LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, January 3, 1931. -- The County

Commissioners of Charles Mix County South Dakota, reconvened in regular session to continue the business of the month, all members answering to roll call, Baxa, McBride and Riffle.

In accordance with a resolution passed by the Board on December 10, 1930, and following a careful discussion of the matter the following resolution was passed by the Board:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Circuit Court within and for Charles Mix County, South Dakota, did on the 24th day of December, 1930, make and enter its order, approving the proposed compromise between the Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, and Charles Mix County, South Dakota, embodied in the resolution of this Board passed on December 10, 1930, and

WHEREAS, the said Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, has duly assigned to said Charles Mix County, South Dakota the three notes aggregating the sum of \$25,000.00 and secured by that certain real estate mortgage which is recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, in Book 48 of Mortgages on page 396; and

WHEREAS, there is now due and owing to the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company of New York, N.Y., on the first and superior mortgage on said mortgaged premises the sum of \$1493.75; and the amount due and owing from the said Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, on certificate of indebtedness No. 293-63, is the sum of \$14,233.62, aggregating the sum of \$15,727.37; and

WHEREAS, Carl A. Hammer and Phine Hammer, his wife; and Jacob O. Hammer and Hattie Hammer, his wife have made executed and delivered to Charles Mix County, South Dakota, their promissory note dated January 2, 1931, for the principal sum of \$15,727.37, secured by a second real estate mortgage upon said premises; and

WHEREAS, the said Commercial State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, a corporation, and the said Carl A. Hammer and Phine Hammer, his wife; Jacob O Hammer and Hattie Hammer, his wife, have in all respects complied with the terms and conditions of the resolution of this Board, passed on December 10, 1930, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that Joseph R. Anderson, County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, be and is hereby authorized and directed to satisfy of record that certain mortgage of \$25,000.00, which is recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, in Book 48 of Mortgages on page 396, and to surrender up to said mortgagors, Carl A. Hammer Phine, Hammer, Jacob O. 



WHEREAS, these men are willing and anxious to work if work can be had but such work cannot be secured, excepting through the development of some public improvement, and

WHEREAS, these Indian people are wards of the United States Government, residing upon the Indian Reservation, under the direct supervision of the United States, and,

Whereas, there is need for a considerable amount of road work upon the roads throughout the Indian Reservation, and leading into the Indian Agency leading into Greenwood, which road work is largely adjacent to and abutting upon lands held in trust for Indian allottees by the United States,

AND WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has made appropriations intended to relieve the distressful condition of unemployment prevailing throughout the Nation,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLES MIX COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, that the situation be brought to the attention of the members of Congress representing the State of South Dakota, with the request that they use every effort to secure the allotment for use upon the said Yankton Indian Reservation and for the employment of these Indian people, of a sufficient sum of money to carry out the necessary road work within the boundaries of said Indian Reservation and to provide employment for these unemployed wards of the Government, for a reasonable period of time, such sum of money to be at least twenty thousand dollars.

The above resolution was introduced by Jespersen, who moved its passage and approval, and was seconded by Beltman. Upon motion, all members voting "Aye", the resolution was adopted.

RESOLUTION FOR GRAVELLING OF HIGHWAY

WHEREAS, the act of June 24, 1930 (46 Stat. L 805), provides for Federal Aid for the construction, survey, reconstruction, and maintenance of roads on and across Indian Reservations and unreserved public lands, and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of the Yankton Indian Reservation appeared before the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, asking that the County Highway Commissioners of Charles Mix County initiate and recommend to the State Highway Department, and requesting that they in turn take the matter up with the Federal Bureau of Public Roads for 100 % Federal Aid, for the construction of the following road:

From Greenwood, South Dakota, to Wagner, South Dakota, described as follows:

