LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, January 7, 1929.--The board of county commissioners met in regular session for the January meeting 1929. Meeting called to order by the Chairman, Jos. Baxa. On roll call all members reported present, McBride, Riffle and Baxa.

The bond of A.G. McBride who was elected commissioner from the 2nd district was approved.

Motion made by McBride and seconded by Baxa, that L.W. Riffle be chairman of the board for the year 1929. On roll call, Baxa, McBride voting "aye." Riffle not voting. Riffle takes the chair as Chairman of the board for 1929.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and on motion duly made

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were approved.

The official county papers for the year 1929 were then appointed. On motion by McBride and second by Baxa, The Wagner Post, Lake Andes Wave and Platte Tribune were designated as the official papers. On roll call all members voting "aye."

The following locations were designated as the place for holding chattel mortgage sales in Charles Mix County, South Dakota for the year 1929:

- Academy, South Dakota, in front of Morgan & Pasek's Garage.
- Platte, South Dakota, in front of Blue Front Livery Barn
- Bovee, South Dakota, in front of Economy Grocery Store.
- Geddes, South Dakota, in front of Depot Livery Barn,
- Lake Andes, South Dakota, in front of Keegan Livery Barn
- Ravinia, South Dakota, in front of Highway Garage.
- Wagner, South Dakota, in front of Sadler Veterinary Barn.
- Dante, South Dakota, in front of Kloucek's Barn.

On motion duly made and carried, Ray C. Gill, was appointed County Highway Superintendent of Charles Mix County, S.D., for the years 1929-1930 and the County Auditor was instructed to notify the State Highway Commission of such appointment.

On motion duly made and carried G.M.Shuck of Geddes, was appointed county justice of the peace to fill vacancy for a term of two years. His bond was presented to the board and approved.

Bids were then opened for the draying for the court house for the year 1929. Z.Zacharsen was awarded the draying from the depot to court house for the year 1929 at \$50.00. M.E.Cooper was awarded the draying of parcel post from the postoffice to court house and court house to postoffice at \$75.00 for the year 1929.

The Charles Mix County Fair Association made its annual report to the County Board and on motion duly made and carried annual appropriation for 1929 of \$500.00 was allowed. Warrant for same to be issued by the County Auditor to the secretary of the fair when the proper claim was presented.

The following bonds were then approved by the board: Laura A. Frickett, Register of Deeds, \$3000.00; George Padrnos, State's Attorney, \$1000.00; Ben C. Nash, Clerk of Courts, \$1000.00; H.T.Fuller, Deputy Sheriff, \$1000.00; R.J.Taylor, justice of the peace, \$500.00; J.F.Nichols, justice of the peace, \$500.00; L.H.Skillings, county constable, \$500.00.

The County Treasurer's Tax Sale Return was presented to the board and after examination was approved.

On motion duly made and carried the County Auditor was instructed to advertise for sealed bids on one carload of re-inforcing steel bars amounting to about 36,000 pounds; 40% one-half ~~inch~~ inch, round; 35% five-eighths inch, round; 25% three-quarter inch, round. BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEET FOR REGULAR APRIL SESSION --- NUMEROUS BILLS ALLOWED AND OTHER BUSINESS OF IMPORTANCE TRANSACTED.

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, April 2, 1929.--- The Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota met in regular session for the April meeting. The meeting was called to order by the chairman, L.W. Riffle, and upon roll call, all members reported present, McBride, Baxa and Riffle.

This being the day set for the opening of sealed bids for three carloads of Culverts, at 2:00 P.M. the Auditor was instructed to open the bids filed. It was found that the following named firms had entered bids: South Dakota Concrete Products Co., Watertown, S.D.; Wheeling Corrugating Co., Minneapolis, Minn.; Canton Block and Tile Co., Canton, S.D.; Berger Manufacturing Co., Minneapolis, Minn.; Sioux Falls Metal Culvert Co., Sioux Falls, S.D. and The St. Paul Corrugating Co., St. Paul, Minn. After sufficient deliberation, a motion was made by McBride and seconded by Baxa that Charles Mix County accept the bid of the Wheeling Corrugating Co. of Minneapolis Minn. for three carloads of class "B2" metal culverts with the provision that these culverts be furnished in eight and sixteen foot lengths, respectively, with union bands furnished free of charge. This motion was carried unanimously, all members voting "Aye". The contract, having been examined by the States Attorney was accepted and signed.

A number of residents and freeholders of Charles Mix County petitioned the County Commissioners to improve the road beginning at the U.S. highway No. 18 at corners common to sections 7, 18, 19, 30 and 31 in Plain Center Township and extending south five miles, on the township line between aforesaid sections and sections 12, 13, 24, 25 and 36 in White Swan Township. This petition was held for further investigation.

