LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, January 9, 1930.-- As agreed by adjournment of the previous day, the Board of County Commissioners met, with all members present.

 Upon motion by Riffle and seconded by Baxa, the following applications for renewals and for new Permanent School loans, respectively, were approved:
 William Briscoe, \$2500; Machall Cover, \$2500; Louis Hruska, \$5000; J.W. Hruska, \$5000; and Charles Gibson, \$5000.

 At this time a contract was drawn up with the White Eagle Oil Co., in order that the County may receive a quantity discount upon products furnished by this Company for the year of 1930.

 Upon motion by Baxa, seconded by Riffle, and carried, the following applications for tax adjustments were approved and allowed:

A Compromise of penalty and interest on Lot 2 in Block 11, in the City of Wagner for the years from 1924 to 1928 inclusive, upon receipt of payment of regular taxes in full.

An abatement of \$170.86 taxes on the stock of farm implements, owned by George Chamberlain of Platte, S.D. for the year of 1929, because said stock was apparently over-valued as assessed.

An abatement of \$37.03 to J.H. Crisman, for the year of 1929, on cattle in Wahehe township, because the said cattle were assessed in Kennedy Township and the valuation and tax were extended on same.

An abatement to James Haney of Geddes, S.D., of \$127 for the year of 1929, because 40 acres of land belonging to him, and which had been previously excluded from the City limits, was listed both in Geddes Agricultural and in Jackson Twonship.

A refund to W.W. Miller of Geddes, S.D. of \$54.33 on the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31-98-66, for the year of 1928 because an excess valuation was unintentionally placed upon this property by the assessor for that year.

A refund to the Northwestern Public Service Co. for the year of 1928 on the middle 50 feet of Lot 12 in Block 7 in the City of Wagner, amounting to \$50.55, because this property was assessed doubly, once by the State and once locally, and taxes were paid in both instances.

A refund to Mark E. Schobell of Wagner, S.D. of \$5.88 for personal taxes charged against him for the years of 1924 and 1925, because it was shown that during these years the affiant lived and paid taxes elsewhere.

A refund to Frank J. Wade, owner of lots 1084, 1085 and 1086 in Rouse Township, of \$130, because it was discovered that in paying the accrued interest and penalty on taxes on this property for the years of 1917, 1918 and 1919, an excess error, in the above amount, had been made.

A refund to Wm. Batstone of \$10.76 on taxes paid for the year of 1928 on the property described as 4 acres in the NE 1/4 of NE 1/4 of Sect. 1-97-67, because these taxes were paid twice, as shown by receipts 5763 and 8637.

A refund of \$187.33 to George Chamberlain, on stock of farm implements in the City of Platte, S.D., upon presentation of proof that for the year of 1928, said stock had been assessed at an exorbitant figure.

A petition was presented to the Board, asking that the County establish and repair, by grading, the highway running east and west for a distance of one mile between Sections 18 and 19 in Township 97, North Range 64, in Charles Mix County. The Petition was tabled for consideration.

A petition on file with the County Auditor, bearing the signatures of 53 signers living in Platte and Castalia townships respectively, was presented to the Board. This petition called for a graded County Highway, beginning one mile south of the City of Platte at the Southeast corner of Section 23-99-68 and running due west, for the most part, a distance of approximately ten and one-half miles to the South-west corner of Section 20 in Castalia Township. COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS FOR JULY OF 1930 --- Charles Mix County
SOUTH DAKOTA

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, July 1, 1930. -- The County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota met in regular session with all members present, - Riffle, Baxa and McBride.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and were approved as read.

The Board of County Commissioners and the County Auditor convened as a County Board of Equalization. Since no one appeared for a hearing on matters pertaining to equalization of assessment, the Board of Equalization adjourned to meet again on July 14th, 1930. The Commissioners remained seated as a Board of County Commissioners.

Pursuant to an advertizment in the official news papers of the County, the sealed bids on file in the Auditor's office for reinforcing steel were opened, at 10:00 A.M. Two companies had presented bids, namely the Dennis Equipment Co., of Sioux Falls and the E.S. Gaynor Lumber Co., of Sioux City.

Baxa moved that the bid of the E.S. Gaynor Lumber Company be accepted, with the provision that all material be shipped prepaid. The motion was seconded by Riffle and was carried, upon vote.

A Committee, representing the Home Extention Club of Charles Mix County, asked that the County donate \$300.00 for the year of 1931 for the maintenance of such Club work. By due and proper motion the Board agreed to include an appropriation of \$300.00 for Home Extention Work, in the Provisional Budget of Charles Mix County, for the year of 1931.

