RESOLUTION

Whereas, Charles Mix County has a large investment in a certain building used for a County shed on certain premises owned by the Farmers State Bank and the Commercial State Bank of Platte, S. Dak, and

Whereas, said premises are commonly known as the Charles Mix County Fair Grounds, and are described as follows:

The undivided one-third (1/3) interest in a certain piece or parcel of land containing Forty (40) acres situated in the Southwest Corner of the Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of section Twenty-four (24) in Township Ninety-nine (99) North, Range Sixty-eight (68) West of the 5th P.M. more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the Southwest Corner of said Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) and thence running East along said Quarter Section line Fourteen Hundred Fifty-two feet (1452); thence running North Twelve Hundred (1200) feet; thence running West Fourteen Hundred Fifty-two (1452) feet to the West line of said Section and thence running South Twelve Hundred (1200) feet along said West Section line to the place of beginning. And Whereas Charles Mix County has an interest in an undivided 1/3 interest in and to said premises: the Farmers State Bank owns an undivided one-third interest in said premises, and the Commercial State Bank owns an undivided one-third interest in and to said premises, and

Whereas, said premises have been used by Charles Mix County for several years in part as county yards, and

Whereas, it is necessary and to the best interests of said county to acquire the whole of said premises in order to protect the property already owned by said county and buildings thereon, and

Whereas, said buildings and said premises are valuable to said county for the purposes aforesaid, and

Whereas, the Superintendent of Banks acting for and on behalf of the Farmers State Bank and the Commercial State Bank has offered for sale their undivided 2/3rds. interest therein, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the county Auditor be and he is hereby directed to file with the Superintendent of Banks of the State of South Dakota, a bid in the sum of \$405.00 for the undivided one-third interest of the Farmers State Bank and a bid ~~and~~ in the sum of \$405.00 for the undivided one-third interest of the Commercial State Bank in the above described premises, which bids shall be mailed to Peter Gores, Examiner in Charge of each of said Banks. Whereas, each of the publishers in the County has further agreed with the Board that in case his publication is designated by the Board, as one of the three official newspapers, then he will in that case pay to the publisher of a fourth newspaper, (said fourth newspaper to be named by the Board) one fourth of whatever amount that he, as the publisher of such official newspaper shall receive from the County for the performance of such service, to the end that such fourth newspaper publisher will receive for his services an amount equal to that received by any one of the publishers of the official newspapers, and at no additional expense to the County, and

Whereas, the Board is advised, that in designating the official newspapers it has been a custom of long standing to designate at least one newspaper from each commissioner district and to designate the newspaper or newspapers recommended by the commissioner representing the district in which said newspapers are printed and published, and

Whereas, in the opinion of the Board, it is necessary and to the best interests of the people of the County that said custom be followed, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners designate three official newspapers, no more than one of which shall be printed or published in the same commissioner District, and

BE IT RESOLVED that a fourth newspaper, printed and published in the County of Charles Mix County be named by the Board to print and publish the proceedings of the Board in the same manner as if it were an official paper, and

BE IT RESOLVED that each of the publishers of the official newspapers pay to the publisher of said fourth newspaper a sum equal to one fourth of the amount, received by them, from the county for the performance of such service, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD in designating the three official newspapers, and in naming the fourth newspaper, hereinbefore mentioned, follow the established custom and designate and name the newspapers which are recommended by the commissioner from the district in which said newspapers are printed and published.

 Resolution regarding the Application of the NORTHWESTERN PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY

R-E-S-O-L-U-T-I-O-N

WHEREAS, The Northwestern Public Service Company, a Corporation engaged in the manufacture and sale of electric current for lights, heat and power with its main business office at Huron, County of Beadle, South Dakota, did on the seventh day of May, 1935, duly file in the office of the County Auditor of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, its certain petition and application praying leave to construct a transmission line for conduction electric energy for light, heat and power purposes in, upon and along certain highways in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, in said petition described and hereafter more particularly described.

AND WHEREAS all persons, firms and corporations owning or operating transmission, telephone or telegraph lines on any part of the highway or highways to be occupied by said proposed transmission line, have been given notice by registered letter of the time and place of the hearing, before this board, of said petition and application.

And WHEREAS, There is no opposition in appearance before this board to the granting of said application, and this being the time and place fixed for hearing upon said application.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, that said application be and the same is hereby granted; that the said Northwestern Public Service Company, a corporation, its successors or assigns, be and it is hereby granted that the right, subject to all reasonable rules and regulations as now exist or may hereafter be prescribed by the legislature, to erect, construct and maintain a transmission line, consisting of poles, wires, etc., for the purpose of conducting electrical energy for lighting, heating and power purposes in, upon and along the public highway in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, for a period of twenty (20) years, over the route hereinafter described as follows:

PROJECT #1 Starting at a point at the South West corner of Section 8, Twp. 96 N., Range 63 W., and running two miles west along the south boundaries of Section 7 - 96 - 63 and Section 12, Twp. 96 N., Range 64 W., Thence crossing the road to the North East corner of Section 14, Township 96 N., Range 64 W. and continuing along the north boundaries of Sections 14, 15 and 16, - 96 - 64 to a point at the North East corner of Section 17, 96 - 64. Thence north along the east boundary of Section 8 - 96-64 to the North East Corner of said Section 8. Thence west along the North boundaries of Section 7 and 8 - 96 -64 and Section 12 - 96 -65 to a point just west of the North West corner of section 12 -96- 65. At this point crossing the road to the North or lake side of the road and continuing west following the gravel highway on the same side of the road to a point in Section 11 96 - 65 where the highway crosses the railroad track. At this point taking the east side of the road and continuing west through Sec. 10-96-65 and into Section 10-96-65 to a point on the highway South of Third Street, Lake Andes.

PROJECT #2

Starting at a point at the North East corner of Section 24, Twp. 99 N., Range 67 W. and running west along the north boundaries of Sections, 24, 23 and 22 - 99 -67 to a point at the North West corner of Section 22 - 99 -67. Thence crossing the road to the South East corner of Section 16 99 - 67 and continuing west along south boundaries of Sections 16, 17 and 18 -99-67 and Section 13 - 99 - 68 to a point where said section line enters the corporate limits of the City of Platte. This line would be on the sides of the road, as indicated on the attached Plat, and at present is partly occupied by telephone lines.

The Grantee shall not in any case have the exclusive right to use such highway for the conducting of electricity. The poles and fixtures shall be so constructed as to not discommode the public in the use of any road, or navigation of any stream.

When any highway, along which such line has been constructed, shall be moved, the grantee shall upon ninety (90) days notice in writing remove such line to the highway as changed. The Grantee shall use only strong and proper wires, attached to strong and sufficient supports and insulated at all points of attachment. He shall replace all wires and new

wires whenever by ordinary wear or other reason they are no longer safe, and shall remove all wires, use of which is abandoned. He shall properly insulate each wire carry electric light, heat or power currents where it connects with any building, so as to avoid danger from fires. Where such wires are carried across or under wires for other services there shall be an efficient device to prevent contact with such other service lines, suspended over or under such power, heat or light service lines, in case of sagging or breaking of such wires, and providing that said transmission line shall not interfere with the service of any telephone or telegraph line previously constructed on such highways.