WHEREAS, It is necessary for Charles Mix County, South Dakota, to acquire the following described lands owned by one Victor Pravecek, of Tyndall, South Dakota, for public highway purposes, to-wit: A tract of land four rods wide lying in section 25 T.95 R., 62 Charles Mix County, the center line of which is described as follows: Beginning at a point on the 1/4 line where the East 1/4 line intersects the North 1/4 line thence in a northerly direction to the point of intersection of the East 1/4 and the north section line at the East 1/4 corner of Sections 25 and 24 in Township 95N. R.62, containing approximately two acres, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the said lands be and the same are hereby condemned for a right of way for a public highway and highway purposes as provided in Chapter 139 of the 1927 Session Laws of South Dakota.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, It is apparent that certain portions of the County Highway System of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, should be relocated.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that subject to the State Highway Commission of the State of South Dakota, the following described portions of the County Highway system of said county are hereby removed from said county highway system, to-wit:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of Section 8, Township 95 Range 64 in Highland Township and extending west two miles, thence south one mile, thence west one mile to the Northwest corner of Section 13 Township 95 Range 65, or the county road in White Swan Township all in Charles Mix County. That such mileage of County Highway system be relocated as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of Section 5, Township 95 Range 64 in Highland, extending westward two miles to connect with the county road at the Northwest corner of Section 6, Township 95 Range 64 in Highland Township. 

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLES MIX COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, MEET FOR
REGULAR JULY MEETING--- ALSO MEET AS COUNTY BOARD
OF EQUALIZATION.

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, July 2, 1929.--- The Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, met in regular session as a County Board of Equalization. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. by L.W. Riffle, the chairman, and upon roll call all members reported present, - A.G. McBride, Joseph Baxa, L.W. Riffle and Joseph R. Anderson, county auditor and clerk of Board.

Complaints, by Fred Noll of Geddes and by Gullick Aarhus of White Swan Township, respectively, because their property was valued too highly, were heard and were discussed by the Board. Because complete information could not be obtained at this time, these two men were asked to appear before the Board again on Monday July 8, 1929, at which time their complaints would be reconsidered.

The Board of Equalization adjourned to meet again at 9:00 A.M. July 8th, and reconvened to meet as a Board of County Commissioners.

By motion duly made and carried the minutes of the previous meeting were read and were approved as read.

A Committee of three citizens of Wagner, S.D., appeared before the Board and asked that Charles Mix County give assistance in the construction of a road running north and east of Wagner, S.D. toward Scotland, S.D. Having thoroughly considered the matter, the Board of County Commissioners passed the following:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it appears that it is necessary that the following described part of the County Highway system of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, to-wit: Beginning at a point where Federal Highway number eighteen (18) turns north at the southwest corner of Section six (6), Township 96, Range 63, running thence due east to the eastern boundary of said Charles Mix County, with a connection running due south from such Highway into the City of Wagner, in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, a total of approximately eighteen (18) miles in all, be graded and gravelled under the laws providing for State aid on County Highways, at the earliest practicable time,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the said above described Highway, be and the same is hereby designated as the first part of the County Highway system to receive State Aid in the Construction thereof, and application is hereby made to the State Highway Commission for the designation of such Highway to receive such State aid as soon as funds may be available for distribution to said Charles Mix County for such purposes.

The above resolution was introduced by McBride, who moved its passage and approval, and was seconded by Baxa. On roll call, all members voting "Aye", the above resolution was approved and adopted.

A motion by McBride to purchase from the Evers Motor Company of Wagner, S.D., a new Light Service Ford Truck, for the use of the Highway Superintendent, trading in the old Truck at a value of \$ 103.00, and thereby reducing the purchase price from \$585.00 to \$483.00, was seconded by Baxa. By a vote of the Board, the Motion carried unanimously.

A motion by Baxa, that Charles Mix County enter into a contract with Harry Nelson of Platte, S.D., to furnish a portion of the gravel, at the rate of 6 cents per yard, to be used in the construction of Highway 45, extending south from Platte S.D., and further to pay Harry Nelson \$50.00 for the maintenance of the pit and for the right of way from the pit to the Highway, was seconded by McBride. On roll call, all members voted "Aye". Thereupon a contract was drawn up, embodying the above provisions, and a copy was filed in the office of the County Auditor.

At 11:00 A.M., the Executive Board of the Agricultural Extension Club of Charles Mix County, appeared before the Commissioners and asked that their usual appropriation of \$ 300.00 per year be raised to \$350.00 for the year 1930. By motion duly made and carried, the appropriation of an additional \$50.00 was granted and by the same motion the Auditor was instructed to draw a warrant in favor of this Club for the \$300.00 due it according to the 1929 County Budget.

An application, made by Carl Dagher of Goose Lake Township for an abatement of \$ 3.78 on his 1928 taxes was held for investigation.

An application, signed by Henry Campbell of Avon, S.D., for an abatement on the 1913 and 1914 taxes on the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11-94-62 was granted because during these years this land was not in his possession.

An application for a refund of taxes paid on Lot 1 of Section 3-94-62, was granted to Henry Campbell of Avon, S.D. for the years of 1922 to 1928 inclusive, because this forty acres had been described twice on the tax lists, - once by description and again by Lot number.

A refund of \$10.00 was granted to E.H. Black of Jackson Township because he had been paying taxes, for a period of years, on one acre of land which had been deeded over for school purposes.

An application, previously considered and tabled, was reconsidered, made out by Gullick Aarhus of White Swan Township for an abatement on real and personal property for the year of 1928. This application was granted because, by a clerical error on the part of the assessor, the valuation was excessive.

A petition, properly signed, and filed in the office of the County Auditor, by a number of residents of White Swan Township, for the construction of a concrete bridge across the creek on Lot 9 of Section 32 in Township 96 N.R. 66, W. 5th P.M. in White Swan Township of Charles Mix County, was tabled for further investigation.

The report of the Executive Accountant, Mr. J.M. Johnson, which included his report on the examination of the records of the several officials of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and which was dated May, 18, 1929 was submitted to the Board of County Commissioners, by the Auditor, for their inspection and consideration.

An application by the Holy Name Society of Geddes for a Dance Hall license, accompanied by the necessary fee, was accepted, and a license was issued for the same.

Upon motion duly made and carried, applications made by Thomas Moran, Frank M. Havens, Andrew J. Jackson, and W.W. Parker, respectively, for renewal of Permanent School Fund Loans, were approved and, by the same motion, an application for a new Loan, made by Thomas J. Biggins was approved.

A motion was duly made and carried that Charles Mix County contract for the following insurance:

Fire and Windstorm Insurance on the County Machine Shed, Ware House and Oil House, located at Lake Andes, written by V.J. Pesicka for the Queen Insurance Company of America.

Workmens Compensation Insurance on all County Employees, written by Scott Banbury for the Western Surety Company.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the following clerks and treasurers Bonds were approved:

Vert Buurma, Treasurer of Lone Tree Township No. 4; Joe H. Pranger, Treasurer of Darlington No. 3; F.G. Herdman, Clerk of Highland No. 2; W.F. Wiechmann, School Clerk of Kennedy Township.





A petition signed by a number of duly qualified electors of Charles Mix County, for the construction of a concrete bridge across the creek crossing the public highway on Lot 9 of Section 32 in Township 96 N.R. 66 W. 5th P.M., in White Swan Township, was held for investigation.

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, July 8, 1929.-- According to the adjournment made on July 2, 1929, the Board of Equalization of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, reconvened at 9:00A.M., for its regular duties of the year.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, and upon roll call, all members reported present,- A.G. McBride, Joseph Baxa, L.W. Riffle, chairman, and Joseph R.Anderson, county auditor and clerk.

Frank Delire of Platte, S.D. asked that the valuation,as set by the Review Board on his dwelling house,be lowered from \$3500 to \$3200. The Board of Equalization left this valuation at the higher figure.

Fred Noll of Geddes, S.D. appeared before the Board and petitioned that the valuation of goods in his furniture store be lowered. Having compared the valuation of his furniture on hand with that of other furniture stores in the County,the Board reduced Mr. Noll's valuation from \$6000.00 to \$4000.00.

In response to a complaint by Gullisk Aarhus, the Board of Equalization, in conference with the Township Board of Review of White Swan Township, decided that Gullisk Aarhus's property, both real and personal, should remain at the figures agreed upon by the Township Board at their June meeting.

Mr. J.W. Doty and Mr. O.D. Fees of Wagner,S.D., representing the Ku Klux Klan of that vicinity, appeared before the Board of Equalization and asked that a structure in which that organization holds its meetings,be exempt from taxation. Following the advise of the Attorney General of South Dakota,the Board of Equalization decided that the exemption asked for should be granted provided that this orginazation furnish constructive proof that their benevolenceextended beyond members of their organization. In the event this condition could not be satisfied, no exemption would be granted.

Equalization of all City and Town property, as well as all rural property under the sub-heads of realstate and personal, was then considered. The Board of Equalization, endeavoring to bring all classes of property to a certain standard figure, agreed upon a general average of all respective classes and made the following figures and alterations to conform to it:



WHEREAS, no fund has been appropriated, in the Provisional Budget for the Fiscal Year of 1930, to defray the expenses of the Executive Accountant,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, now in session, that the following additional appropriations be approved and made to the Provisional Budget for the Fiscal Year of 1930, as per Section 8 of Chapter 79 of the 1927 Session Laws:



LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, December 4, 1929.--The Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County Reconvened to resume the regular business of the month, all members reporting present---Riffle, McBride, and Baxa.

