RESOLUTION FARMERS STATE BANK, PLATTE

Mr. Beltman offered the following Resolution and moved its adoption, which motion was seconded by Mr. Novak:

RESOLUTION

Whereas, the Farmers State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, while a going concern, pledged as collateral to Charles Mix County, South Dakota, among other mortgages as security for the deposit of county funds in said bank, a certain note in the face value of \$11,500.00 secured by a third mortgage on 1488 acres of rough land in Charles Mix County, which said note and mortgage were signed by Ansel H. Bailey of Platte, South Dakota, and

Whereas, there is a first mortgage of record now past due against said premises in the sum of \$20,000, and a second mortgage of record now past due against said premises in the sum of \$16,000.00, both of said mortgages being prior to the mortgage pledged as collateral to said Charles Mix County, and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners are of the opinion that there remains no equity to the county in its third mortgage, and

Whereas, Ansel H. Bailey has offered the county of Charles Mix the sum of \$50.00 to return said pledged third mortgage to the Farmers State Bank, now insolvent, and

Whereas, Peter Gores, Examiner in Charge, of said Farmers State Bank has agreed to accept the return of said third mortgage offered as security, the assignment of said third mortgage never having been entered of record, now therefore,

Be it resolved that upon payment to the County Auditor of the sum of \$50.00 by said Ansel H. Bailey, the County Auditor is authorized to turn over to Peter Gores, Examiner in Charge of the Farmers State Bank of Platte, South Dakota, the note aforesaid, the third mortgage, the proposed pledge and the assignment of said said mortgage to the County from the Farmers State Bank, and the said Farmers State Bank is authorized to credit a payment to Charles Mix County on its account for money deposited therein only in the amount of \$50.00.

#### RESOLUTION

Whereas, the Township Board of Ree Township in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, abandoned the use of the following described section line by Resolution on the 11th day of July 1910, said Resolution being duly recorded in Miscellaneous Record "6" on page 132., and

Whereas, said highway is now part of the County Highway system, and the part previously abandoned is described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on Section line at the Northeast corner of Lot numbered four hundred and seventy-five (475) and the Northwest corner of Lot numbered four hundred and ninety-four (494), Township Ninety-four (94), Range Sixty-Three (63), thence running North to a point at the Northeast corner of Lot numbered four hundred and eighty-one (481) and the Northwest corner of Lot numbered four hundred and eighty-eight (488) in said Township 94, Range 63, and

Whereas, it is now considered necessary and to the best interest of Charles Mix County and the county highway system thereof to re-establish said section line highway hereinbefore described, and abandon the use of the part substituted for the above, for the reason that the highway would be shortened about a mile and one half and four corners would be eliminated, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, recommends to the State Highway Commission of the State of South Dakota that that part of the section line highway hereinbefore described to re-established as part of the county highway system, and that the following described highway substituted therefore by the Resolution of the Township Board of Ree Township in the year 1910, and recorded in Miscellaneous Record "6" on page #132, be abandoned, to-wit:

Abandon the following: Commencing on the said section line at the Northeast corner of lot numbered four hundred and seventy-five (475) and the Northwest corner of said lot four hundred and ninety-four (494) thence East Eighty (80) rods to the Northeast corner of said lot four hundred and ninety-four (494) and the Northwest corner of lot ##### five hundred and fifteen (515) thence directly North on lot line a distance of four hundred and eighty (480) rods to the Northeast corner of lot numbered four hundred and eighty-eight (488) and the Northwest corner of lot five hundred and twenty-one (521), in said Township Ninety-four (94), Range sixty-three (63), thence West eighty rods (80) along section line to said section line running North and South, all in Charles Mix County, South Dakota.