A petition on file with the County Auditor, bearing 42 signatures of residents of White Swan and Wahehe townships, was considered by the Board. This petition calls for the detachment of Sections 1, 2 and 12 in Township 94, Range 65, and any fractional divisions of land south of same extending to the Missouri river, from White Swan School District number 9 and for the annexation of the same to Wahehe School District number 3.

By due and proper motion of the Board, the County Superintendent of Schools and the County Commissioners of Charles Mix County will hold a hearing at the Court House in the City of Lake Andes at 1:00 P.M., of August 5, 1930, regarding the change of boundaries of the aforementioned School districts. Any person interested may appear at this time and place to express his consent or disapproval.

Upon motion by Riffle, seconded by Baxa, and carried the following applications for Permanent School loans and for renewals were approved:

Upon due and proper motion an application was granted to the Holy Name Society of Geddes, S.D. to conduct a dance Hall on certain premises located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 35, in Township 98, Range 67. The licence was issued upon receipt of the specified fee.

Upon motion by Baxa, seconded by Riffle and carried, by vote, the following applications for tax adjustments were approved :
A refund to Clem Cooley of Hamilton township, amounting to \$49.30 , on an excess valuation, by error, on horses for the year of 1930.
A refund to the Rural Credit Board of South Dakota of \$124.59 for the year of 1929 because this Board paid taxes by error on land not in its possession.
A refund to the Fullerton Lumber Company of Armour, S.D. of \$47.55 for the year of 1928 because the taxes were not paid on the proper one of several out lots having identical descriptions in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 17, Township 96, Range 64.
A refund to the Smith Estate Elevator located in Platte, S.D., of \$61.60 on the grain tax for the year of 1929, because of an excess error in listing the total number of bushells handled.

WHEREAS, Charles W. WHEREAS, said matter coming on for hearing, and no objections having been made to said petition, and it being the judgement of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Superintendent of Schools that the proposed change is for the best interests of the patrons of said school districts, and which said change does not operate to increase the number of districts, therefore

 An application for a tax adjustment, made out by H.W. Strayer, on the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31 in Township 96, Range 63, was approved, granting relief on an apparently double assessment for the years of 1928 and 1929.

The Auditor was advised to advertize for sealed bids on three car loads of coal for use in the Court House during the coming winter. Said bids will be opened at 1:00 P.M. of September 2, 1930, in the Commissioners room, on any one or all of the following varieties,- Cavalier egg-size, Blue Bell egg-size, Commander egg size or Bernice Anthracite egg-size.

Lake Andes, South Dakota, August 12, 1930.----- The County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota met in adjourned session, pursuant to adjournment of August 5th, 1930, for the final consideration of the 1931 County Budget.

All members reported present at roll call, and by motion, the minutes of the previous meeting were read and were approved as read.

The various items of the Provisional Budget, previously published in the official papers, were carefully read and checked over, and by due and proper motion of the Board, the following amendments were made :

An addition of \$5000 to the fund for care of poor.
An addition of \$700 to the Bounties fund.
A fund of \$200 was budgeted for Coroner's expense.

Upon motion by Baxa, seconded by Riffle, and carried, the following applications for tax adjustments were granted:

An abatement to Charles and Lewis Pavlis, for the years of 1927 and 1928 on the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ and Lots 6 and 7 of Section 32, Twp.96, Range 66, because the patent to this land had not been issued prior to the dates of assessment for the above mentioned years.

A compromise settlement, for the sum of \$300, of taxes on the James Tunkamani land described as the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ in Section 36-96-66 and the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1-95-66, for the years of 1915 to 1929, inclusive, because, for these years, the legality of assessment was undetermined and the land had not been listed regularly on the tax lists.

Due consideration having been given to the Budget, and no protests or further suggestions having been made to the Board, the following resolution was passed:

WHEREAS, the Board now in session on this 12th day of August, 1930, and further considering said Budget and no objections being made, and the Board being satisfied that same should be adopted as originally filed and prepared, save and except for three additional items as heretofore added by motion of the Board and incorporated in the Commissioners proceedings this 12th day of August,

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY RESOLVED, that the said Budget as heretofore filed, published and amended, and as published immediately following this resolution, with each and all of the purposes, objects, items, schedules, appropriations, amounts, estimates and matters contained therein, be and the same is hereby adopted and approved as the annual Budget of appropriations and expenditures, for the County of Charles Mix and all of its agencies and institutions for and during the following fiscal year of 1931.

This being the date set for the opening of sealed bids for coal for use in the Court House, said bids were opened at the designated hour. Upon due and proper motion, the contract for three carloads of coal of the Commander variety, and at the rate of \$11.25 per ton, was awarded to the Farmers Co-operative Elevator of Lake Andes, S.D.