A number of citizens living in Choteau Creek township called upon the Board and asked for assistance in securing state aid for a certain road running north and south through the north part of the township. The County Commissioners thereupon passed the following resolution:

RESOLUTION FOR STATE AID ON COUNTY HIGHWAY SYSTEM.

WHEREAS it is apparent that a portion of the county highway system running north through the north central portion of Choteau Creek Township, should be graded and gravelled under the laws providing for State aid, as soon as convenient, to connect with a graded County road running southward from Delmont, S. D., four and one-half miles of which are gravelled, in conjunction with a resolution for State aid heretofore approved by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, and hereinafter described in this resolution:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that approximately four and one-fourth miles of road, beginning at the S.W. corner of Section 3 - Township 96, Range 62, thence running due north between sections 3 and 4 in Township 96 - Range 62 and between sections 33 and 34, 27 and 28, 21 and 22, and 15 and 16 in Township 97, Range 62 until said road intersects the county line between Charles Mix and Douglas Counties., shall be included as a part of the following resolution to wit:--

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS it appears that it is necessary that the following described part of the County Highway System of Charles Mix County, State of South Dakota, to-wit: beginning at a point where Federal Highway number eighteen (18) turns north at the Southwest corner of section six (6), Township Ninety-six (96) Range Sixty-three (63), running thence due east to the eastern boundary of said Charles Mix County S. D., with a connection running due south from such highway into the City of Wagner, in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, a total of approximately eighteen (18) miles in all, be graded and gravelled under the laws providing for state aid on county highways at the earliest practicable time, be it therefore

RESOLVED that the said above described highway be and the same is hereby designated as the first part of the county highway system to receive state aid in the construction thereof, and application is hereby made to the State Highway Commission for the designation of such highway to receive such state aid as soon as funds may be available for distribution to said Charles Mix County for such purposes.

The above resolution was introduced by commissioner McBride, who moved its passage and approval, and was seconded by Commissioner Baxa. On roll call, all members voting aye, the above resolution was approved and adopted.

During the November session a hearing was held regarding the abandonment of four miles of county highway in Goose Lake Township and for its relocation at places along a line running due north from the Southeast corner of Section 4, Township 96, Range 65, west of the 5th P. M., in Charles Mix County, South Dakota.

By a motion duly made and unanimously carried, the resolution heretofore published pertaining to this change was rejected.

An application for an abatement of taxes, made some months ago by the Floete Lumber Company, on property in Charles Mix County, having been held for investigation, was rejected by a proper motion of the Board,

Applications on file in the office of the County Auditor for tax adjustments were approved as follows, by a motion made by McBride, seconded by Baxa and carried, upon vote:

A refund to G. M. Caster of \$32.05 for taxes on the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 30-95-64, for the year of 1928 because of a double assessment.

A refund to Alberta Wolff of Platte, S. D., for the years of 1925 and 1926, of \$2.00 school poll because she was not of age at the time of assessment for those years.

A tax compromise of \$59.97 to the K. and K. Co., of Geddes, S. Dak. for the last half of the taxes for the year of 1926 and 1927. A check accompanying this application for \$551.69 was accepted in payment.

A tax compromise to Mrs. C. Kyte of penalty and accrued interest on lots 5 and 6 in Blk. 44 in Lake Andes for the years of 1926, 1927 and 1928, original tax in the amount of \$396.84 being paid in full.

A refund to Emil Wolff and to Edward Wolff of Platte, S. D., amounting to \$1.40 each, for school poll with penalty and interest thereon for the year of 1923 because proof was shown that same had been paid in Jones County.

A refund to Harry Shunneman of Platte, S. D., of \$3.47 because he paid taxes for the year of 1928 on an erroneous description.

A refund to B. A. Parks of Platte, S. D., in the amount of \$14.56 for the year of 1928 because six lots not in his possession were included as part of his taxable property.

A refund to J. W. Eggers of Wagner, S. D., amounting to \$4.75 for the year of 1928 because he paid taxes on lot 932 in Section 20-94-64 as well as on the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$, making a double assessment.

A refund of \$3.78 to Carl Dagher on his property described as NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22-97-65 for 1928 because it was apparent to the Board that the valuation on this property was excessive by error.

An application for a Permanent School Loan of \$500.00, made by Alice Jordon on the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 12-94-65 was approved by motion of the Board.

The business of the month, having been completed, a motion to adjourn until the regular meeting of January 7th, 1930, was made by McBride seconded by Baxa and carried, upon vote. Meeting adjourned.