" Beginning at the intersection of Highway 50 and Main Street of Wagner, S. Dak., Section 4, Township 95, North of Range 63, West of the 5th P.M., thence south for a distance of one mile. Then west approximately three-quarters of a mile to the Northwest corner of Section 9, thence south for a distance of five miles to the Northeast corner of Section 5, Township 94, Range 63, West of the 5th P.M., thence west one mile along the north boundary of said Section 5, Then south for a distance of Four miles to the Northeast corner of Section 30, Township 94, Range 63, West of the 5th P.M., thence west one mile along the North boundary of said Section 30, thence south along the West boundary line of said Section 30, thence West between Sections 25 and 36, Township 94, Range 64 West of the 5th P.M., for a distance of one half mile then south on the quarter line in Section 36 for a distance of one quarter mile. Thence West on the one sixteenth line for a distance of approximately one half mile, crossing Mosquito Creek, thence jogging southwest approximately eight rods. Thence northwest along the established road for a distance of one mile to the Yankton Indian Agency at Greenwood, South Dakota. "

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners deem it proper and to the best interests of said county, and to the Indian Agency located thereon, to have such road constructed and maintained by Federal Aid, the construction and maintenance of said Highway is hereby recommended to the State Highway Department and it is requested that the State Highway Department recommend to the Federal Bureau of Public Roads for 100% Federal Aid from the Federal Government for the construction, Survey, Reconstruction and Maintenance of the said road hereinbefore described in this Resolution.

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, February 5, 1931. -- The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned session, at the hour of 9:00 o'clock A.M., with all members present, - Jespersen, Beltman and McBride.

By due and proper motion of the Board, the official bonds of Ray C. Gill as Highway Superintendent for Charles Mix County, and R.J. Taylor for Justice of the Peace were approved by the signing of the same.

Two petitions, having been filed by the County Auditor, bearing the legal number of signatures of persons, most of whom live in Highland and Wahehe townships and in and around Wagner, S.D. One petitions calls for the preparation and for the gravelling of the Highway beginning at Highway 50 and running six miles south to and beyond Marty Mission. The other petition, for the most part, calls for the relocation of said road at a place one mile east of the present location, and for the gravelling of same. Both of these petitions were held by the Board for investigation and for further consideration.

A petition asking for the appointment of L.H. Anderson of Wagner, S.D. as a county Constable of Charles Mix County, was held for consideration, final action to be taken at the next regular meeting of the Board.

A petition bearing the names of 26 persons, asking for the construction of a bridge on the road between Sections 21 and 22 in Rouse Township, across Bull Creek, was held for further investigation.

The matter of the relocation of certain highway in Moore Township, hereinafter more particularly described, having been held for advisement, was reconsidered by the Board. Upon motion by Beltman, Seconded by Jespersen and carried by vote the following resolution for relocation was passed as presented by the petition, except that one mile of highway described therein was left unchanged:

RESOLUTION FOR THE RELOCATION OF A PART OF THE COUNTY HIGHWAY SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, have heretofore on the 7th day of January, 1931 proposed for adoption the following resolution

WHEREAS IT IS APPARENT, that certain portions of the County Highway system of Charles Mix County, should be relocated, because such relocation would serve a greater number of people,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESLOVED, that subject to the consent of the State Highway of the State of South Dakota the following described portions of the County Highway system of said county are hereby removed from such system, to-wit: Four miles, beginning at the Northeast corner of Section 18, Township 98, North of Range 65 W. of the 5th P.M., and running south between Section 17 and 18, 19 and 20, 29 and 30 and 31 and 32 to the Southeast corner of Section 31 in said Township.

One mile running east and West between Sections 20 and 29 of Township 98 North Range 65 W. of the P.M.

One Mile running east and west between 6 and 7 in Township 97, North, Range 66 W. of the 5th P.M. all in Charles Mix County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such mileage of county highway system be relocated as follows to-wit:

Beginning at the southeast corner of Section 32 in Township 98, N. Range 65 W. of the 5th P.M. and running North five miles between Sections 32 and 33, 28 and 29, 20 and 21, 16 and 17 and 8 and 9 to the Northeast corner of Section 8.

