Commissioner Novak introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption: WHEREAS, the County has outstanding unpaid warrants representing indebtedness incurred prior to December 31, 1940, in the amount of \$160,000; and WHEREAS, the County is indebted to the State of South Dakota and its Permanent School Fund, or other educational funds, on account of moneys received from the principal of such funds for investment and not returned, but which have been invested in bonds or loans which have been in default for two years or more, or which have been foreclosed, all as provided in Section 57.0506, South Dakota Code of 1939, which indebtedness and liability amounts to \$465,000; and WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has investigated the situation in the County with reference to loans under Section 15.0612, and has determined that there are no suitable loans and investments for the Permanent School and other educational funds ~~apportioned~~ apportioned to the County and such funds cannot be invested at an interest rate of five per cent; and WHEREAS, the County is authorized by Chapter 33, Session Laws of 1941, to issue bonds to fund its floating indebtedness existing at the close of the fiscal year ending December 31, 1940; and WHEREAS, the County Board proposes to issue bonds of the County under and pursuant to said law in order to fund the floating indebtedness existing at the close of the fiscal year ending December 31, 1940, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of three per cent per annum, and to mature in twenty years, which bonds are a proper and suitable investment for the Permanent School Fund; and WHEREAS, the County Board proposes to issue bonds of the County under and pursuant to said law in order to fund the Permanent School Fund indebtedness, said bonds to bear interest at two per cent per annum, and to mature in twenty years, which bonds are a proper and suitable investment for the Permanent School Funds; and WHEREAS, the Commissioner of School and Public Lands has stated that he will approve a rate of interest at two per cent per annum for investment of the permanent school funds in the bonds of Charles Mix County to fund indebtedness of said County for principal and interest of said Permanent School Fund; and WHEREAS, the Commissioner of School and Public Lands has stated that he will approve a rate of interest at three per cent per annum for investment of the permanent school funds in the bonds of Charles Mix County to fund warrant indebtedness of the County; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, as follows: 1. It is hereby found and determined that it is necessary and expedient to fund the outstanding warrant and floating indebtedness of the County existing at the close of the fiscal year ending December 31, 1940, by the issuance of the bonds of the County under Chapter 33, Laws of 1941, in the aggregate principal amount of said indebtedness but bearing a lower interest rate. The bonds to be issued hereunder shall be designated "Warrant Funding Bonds", shall be in the aggregate principal amount of \$160,000, consisting of 160 bonds, numbered from 1 to 160, both inclusive, in the denomination of \$1000 each, dated July 1, 1941, bearing interest at the rate of three per cent per annum, payable January 1 and July 1, and maturing on July 1, 1961, but subject to redemption and prior payment at the option of the County on any interest payment date at par and accrued interest. 2. It is hereby found and determined that it is necessary and expedient to fund the indebtedness of the County to the Permanent School Fund and other educational funds of the State of South Dakota on account of moneys received from the principal of said funds for investment and not returned but which were invested in bonds or real estate mortgages which had been in default as to principal or interest more than two years prior to December 31, 1940, by the issuance of the bonds of the County under Chapter 33, Laws of

1941, in the aggregate principal amount of said indebtedness but bearing a lower rate of interest. The bonds to be issued hereunder shall be designated "Permanent School Funding Bonds", shall be in the aggregate principal amount of \$465,000, consisting of 465 bonds, numbered from 1 to 465, both inclusive, in the denomination of \$1000 each, dated July 1, 1941, bearing interest at the rate of two per cent per annum, payable January 1 and July 1 in each year, and maturing on July 1, 1961, but subject to redemption and prior payment at the option of the County on any interest payment date at par and accrued interest.