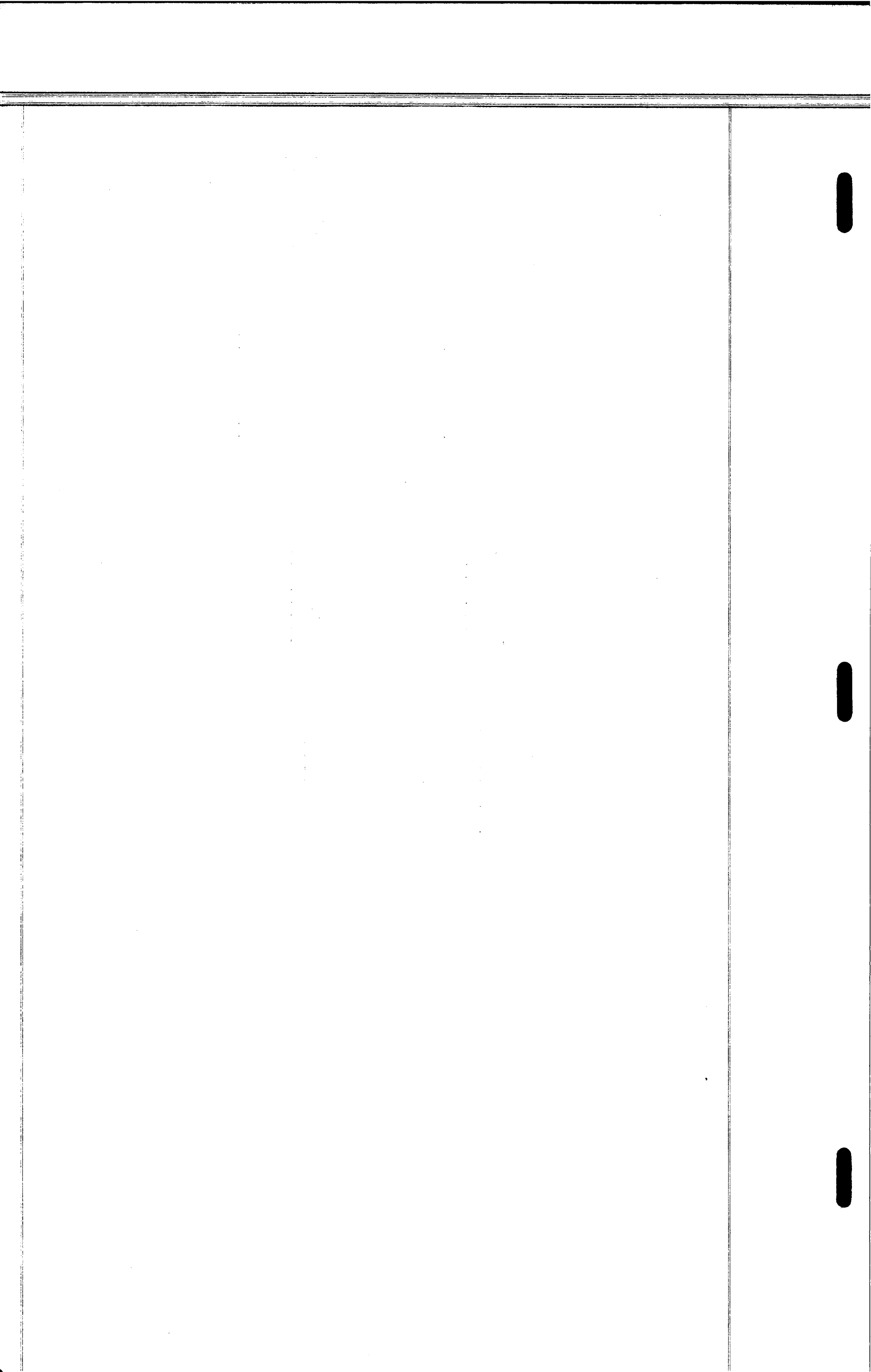

RESOLUTION FOR THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS

Whereas, at the December Meeting, 1932, of the Board of County Commissioners there was transferred from the Road Fund of Charles Mix County to the County General Fund the sum of \$10,000.00 and to the Salary Fund the sum of \$2,000.00 and to the Custer Fund, the sum of \$4,000.00; and

Whereas, at the February, 1933 meeting of said Board there was transferred to the General Fund, from said Road Fund, the sum of \$20,000.00, and to the salary Fund from said Road Fund the sum of 10,000.00, and  
Whereas, said Road Fund is now depleted and is overdrawn in the sum of \$3,910.48, and

Whereas, said General Fund and Salary Fund now have a sufficient amount to reimburse the said Road Fund, and

Whereas, it is necessary and to the best interests of said County to reimburse and transfer said funds back to the Funds from which they were taken, Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the sum of \$30,000.00 be and the same is hereby transferred from the County General Fund to the Road Fund; and that the sum of \$12,000.00 be and the same is hereby transferred from the Salary Fund to the Road Fund; and that the sum of \$4,000.00 be and the same is hereby transferred from the Custer Fund to the Road Fund.