Also beginning at the Southeast corner of Section 10, Township 98, N. Range 66 W. of the 5th P.M. and running north one mile to the Northeast corner of Section 10 of said Township, all in Charles Mix County.

RESOLUTION APPROVING DEPOSITORY FOR CHARLES MIX COUNTY FUNDS


WHEREAS, through its officers, the Farmers and Merchants bank of Platte, South Dakota, has made application to be designated as a county depository for Charles Mix County Funds, the maximum amount of said funds not to exceed \$30,000.00, and


WHEREAS, said bank has produced for collateral South Dakota Rural Credit Refunding Bonds in the amount of \$10,000.00, and by a trust receipt given to Charles Mix County said Bonds are to be held for safe keeping by the Continental Illinois Bank and Trust Company of Chicago, Illinois, and

WHEREAS, said collateral has been accepted under the terms of the agreement in the contract, by the Board of County Commissioners,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Platte, South Dakota be and is hereby designated as a depository for Charles Mix County Funds in an amount equal to 90 percent of its collateral held in trust for Charles Mix County by the Continental Illinois Bank and Trust Company of Chicago, Illinois, in an amount not to exceed \$30,000.00 and for a period of one year from April 1st, 1931.

The above resolution was introduced by Beltman, who moved its passage and approval and was seconded by Jespersen. On motion, Beltman, Jespersen and McBride voting "Aye;" the resolution was adopted.





In view of the fact that considerable inquiries and requests have been made by persons in Charles Mix County, living in the Second and Third Commissioners districts, asking that the Board of County Commissioners take measures relative to the control of grass hoppers, the Board, on June 2nd, 1931, asked the Department of Entomology at Brookings, S.D., to send a representative to meet with them on June 5th, 1931.

Pursuant to this request, Mr. A.L. Ford, of the South Dakota Agricultural Extension Department met with the Commissioners at the appointed hour, and several interested persons from various parts of the county attended the meeting, as well.

Having fully considered the matter and being advised as to the best methods of control of grass hoppers by Mr. A.L. Ford, a motion was made and was carried by a majority vote, instructing the County Auditor to order one car load, or approximately 2500 gallons, of prepared poison from the Pearson-Ferguson Company of Kansas City, at the rate of forty-five cents per gallon. As a part of the same motion it was provided that the poison, when delivered in Charles Mix County, will be furnished free to persons who apply for the same and will be paid for out of the General Fund of the County. The motion included the further provision that the Bran or Ground Barley to be used in completing the preparation be furnished by the individual rather than by the county.

By motion of the Board adjournment was taken to meet again on July, 7, 1931, or at an earlier date, by agreement, if necessary.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that subject to the consent of the State Highway Commission of the State of South Dakota, the following described portions of the County Highway System of said county are hereby removed from said county highway system, to-wit:

" Commencing at a point at the Southeast corner of Section four of Township 97, Range 67, thence running due west for a distance of four miles to the Southwest corner of Section One, Township 97, Range 68, W. 5th P.M.


and that such mileage of County Highway system be relocated as follows, to-wit:





At the hour of 3:00 o'clock P.M. the County Commissioners and the County Auditor met as a Board of Equalization.

Severn Rasmussen, John G. Hugg and Adolph Rasmussen, representing the Farmers Union of Platte, S.D., requested that the Board, when equalizing the value of farm lands per acre, take due consideration of the item of comparative values of land in the Northwest part and the Southeast part of the county. They suggested that land in the Third Commissioners district should not be valued on a par with land in the eastern part of the county for the reason that the annual rain fall is less and the rough land is greater in proportion in the western part of the county. Attention was further called to the difference in valuation per acre of southern Brule County and to western BonHomme county, lying adjacent to the respective boundaries of Charles Mix County. The Committee was assured by the Board that the recommendations suggested would be fully considered.

J.C. Thomson, Irving Johnson and John O'Harra, representing Platte Township, protested to the Board that land in Platte Township was assessed too high per acre in proportion to the value per acre of land in various other townships, during the past few years. The Board of Equalization agreed to make an effort to obtain a more satisfactory equalization of land values in Platte Township for the year of 1931.