Following the purchase of coal, bids were accepted for the drayage of coal for the Court House during the season of 1930-31. By motion of the Board, the contract was let to Zach Zachariarson to haul such coal, at the rate of sixty cents per ton.

From the 1930 Jury lists, returned by the assessors of the county, the names of thirty six persons were drawn by the County Commissioners to replace the names of those who served during the last term of Court.

- A refund to Fred W. Snoozy of \$4.56 on personal tax in Ree Township for the year of 1929 because said tax had been paid in full by a previous receipt.
- An abatement of \$109.93, on personal tax of the Bureau of Catholic Missions, Marty, S.D., for the year of 1929. This item was omitted from a prior application for abatement, dated June 4, 1930, and is now attached as a part thereof.

An application on file with the County Auditor, signed by twenty seven persons, and asking that a road be opened and established approximately as follows, was presented to the Board: "Beginnign at a point at the Northwest corner of Lot 3 of Section 7, in Township 94, Range 65 and running in a Northeasterly direction, for the most part, to the Northeast corner of Section 7, Township 94, Range 65." This petition was tabled for the reason that the description therein apparently is erroneous, in as much as Range 65 was designated rather than Range 64.

All applications for State Coyote Bounty were approved and the Auditor forwarded said claims to the State Department for disposition. These applications were filed in the Auditors office on Coyotes killed during the months of May, June, July and August of 1930.

Upon motion, the Board adjourned to meet the following day, September 3, 1930, for the approval of claims.

Miller of interest and penalty, by payment of principal taxes in full, amounting to \$741.38, for the years of 1922 to 1929 inclusive on Lots 2 and 3, Block 13, Milwaukee Land Company's Second Addition, Wagner, S.D. Said Compromise was made pursuant to approval and advise of the City Council of the City of Wagner, S.D.

An Abatement to Morrow and Kirkpatrick of the 1929 and 1930 tax on a Brick store building and the land upon which the same is located on the Government property in Greenwood, Wahehe Township. This abatement was made under authority of Section 6813 of the 1919 Revised Code and upon consideration of a letter from the United States Indian Field Service.

A refund to Fred J. Johnson and Ethel Johnson of road and of School poll, paid in Plain Center Township for the year of 1929, because said taxes were paid in Platte Township by receipt 5715.

A refund to Helene Johanneson of Goose Lake Township in the amount of \$18.75, covering erroneous taxes collected over a period of years from 1907 to 1928. Said taxes included an assessment of 2.08 acres of railroad property not taxable to the affiant.

A refund to David Ree of \$94.15 for the years of 1928 and 1929 on the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4-93-63, because said property during these years was held in trust by the United States Government.

RESOLUTION GRANTING FRANCHISE TO POWER COMPANY

WHEREAS, the Northwestern Public Service Company, a corporation, engaged in the manufacture and sale of electric current for light heat and power, with its main business office at Huron, Beadle County, South Dakota, did on the 25th day of September 1930 duly file in the office of the County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, its certain petition and application praying leave to construct a transmission line for conducting electric energy for light heat and power purposes in, upon and along certain highways in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, in said petition hereafter more particularly described, and,

WHEREAS, all persons, firms and corporations owning or operating transmission, telephone or telegraph lines on any part of the highways to be occupied by said proposed transmission line have given waiver or notice of hearing of said Application and petition, which Waivers of Notice of Hearing have been duly filed with the County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and,

WHEREAS, there is no opposition in appearance before this Board to the granting of said application, and this being the time and place fixed for the hearing upon said application,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, that said application be, and the same is hereby granted that the right, subject to all reasonable rules and regulations as now exist or may hereafter be prescribed by the Legislature to erect, construct and maintain a transmission line, consisting of poles and wires, for the purposes in, upon and along the public highways in Charles Mix County, is given to the Northwestern Public Service Company, for a period of twenty (20) years over the route hereinafter described as follows:

" Starting at a point in the Northwest corner of Section 1, Township 97, North, Range 64 West of the 5th P.M., and extending North to the Northwest corner of Section 25, Township 98, Range 64 West of the 5th P.M., or to the North side of the County line in Section 25; thence North into Douglas County.

The foregoing resolution was introduced by Riffle, who moved its adoption, and was seconded by Baxa. On roll call the motion carried unanimously and the Chairman declared the resolution adopted.

Upon motion by Baxa, seconded by Riffle, and carried upon vote, an application presented by the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Lake Andes, South Dakota, for the privilege of becoming a county depository for Charles Mix County funds was approved. This bank, therefore, is designated as one of the regular County Depositories for the intervening period to April 1st, 1931.

