RESOLUTION

The County Auditor presented to the Board a written Application of the City of Geddes, in said county and state, for a \$27,000 Permanent School Fund Loan to be loaned on said City's Bonds to be issued for Refunding purposes. After due consideration by the Board, Commissioner Joseph Novak introduced the following written Resolution and moved its adoption:

"Be it Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, as follows: 1. That the Application of the City of Geddes for a \$27,000 Permanent School Fund Loan be and the same is hereby approved. 2. That Charles Mix County offer to purchase at the price of par plus accrued interest, in accordance with the bid heretofore made by the Department of School and Public Lands of the State of South Dakota, with moneys of the Permanent School Fund of the State of South Dakota, the said City's Refunding Bonds to be dated January 1, 1942, to bear interest at 3% per annum, interest payable semi-annually, to mature serially \$1,000 on January 1 in each year of the years 1943 to 1953, both inclusive, and the sum of \$2,000 on January 1 in each of the years 1954 to 1961, both inclusive, said Bonds to be ~~non-interest bearing~~ redeemable at par and accrued interest on any interest payment date. 3. That the County Auditor notify said City of ~~the approval of said Application and the offer of said County to purchase said Bonds by delivering to the Clerk or Auditor of said City a certified copy of this Resolution.~~ Approved: CHARLES CHARVAT, Chairman, Board of County Commissioners. 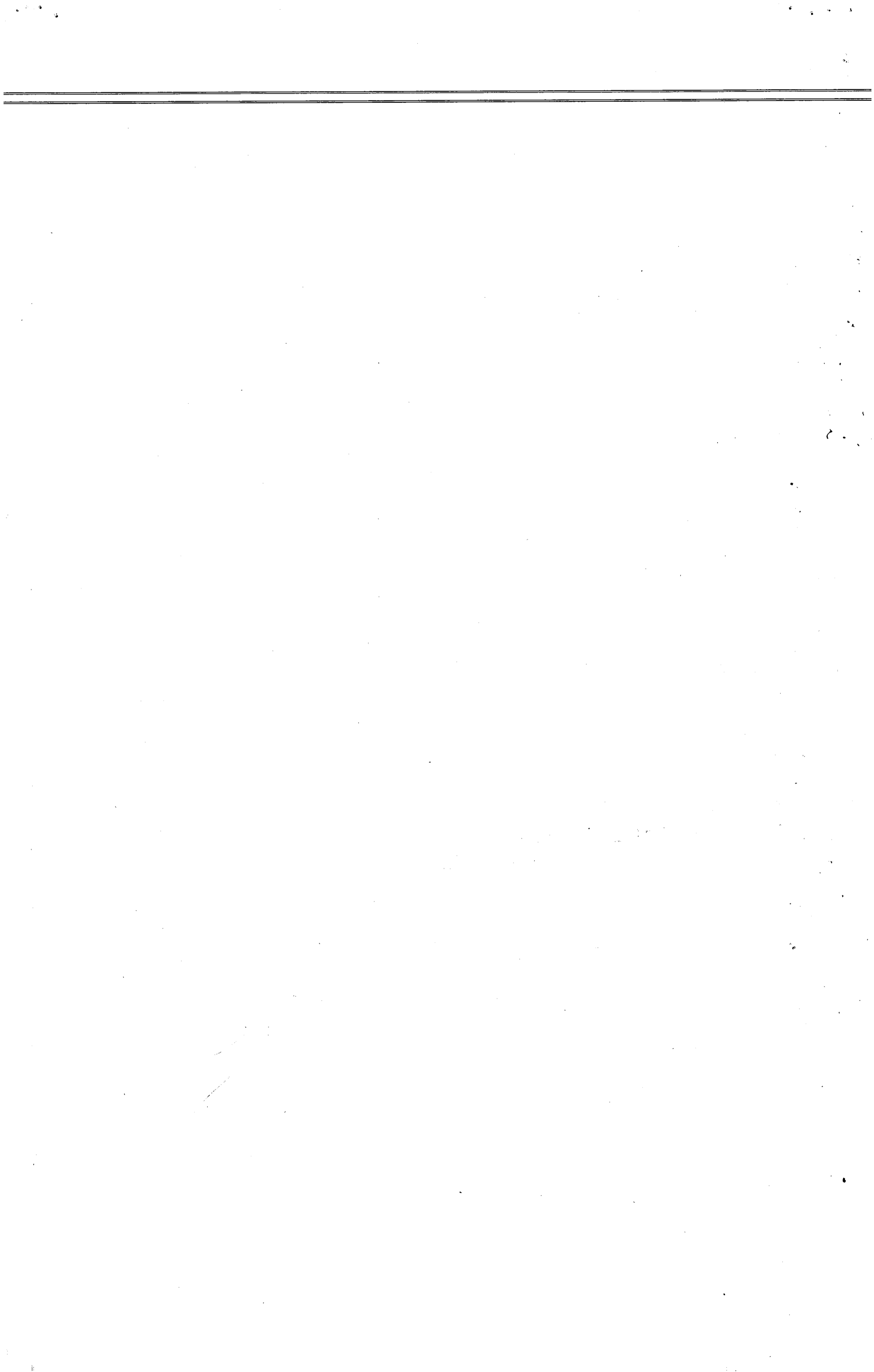
