Commission of South Dakota be remitted to their rights and powers under Chapter 139 of the Session Laws of the state of South Dakota for the year 1927 and laws in such cases made and provided, and that the cost thereof be paid out of the allotment due the said County of Charles Mix and the same is hereby authorized, and that said Highway Commission take all necessary steps in the matter according to law to acquire the said Right of way.

Motion by McBride and seconded by Baxa, that the foregoing resolution be passed. Not all members being present and voting, McBride, Yes; Baxa, Yes; Riffle absent. Motion was declared carried.

There being no further business before the board at this time on motion duly made and carried the board adjourned to Tuesday, February 7, 1928 at 9:00 a.m.

The bond of Ray C. Gill for \$2000.00 as Highway Superintendent of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, was approved.

The following resolution was then passed by the board on the release of a part of the collateral held by the County of Charles Mix to secure the funds and which is owned by the Bank of Geddes:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Bank of Geddes, of Geddes, S.D., has heretofore, upon having heretofore been designated one of the County Depositories of Charles Mix County, S.D. deposited a certain security, to-wit; a real estate mortgage in the sum of \$4000.00 upon the North-east quarter of Section Four in Township Ninety-seven, North, Range Sixty-seven West of the 5th P.M. in Charles Mix County, S.D., which mortgage is subject to a prior mortgage in the sum of \$8000.00, as one of the pledges to support the guaranty of the repayment of county funds deposited in said bank, and,

WHEREAS, said Bank has since closed it's doors and the said prior mortgage is about to be foreclosed for default in interest and taxes on said prior mortgage in the sum of about \$13000.00, and

WHEREAS, it is desired by the said Bank of Geddes under the management of the Sup't of Banks, and this Board that a substitution be made in place of said above described security and that said above described security be released upon said substitution, or that a cash payment be made as an absolute payment to apply upon the account of the county with said bank; and

WHEREAS, upon a full consideration of said matter, and it appearing that said security is now in a condition which is of small value and requiring that further sums of money be advanced to protect said security, and that a cash payment being tendered in the sum of \$350.00 as an absolute payment to apply on the account of the county against said bank, and that said county shall have all the rights under the law to collect the balance of said account left unpaid, as may now be or have been heretofore available, and that said security above mentioned be released; it is therefore hereby,

RESOLVED, That it is by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, deemed to be to the best interests of the county to receive the said sum of \$350.00 cash payment to apply to that extent upon the account which the county has against said Bank of Geddes, and that said above described security be and the same is hereby released upon receipt of said \$350.00, and the County Auditor is hereby authorized to release and deliver back to said bank the said above described security, and that said county shall have and reserves its full rights as before to proceed to collect the account due the county from said bank as was heretofore due the county less said \$350.00; and that all other security be and is retained by said county.

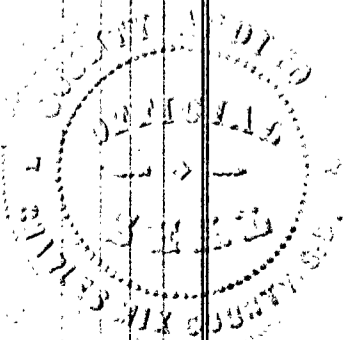

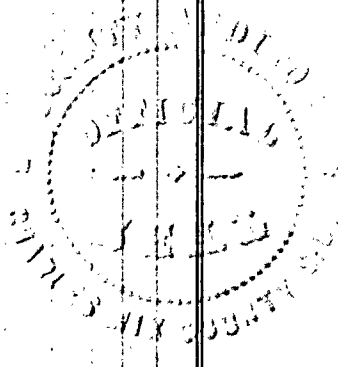

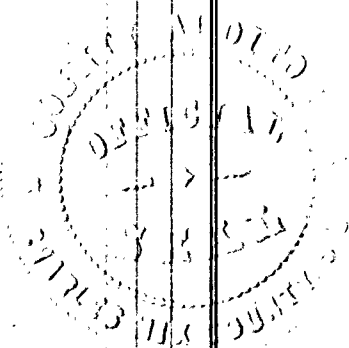

The application of Mary Hawkeagle for an abatement of tax on the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 28-94-64 for the years 1925-1926-1927 was rejected for the reason that said application was insufficient in explanation of the matter asked for.