RESOLUTION PURPORTING TO GRAVELLING OF COUNTY HIGHWAY

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the State Highway Commission at Pierre, South Dakota, designate the following described highway, as "Project Number three " for graveling and that the same be gravelled as soon as funds are available for such purposes : " A Highway beginning at the Northwest corner of Section 12, Township 98, North, Range 68, West of the 5th P.M. in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, thence due east between Sections 1 and 12, in Township 98, North, Range 68, West of the 5th P.M., Sections 6 and 7, 5 and 8, 4 and 9, 3 and 10, 2 and 11, 1a and 12, in Township 98, North, Range 67, West of the 5th P.M. and Section 6 and 7 in Township 98 North, Range 66 West of the 5th P.M. , a distance of approximately eight and one fourth miles to a point where the center line of said highway intersects the west boundary line of the Lot 5 of Section 8 of Township 98, North Range 66 West of the 5th P.M., From thence beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot 4 of Section 5 and the Northeast corner of Lot 1 of Section 8 in Township 98 North, Range 66 West of the 5th P.M. , thence due North on the Township line between Rhoda and Moore Townships in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, until the same intersects the Section line running east and west between Sections 5 and 8, in Township 98 North, Range 66 West of the 5th P.M. and thence due east along said section line between said sections 5 and 8, 4 and 9, 3 and 10, 2 and 11 and 1 and 12 in Township 98 North, Range 66 West of the 5th P.M., and between sections 6 and 7, 5 and 8, 4 and 9 in Township 98 North Range 65 West of the 5th P.M. until said road intersects the boundary line between Charles Mix and Douglas Counties, South Dakota.

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLES MIX COUNTY MEET IN ADJOURNED SESSION

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, December 10, 1930. The County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota met in adjourned session, with all members present, Riffle, Baxa and McBride.

Certain real estate property, given as collateral to Charles Mix County, for funds deposited in local banks was considered, and thereupon the following resolution was passed :

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, is indebted to this county in the sum of \$14,233.62, secured by the following collateral, to-wit: (1), A second real estate mortgage given by Carl A. Hammer and Jacob Hammer, and their wives on the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and S $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 24, the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 25, all in Township 99 N.R. 70 W., the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 19, and the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ (or Lots 3 and 4), and the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 19, all in T. 99 N.R. 69 W., 5th P.M., in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, containing 1123.64 acres, more or less, subject to a first mortgage on which there is unpaid the principal sum of \$25,500.00. which said mortgage is owned by the Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of this County in Book 48 of Mortgages on page 396. ; (2), A second real estate mortgage given by Archie C. Jensen and Alma Jensen on the Lots 3 and 4 and S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4, the Lots 3 and 4 and the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$, and the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 5, all in Twp. 98 N. R. 69 W., 5th P.M., in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, containing 694.27 acres, more or less, subject to a first mortgage in the approximate sum of \$18,000.00, which is now past due, which said second mortgage is owned by the Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, and is recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, in Book 54 of Mortgages on page 209.

AND WHEREAS, certain interest on said first mortgage on said real estate, and certain taxes thereon are now past due and unpaid, and whereas this Board considers it to the best interest of said county to compromise said claim by accepting an absolute assignment from the Commercial State Bank of the second mortgage given by Carl A. Hammer and Jacob Hammer and their wives on said real estate so mortgaged by them in full satisfaction of the claim of Charles Mix County against said Commercial State Bank, inasmuch as the said Carl A. Hammer, and Jacob Hammer and their wives have agreed to pay all delinquent taxes on said lands, and to give said county a new mortgage on said premises for the said sum of \$14,233.62, plus the amount of the now delinquent interest coupon on said first mortgage which is in the approximate sum of \$1500, which is to be advanced and paid by said County, which said second mortgage shall bear such rate of interest as is paid for County deposits, and shall be come due and payable five years after its date.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the claim of Charles Mix County South Dakota, against the Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, amounting to the sum of \$14,233.62, be and the same is hereby compromised upon the following terms and conditions to-wit: The said Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota shall assign absolutely to said Charles Mix County, South Dakota the three promissory notes of Carl A. Hammer and Hattie Hammer shall pay all the delinquent taxes on said real estate, and shall make, execute and deliver to Charles Mix County, South Dakota, a new second mortgage, upon the release of the present second mortgage by said County, on the said lands and premises for the said sum of \$14,233.62 plus the amount of the now delinquent coupon for interest on said first mortgage which is in the approximate sum of \$1500.00, which is to be advanced and paid by Charles Mix County, which said second mortgage shall bear such rate of interest as is paid for County deposits at the time of the execution of said mortgage and shall become due and payable five years after its date and,