Following adjournment as a Board of Equalization, the County Commissioners approved, by motion, the following applications for tax adjustments:

An abatement of all taxes on property owned by Marty Mission, for the year of 1930, not heretofore abated, in Highland, Wahehe and White Swan Townships, following out and pursuant to an opinion of the Attorney General of South Dakota, dated June 24th, 1931.

A refund to Fred L. Eggers of \$1.15 on personal property assessed in Ree Township for the year of 1930 for the reason that said property was erroneously listed in School District number 4, rather than in School district number 5.





After some investigation the Board reduced said assessment from \$1458.00 to \$1100.00.

A request from F.J. Lindskog to reduce the valuation of structures, located on the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Township 96, Range 67, was rejected, because the Jackson Township Review Board had taken no prior action on the assessment in question.

Equalization of City and Town property, as well as rural property under the sub-heads of real estate and personal was then considered. The Board, in an effort to properly equalize the various classes of property, agreed upon a general average for certain items and made the following figures and items alterations to conform thereto:

LAKE ANDES, South Dakota, August 4, 1931. The County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota met in adjourned regular session for the business of the month, with all members present, - Jespersen, Beltman and McBride.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Bonnin of Washington, D.C., met with the Board to solicit the cooperation of the Board to use its influence in procuring State or Federal aid or both, for Indians within the county who are no longer wards of the Government, and who are destitute because of drouth and unemployment. The Board offered assurance of its appreciation of the conditions and of its willingness to assist as directed.

The Security Savings Bank of Geddes, S.D. made application for a release of part of the collateral held by Charles Mix County as security for deposits for the reason that said deposits amount to less than one fifth of the collateral pledged. Likewise the Corn Exchange Savings Bank of Sioux Falls asked for a release of all of its collateral. The following resolution was introduced by Beltman:


RESOLUTION RELEASING BANK COLLATERAL

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Treasurer of Charles Mix County be and is hereby authorized to release the following collateral for bank deposits in the name of the county:



A petition was presented to the Commissioners, signed by many residents of the county, asking that the Commissioners refrain from paying the yearly \$500.00 donation to the Charles Mix County Fair Association for the current year of 1931.

Jespersen moved that no donation would be made to the Charles Mix County Fair Association during the year of 1931. The motion was seconded by Beltman and was carried by a unanimous vote.

As provided by law, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M., the County Commissioners held the meeting open for a hearing on the Provisional Budget for Charles Mix County for the year of 1932.

Several hundred persons had gathered in the Court room at the appointed hour and the Commissioners met with them to discuss many of the appropriations and to consider a petition which had been presented, asking for reductions in several of the various proposed budget funds.

The County Board spent the greater part of the afternoon in discussing each item of the proposed budget with a committee, chosen as representatives of the Farmers Union and of the persons who attended the mass meeting in the forenoon. The Commissioners expressed a desire to cooperate with the Committee and to reduce the total budget appropriations to a figure which they deemed to be of the best interests of the county, when final action would be taken, pursuant to law, on August 11, 1931.

Upon due and proper motion the following applications for tax adjustments were granted:

An abatement of road and school poll to Harold Maggrett of Platte S.D., because at the time of assessment he was under twenty one years of age. Abatement granted on 1930 tax.

An abatement to I.E. Sproul of \$11.15, for the year of 1930, on grain tax because the listing blank of his assessment has no record of assessable grain on *hand*.

An abatement in valuation of grain tax from \$17,000 to \$8,500 to Babcock and Owings, in Wahehe Township, upon certification by the assessor of an erroneous assessment.

An abatement of tax amounting to \$59.90, together with interest thereon, for the year of 1929, on Lots 1112 and 1125 in Section 31, Twp. 94, Range 64, because at the date of the assessment the applicant had no patent in fee for the land.

The Board adjourned, by motion, to meet again the following day, August 5, 1931.