The application of John Hubbling for an abatement of road poll and school poll in the city of Platte for the year 1927 for the reason that he had been assessed in both City of Platte and Forbes township was rejected and should be first submitted to the governing body of the City of Platte, and then filed with the board of county commissioners for action.

The application of Frank Masden for a refund of \$2.76 on the W $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 13-93-63 for the year 1927 was rejected for the reason that the application is insufficient and it does not appear what error if any exists and does not comply with Sec. 6813 of the Revised Code of 1919.

The application of Herman Gruenig for an abatement for the year 1927 tax was rejected for the reason that the application was insufficient and should conform to Sec. 6814 of the Revised Code of South Dakota for the year 1919.

A compromise was granted by the board for the taxes on the N $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 17-96-64 for the year 1914 for the sum of \$10.00 and said check was turned over to the County Treasurer by the County Auditor.

An abatement was granted on the personal property tax of W.V. Alton in the City of Wagner for the year 1925 amounting to \$17.84 and interest.

W.C. Knorr was granted a refund of \$3.78 for road and school poll in Jackson township for the year 1925 for the reason the same was paid to the county treasurer twice.

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

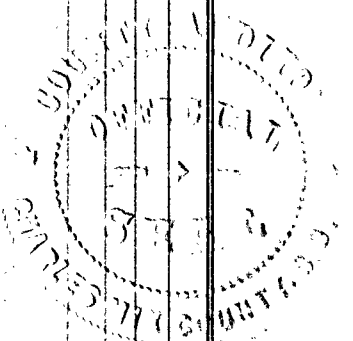

Commencing at the North-east corner of Section 26 and the North-west corner of Section 25 on the graveled Highway, and extending South two miles to the South Boundary line of Lake George Township, being the Highway lying between Sections 26 and 35 on the West of said Highway and Sections 25 and 36 on the East of said Highway, in Township 100 North, Range 69 West of the 5th P.M., in Charles Mix County, South Dakota.

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Our experience as members of the County Board of Equalization has demonstrated the impossibility of bringing about equality in assessments either within the taxing unit or between the different taxing units within the county and state under our present assessment system, and,

WHEREAS, We realize that without a correct initial assessment where under all property is listed and the same ratio of value applied in every instance equality in taxation cannot be obtained, and,

WHEREAS, No improvement can be expected under the present plan of assessments, and,

WHEREAS, We believe the defects in the present system may be largely overcome by a change to the COUNTY UNIT PLAN OF ASSESSMENT.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That we favor a change from the present system of assessment to the COUNTY UNIT PLAN to the end that greater equality in the plan of the cost of government may prevail.

A petition was presented to the board signed by T.F. Biggind, et al., for to open up a highway beginning at the northeast corner of the southeast quarter of section 1-96-68 in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, thence running east for about one-quarter of a mile to connect up with the road running from the City of Elatte to the Rosebud bridge, which highway is numbered #47. B.P. Vandall appeared before the board in the interests of the Yankton Sioux Indian Tribe asking for a little aid toward hurrying the payment of the Pipestone judgment along. The board agreed to give what aid they could concerning the matter and a record is on file in the office of the County Auditor showing the steps taken by the board.

Application of Frank Bursek, administrator, for the cancellation of 1921 tax sale certificate held by the county against Lot 11, block 18, Lake Andes, covering special sewer assessment, was considered and on motion duly made and carried was granted, for the reason that such assessment was fully paid July 13, 1928.

On motion duly made and carried the board adjourned to meet on January 2, 1929 at 9:00 a.m.
