An application by the Northwestern Public Service Company of Huron, S.D., for a franchise to maintain poles, wires and other electrical fixtures along certain highways in Charles Mix County, having been filed by the County Auditor, was given hearing by the Board. After some discussion Beltman moved that the following resolution be approved:

RESOLUTION GRANTING FRANCHISE TO THE NORTHWESTERN PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY

WHEREAS, the Northwestern Public Service Company, a corporation engaged in the manufacture and sale of electric current for light, heat and power, with its main office at Huron in Beadle County, South Dakota, did on the 21st day of December, 1932, file in the office of the County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota its certain application praying leave to maintain transmission line for conducting electric energy for light, heat and power purposes in, upon and along certain highways in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, in said petition described and hereinafter more particularly described, and

WHEREAS, all firms, persons and corporations owning or operating transmission, telephone or telegraph lines on any part of the highway or highways to be occupied by said proposed transmission line, have given waiver of notice of hearing of said applications and petition, which waivers of notice of hearing have been filed with the County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and

WHEREAS, there is no opposition in appearance before this Board to the granting of said application, and this being the time and place fixed for the hearing upon said application, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, that said application be and the same is hereby granted; that the said Northwestern Public Service Company, a corporation, its successors or assigns, be and it is hereby granted that the right, subject to all reasonable rules and regulations as now exist or may hereafter be prescribed by the legislature

to erect, construct and maintain a transmission line consisting of poles, wires, etc., for the purpose of conducting electrical current or energy for lighting, heating and power purposes in, upon and along the public highway in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, for a period of twenty (20) years, over the route described completely and fully in the application praying for this franchise, said application being filed in file number forty-nine (49) in the office of the County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota. This line would be on the sides of the road, as indicated on the attached plat and described in the application and at present is partly occupied by telephone lines.

The grantee shall not in any case have exclusive right to use such highway for the conducting of electricity. The poles and fixtures shall be so constructed as to not discommode the public in the use of any road or the navigation of any stream.

When any highway, along which such line has been constructed, shall be moved, the grantee shall upon ninety (90) days notice in writing remove such line to the highway as changed. The grantee shall use only strong and proper wires, attached to strong and sufficient supports and insulated at all points of attachment. He shall replace all wires with new wires whenever by ordinary wear or any other reason they are no longer safe, and shall remove all wires, use of which is abandoned. He shall properly insulate each wire carrying electric light, heat or power currents where it connects with any building, so as to avoid danger from fires. Where such wires are carried across or under wires for other services, there shall be an efficient device to prevent contact with other service lines, suspended over or under such power, heat or light service lines, in case of sagging or breaking of such wires, and providing that said transmission line shall not interfere with the service of any telephone line previously constructed on such highways.

The motion for the adoption of the above resolution was seconded by Novak. On roll call all Commissioners voted in favor of the resolution and it was declared adopted by the Chairman.

WHEREAS, as part of the poor relief furnished by said County to the County Poor, it is necessary and to the best interests of the County to enter into a contract, at a specific amount, with a Doctor of Medicine and Surgery in each Commissioners District of said County, to furnish all medical services, medicines, surgical work and hospital care for the county poor, within each district,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Auditor cause a notice to be published in each of the three official newspapers in said county, prior to the February meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, stating in substance that the Board will accept sealed bids from any Doctor of Medicine and Surgery of this

county for the furnishing of all medical services, medicines, surgical work and hospital care, including mileage to and from the home of the patient, to the county poor of said district, at a fixed rate per month for the period of six (6) months; that any doctor of Medicine and Surgery may bid on any of the three districts of said county or on all of them; that the Board of County Commissioners reserves the right to reject any or all bids; and that said bids shall be filed with the county Auditor on or before 3:00 o'clock p.m. of February 8th, 1933.

AND WHEREAS all persons, firms and corporations owning or operating transmission, telephone or telegraph lines on any part of the highway or highways to be occupied by said proposed transmission line, have given waiver of notice of hearing of said applications and petition, which waivers of notice of hearing have been duly filed with the County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota.

AND WHEREAS, There is no opposition in appearance before this Board to the granting of said application, and this being the time and place fixed for hearing upon said application.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, that said application be and the same is hereby granted; that the said Northwestern Public Service Company, a corporation, its successors or assigns, be and it is hereby granted that the right, subject to all reasonable rules and regulations as now exist or may hereafter be prescribed by the legislature, to erect, construct and maintain a transmission line, consisting of poles, wires, etc., for the purpose of conducting electrical energy for lighting, heating and power purposes in, upon and along the public highway in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, for a period of twenty (20) years, over the route hereinafter described as follows:

Project #1

Starting at a point located at the South East corner of Section 1, Twp. 98 North, Range 67 West, and running north along the east boundary of said Section 1 and the east boundaries of Sections 36, 25 and 24, Twp. 99 N., Range 67W., to a point at the South East corner of Section 13, Twp. 99 N., Range 67W., thence west along the south boundary of said Section 13 to a point at the South East corner of Section 14, Twp. 99 N., Range 67 W.

Alternate Route Project # 1

The use of the opposite side of the road on the above described route if same is made necessary by difficulty in procuring tree trimming permits so long as said route is in Charles Mix County.

Project #2

Starting at a point located at the South West corner of Section 24, Twp. 95 N., Range 64 West, and running east along its south boundary to a point at the South East corner of said Section 24, thence north along the east boundary of said Section 24 a distance of approximately four-tenths mile. This line would be on the sides of the road, as indicated on the attached plat, and at present is partly occupied by telephone lines.

The Grantee shall not in any case have the exclusive right to use such highway for the conducting of electricity. The poles and fixtures shall be so constructed as to not discommode the public in the use of any road, or navigation of any stream.

When any highway, along which such line has been constructed, shall be moved, the grantee shall upon ninety (90) days notice in writing remove such line to the highway as changed. The Grantee shall use only strong and proper wires, attached to strong and sufficient supports and insulated at all points of attachment. He shall replace all wires with new wires whenever by ordinary wear of other reason they are no longer safe, and shall remove all wires, use of which is abandoned. He shall properly insulate each wire carrying electric light, heat or power currents where it connects with any building, so as to avoid danger from fires. Where such wires are carried across of under wires for other services there shall be an efficient device to prevent contact with such other service lines, suspended over or under such power, heat or light service lines, in case of sagging or breaking of such wires, and providing that said transmission line shall not interfere with the service of any telephone or telegraph line previously constructed on such highways.

The county will furnish all medicines, vaccines, anti-toxins, dressings and supplies. The county will pay the following rates for hospitalization at the Platte Hospital; \$2.50 per day for hospital care, a \$5.00 fee for operating room, a \$5.00 fee for an assistant to give anesthetic, and \$5.00 for the attending nurse when an operation is performed. Where a special nurse is required, either at the Warren Hall or at the Platte Hospital, to care for county farm patients, the county will settle directly with said special nurse. The said Physician and surgeon will receive as a salary for his services, including surgery, excepting that which can not be handled in this county, the sum of \$100.00 per month commencing July 1, 1933, and continuing for a period of one year. The above salary per month includes not to exceed eight calls to the poor farm, and where the calls in any month exceed eight, the said physician shall be allowed mileage at the rate of 25 cents per mile one way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the States Attorney prepare a contract in conformity herewith.