At the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M., bids were opened for the purchase of two carloads of coal for use in the court house. Thompson Yards Inc. of Lake Andes, having presented the lowest responsible bid, was awarded the contract, by motion of the Board, to furnish two carloads of Commander egg-size coal, in open cars, F.O.B. at the rate of \$9.44 per ton.

Two bids were opened at 10:30 o'clock A.M. for the drayage of said coal, one by Zachariarson Bros. and one by M.E. Cooper, each at fifty cents per ton. No contract was awarded.

Pursuant to the notice which appeared in the official news papers of the county, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock P.M., the matter of the relocation of a portion of the county highway system, west of Geddes, S.D. in Jackson and Signal Townships was considered. A petition of protest, presented by John Hugg and Edward E. Gibson and bearing the signatures of thirty one persons, indicating disapproval of such relocation, was given careful study. Beltman moved that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLUTION FOR THE RELOCATION OF PART OF THE COUNTY HIGHWAY SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota have heretofore on the 7th day of July, 1931, proposed for adoption the following resolution:

WHEREAS, it is apparent that certain portions of the county highway system should be relocated, because such relocation would serve a greater number of people and it would give a due east and west connection between State Highways 43 and 45.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that subject to the consent of the State Highway Commission of the State of South Dakota, the following described portions of the county highway system are hereby removed from said county highway system, to-wit:

" Commencing at a point at the southeast corner of Section 4 of Township 97, Range 67, thence running due west for a distance of four miles to the Southwest corner of Section One, Township 97, Range 68, W. 5th P.M. " and that such mileage of county highway system be relocated as follows to-wit:

"Commencing at the Southwest corner of Section Thirty-four, Township 98, Range 67, thence extending due west a distance of four miles and terminating at a point where the same intersects with State Highway Number 45. "

Notice is hereby given that the foregoing resolution was proposed for adoption at the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, held on the 7th day of July, 1931, and that said resolution will be considered, amended, adopted or rejected at the regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, to be held in the Court House on the 5th day of August, 1931, at the hour of 2:00 O'clock P.M., at which time and place any person interested may appear and be heard.





RESOLUTION DIRECTING THAT A TRUST AGREEMENT BE ENTERED INTO WITH THE
EXAMINER IN CHARGE OF CLOSED COUNTY BANKS FROM WHICH COUNTY HOLDS
COLLATERAL SECURITY FOR COUNTY FUNDS

WHEREAS, the Farmers State Bank, the Platte State Bank, and the Commercial State Bank, all of Platte; the Charles Mix County Bank and the Bank of Geddes, both of Geddes; the Lakeside State Bank of Lake Andes; and the Andes State Bank of Ravinia while going institutions, pledged certain notes trust agreements, deeds and second mortgages to Charles Mix County, a body politic, as security for the deposit and safekeeping of funds of said county in said banking institutions; and,

WHEREAS, all of said banking institutions are now insolvent and in the hands of the Superintendent of Banks of the State of South Dakota for the purpose of liquidation, and are under the management and direction of F.B. Carter, as Examiner in charge of all of said banks, and

WHEREAS, the legal status of said notes, trust deeds and second mortgages is now in dispute between the said Superintendent of Banks and the County of Charles Mix, and

WHEREAS, test cases are now pending before the State Supreme Court relative to the matters in controversy, and

WHEREAS, much of the collateral pledged is in danger of depreciating in value and must be protected by the Banking Department, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to the Board of County Commissioners that said collateral may be protected by the entering into between the Banking Department and the County, of a trust relationship as to such collateral, and it further appearing that such arrangement is necessary and to the best interests of the County, Now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners be and he is authorized and directed to enter into a "Trust Agreement" with the Examiner in Charge of the above named banks, whereby the collateral held by the County, which is in dispute between the parties aforesaid, be turned over to F.B. Carter, as examiner-in-charge, pending a court determination of this matter between the parties, or the decision of the Supreme Court in any test case holding as to the legality of the pledging of Notes and Second Mortgages and Trust Deeds.