3. The bonds to be issued hereunder and the interest coupons thereto attached shall be in substantially the following form: (FORM OF BOND). ----- 4. Said bonds shall be prepared under the direction of the County Auditor and shall be executed in behalf of the County by the signature of the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and attested by the County Auditor, and sealed with the Seal of the County, and the interest coupons shall be executed and authenticated by the printed, engraved, or lithographed facsimile signatures of said officers, such facsimile signatures being hereby confirmed and adopted as their true and proper signatures for the execution thereof; and the full faith, credit, and taxing powers of the County shall be, and they are hereby irrevocably pledged to the prompt and full payment of the principal of and interest on each and all of said bonds as such principal and interest respectively becomes due. 5. It is hereby determined that Charles Mix County shall purchase the above bonds at a price of par and accrued interest, and when said bonds are fully executed as above prescribed, they shall be delivered to the County Treasurer, who shall retain and hold the same as the securities and properties of said County, and that the same shall be held as collateral for, and the basis of investment of funds received by the County from the Permanent School Fund of the State of South Dakota. 6. The County Auditor shall furnish to the Commissioner of School and Public Lands such information as he shall require, including the full and complete list of all warrants and the loans pledged hereunder, which list has been examined and found correct and is by reference made a part hereof. The County Auditor shall also furnish to the Commissioner of School and Public Lands certified copies of all proceedings and records of the County relating to the issuance and sale of bonds hereunder, and such other certified copies and certificates as may be required to show the right, power, and authority of the County by its Board of County Commissioners to issue said bonds, and such certified copies and certificates shall be deemed the representations of the County as to all facts stated therein. 7. All moneys provided for the payment of the bonds issued hereunder in accordance with this resolution shall be paid into special sinking funds which are hereby created for the payment of the bonds issued hereunder, which funds shall be kept and retained by the County Treasurer separate and apart from all other county funds and shall be used solely for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds when due or for the retirement of bonds prior to maturity; provided, that ~~MM~~ when bonds shall be paid prior to maturity a sufficient amount shall always be kept and retained in said fund to pay interest due on the next ensuing interest payment date. 8. There is hereby irrevocably assigned and appropriated to said fund for the payment of the Permanent School Funding Bonds all of the mortgages, real estate, or other assets on account of any loans which were in default two years or more or foreclosed as of December 31, 1940, now held in the Permanent School Fund of the County, or which may be hereafter acquired by the County, and the net proceeds received on account of the payment of principal of or interest on any such loans or from rental ~~M~~ or sale of real estate shall be paid into said fund. 9. In order to provide funds for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds when due there shall be and is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property in the County, a direct, annual, irrepealable, ad valorem tax which shall be extended upon the tax rolls and collected with and as part of other general taxes of the County for the years and in the amounts as follows: For the payment of principal of and interest on the Warrant Funding Bonds the amount of \$5,000 in each of the years 1941 to 1949, both inclusive, \$15,000 in each of the years 1950 to 1951, both inclusive, and \$20,000 in each of the years 1952 to 1960, both inclusive. For the payment of principal of and interest on the Permanent School Funding Bonds the amount of \$10,000 in each of the years 1941 to 1950, both inclusive, and \$56,000 in each of the years 1951 to 1960, both inclusive. Said levies shall be irrepealable until the full principal of and interest on each and all of said bonds shall have been paid, provided, however, that when and if the Board of County Commissioners shall transfer and set over into said funds any other moneys or funds of the County, the Board of County Commissioners may with the consent of the Commissioner of School and Public Lands cancel a like amount of the taxes hereinbefore levied for the year or years subsequent to said appropriation in so far as permitted by law. Provided, also, that when and if any principal and interest on any of said bonds shall become due when there is insufficient money in said special fund for the payment thereof, such principal and interest shall be paid from any other funds of the County available therefor, and the money so advanced may be reimbursed out of the sinking fund when the taxes herein provided shall have been collected. 10. The County further covenants and agrees that the levies herein provided together with other money appropriated to the special fund shall be sufficient to pay principal and interest when due, and whenever, because of tax delinquency or anticipated tax delinquency, or any other cause, said fund shall in the opinion of the County Board be insufficient to pay principal and interest when due, the County shall levy such other and additional taxes as may be required to provide sufficient moneys for such purpose. 11. Charles Mix County hereby makes application to the Commissioner of School and Public Lands of the State of South Dakota for moneys from the Permanent School Fund in the amount of \$465,000, to be invested in Permanent School Funding Bonds, with rate of interest at two per cent per annum, payable semiannually, and \$160,000 to be invested in Warrant Funding Bonds with rate of interest at three per cent per annum, payable semiannually, as set forth herein, and pledges the above described bonds for the payment of said moneys, and the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to make such application and execute and deliver any and all instruments necessary to complete such transactions. 12. RESOLUTION

Commissioner Joseph Novak introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, on August 15, 1941, adopted a resolution providing for the issuance of \$160,000 Warrant Funding Bonds and \$465,000 Permanent School Funding Bonds of said County, and WHEREAS, it was and is the intention of said Board to provide that all monies paid into the special sinking funds created by said resolution shall be used to pay and redeem said bonds, in whole or in part and from time to time, as and when funds therefor are available, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, that the purchase by said County of said bonds with funds belonging to the Permanent School Fund of the State of South Dakota is for the express purpose of reducing the rate of interest which the County is now obligated to pay on its floating indebtedness and for the purpose of providing a method of liquidating, as soon as possible, the existing indebtedness of said County to the Permanent School Fund of the said State of South Dakota, and for the purpose of liquidating, as soon as possible, the other outstanding floating indebtedness of said County. To the accomplishment of said purpose, the said County hereby pledges its good faith and to that end it is hereby determined that all moneys provided for the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon shall be paid into special sinking funds and kept and retained by the County Treasurer separate and apart from all other County funds and shall be used solely for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds when due or for the retirement of bonds prior to maturity, all as provided in paragraph number 7 of said resolution adopted on August 15, 1941. It is hereby further determined that in order to insure the use of said funds solely for the purpose of paying principal of and interest on said bonds, the following program of procedure is hereby adopted and the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to carry out said program: On January 1st, and July 1st of each year all of the moneys in said funds, except so much thereof as shall be necessary to pay the interest on said bonds, shall be used for calling and paying said bonds in numerical order, and on said dates in each year the County Treasurer shall remit and pay to the State Treasurer of the State of South Dakota all moneys belonging to said funds, a sufficient amount thereof to be applied to the payment of the interest then due and the balance to be applied on the principal amount of bonds remaining outstanding; provided however, that the said County Treasurer on said dates shall retain in said funds an amount sufficient to pay the interest due on said bonds on the next ensuing interest payment date. Said special sinking funds shall be kept and retained by the County Treasurer in the form of cash, or as funds on deposit, payable on demand, in a bank designated by said County as a depository of funds of said County. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the County Auditor has duly certified to this Board under his name and the seal of his office a correct list of all outstanding warrants issued in payment of obligations and liabilities of said county and unpaid and existing at the close of the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1940, and representing the warrant indebtedness to be funded hereunder, and which said list bears date and was filed at the office of the County Auditor on the 26th day of July, 1941, and sets forth the number, amount, date of issue, date of registration, and payee, in each of said warrants totaling the amount of \$114,436.80, which said certified list by reference hereto is made a part of this resolution, and the validity of which said warrants so set forth in said list is hereby established against the payment of which said County has no lawful defense.

Whereas, the said Board of County Commissioners is now in doubt as to the legal authority of the Board to make such agreements as above referred to:
