The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular session at 9:00 o'clock A.M. with all members present: Charvat, Holter and Novak; and County Auditor. Albert J. Soukup, commissioner elect from the first district also being present.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, and unanimously carried, the Application of Louis Votava, for Abatement of \$2. Road Poll for the year of 1942 in the City of Wagner, was allowed for the reason the he was a member of the Wagner Voluntary Fire Department at the time of assessment, and was not required to pay Poll Tax as such.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, and unanimously carried, the following wage scale was adopted by Charles Mix County, South Dakota, for the fiscal year of 1943:

The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular session at 9:00 o'clock A. M. with all members present: Holter, Novak and Soukup; and County Auditor.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was adopted by the Board:

"WHEREAS, the County of Charles Mix, State of South Dakota, has been expending a tremendous amount as Direct Relief to County Poor of the county, and, WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners to reduce this expenditure as much as possible, and WHEREAS, it appears that there is a great shortage of labor, and that it is the patriotic duty of every ablebodied man or woman, as well as every citizen, whether old or young, to do all that they may be able to do in order to relieve as much as possible the great shortage of labor, and, WHEREAS, it appears to the said Board that it is possible for every able bodied person to find some remunerative employment and support themselves. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, from and after the first day of February, 1943, any person seeking aid from Charles Mix County shall fill out an "Application for Poor Relief", which shall be fully and completely filled out by the applicant, and signed in the presence of Two witnesses. Said Application shall also be signed, and the facts therein, duly verified by Three residents, freeholders, and taxpayers of Charles Mix County."

Upon motion duly made and seconded the County Auditor was instructed to notify all parties who have delinquent Permanent School Fund Loans with Charles Mix County of such delinquencies, showing amount of Principal, Interest and Taxes delinquent as of January 1st, 1943; and to notify such delinquents that such loans must be immediately paid off, renewed, extended or re-financed; and that if such action is not immediately taken by such borrowers, it will be necessary for the county to institute foreclosure proceedings.

The Goose Lake Township Civil Board of Supervisors met with the County Commissioners in regard to township road work for the coming season. No definite action was taken by the Board.

Mayor, Chas. Stedronsky, Jr., of Lake Andes, S.D., and Attorney M.E. Miller met with the Board in regard to delinquent real estate taxes in the City of Lake Andes, and it was decided that the County Treasurer would submit to Mayor Stedronsky a list of properties upon which Tax Deeds could be taken, or proceedings started.

On motion the Board adjourned at 5:00 o'clock P. M. to meet again in regular adjourned session on Wednesday, February 3rd, 1943, at 9:00 o'clock P. M.

Wednesday, August 4, 1943

The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular adjourned session at 9:00 o'clock A.M. with all members present: Holter, Novak and Soukup; and County Auditor.

August 4th, 1943.

The Board of County Commissioners appraised Lot 11, of Block 13, Platte, S.D., at \$500.00, and signed a Resolution Directing Sale of said premises, which were acquired by the county under Tax Deed proceedings, and the County Auditor signed the Notice of Sale.

The Board of County Commissioners appraised Lot 12, of Block 48, Milwaukee Land Co's. 4th Add. to Platte, at \$250; and signed a Resolution Directing Sale of said premises, which were acquired by the county under Tax Deed proceedings; and the County Auditor signed the Notice of Sale.

The County Auditor reported the sale of Lot 6, of Block 20, in City of Lake Andes, on July 23, 1943, to Charles Stedronsky, Jr., for \$125. cash; and the Board of County Commissioners signed a Resolution Approving said sale.

The County Auditor reported the sale of Lot 10, of Block 22, in City of Platte, on July 23, 1943, to Herman Ahrenholtz for \$200. cash; and the Board of County Commissioners signed a Resolution Approving said sale.

The County Auditor reported the sale of The North 50 feet of the SE 1/4 of Block 8, Steinbrenners Addition to Town ~~MM~~ now city of Platte, on July 23rd, 1943, to Allen L. Kimball for \$25. cash; and the Board of County Commissioners signed a Resolution Approving said sale.

The County Auditor reported the sale of Lots 9 & 10, of Block 8, Milwaukee Land ~~MM~~ Co's. First Addition to Wagner, on July 23, 1943, to Chas. R. Trantine for \$50. cash; and the Board of County Commissioners signed a Resolution Approving said sale.

The County Auditor reported the sale of Lots 916 & 920, of Sec. 35-94-62, on July 30th, 1943, to Fred J. Muller, of Tyndall, S.D. for \$560; \$112. payable in cash, & balance payable in 5 annual payments of \$89.60 each, drawing 5% interest; and the Board of County Commissioners signed a Resolution Approving said sale.

The County Auditor reported the sale of Lots 7 & 8, of Block 10, in the Town of Ravinia, on July 30th, 1943, to Victor Sorenson, for \$250., and the Board of County Commissioners signed a Resolution Approving said sale.

F.J.Lindskog, personal property tax collector, met with the Board, and the following Contract was entered into: "Contract. This contract made ~~MM~~ and entered into this 4th day of August, 1943 by and between the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, party of the first part, and F.J.Lindskog, of Geddes, South Dakota, party of the second part, witnesseth. That the party of the first part in pursuance of a resolution heretofore passed and bond given has appointed the party of the second part tax collector of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and it is desired that said contract of employment be reduced to writing: Therefore, the party of the first part does hereby employ the party of the second part as collector of personal property taxes by virtue of the authority conferred by Chapter 340 Session Laws of 1941, such services to be performed in accordance with said law which is hereby made a part of this contract of employment. It is further agreed that in the performance of the duties of said office the party of the second part shall waive the collection of the \$1.00 fee to which the Sheriff would be entitled to collect from the tax debtor. It is further agreed that the compensation to be paid second party shall be 10 per cent of the amount collected by him with the exception of the personal taxes assessed for the year 1942 for which no compensation shall be allowed, it being agreed that the compensation of 10 per cent for taxes assessed in prior years being adequate without charge for collection of 1942 taxes. -Lake Andes, S. Emil Wolff appeared before the Board in regard to the cancellation of two Contracts for purchase of County Tax Deed property which are in default and he having been served with notice of cancellation of such contracts. Upon motion duly made and seconded 60 days extension of time was granted in which the terms of the contracts must be complied with or the contracts will be cancelled.

Wm. Evers, and son, Burton Evers, of Wagner, appeared before the Board in regard to payment of personal taxes of the former. No action was taken by the Board.

Jonas Paulson, with his attorney, M.E. Miller, appeared before the Board in regard to the closing of a certain section line highway in Castalia township. No action was taken, awaiting the entering into of a contract between Jonas Paulson and the State Department of Fish & Game for a temporary right-of-way through his land.

Upon motion duly made and seconded Albert Amundson was granted an Abatement in the amount of \$375. on the 1933, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1937 and 1938 real estate taxes on a 14 acre tract of land in the SE corner of the SE 1/4 of SE 1/4 of Sec. 4-96-65, in the City of Lake Andes, for the reason that said property was occupied and used during said years by representatives of the City of Lake Andes, the County of Charles Mix, the State Game and Fish Commission, and the Federal Government of the United States, in work pertaining to an improvement of Lake Andes, pursuant to Subdivision 1 of Chapter 57.0802 of SDC on abatement of taxes, and said Application for Abatement of taxes having been first approved by the City Council of the City of Lake Andes, with the provision that all delinquent real estate taxes on said premises be paid in full on or before September 30th, 1943.

The Board of County Commissioners appraised the N $\frac{1}{2}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ ; the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  & the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 3-93-63, being real estate acquired by Charles Mix County under foreclosure of a Permanent School Fund Mortgage, at \$2,800; and signed a Resolution Directing Sale of said land; and the County Auditor signed the Notice of Sale.

Peter Olson met with the Board in regard to payment of delinquent taxes on real estate in La Roche township.

John Beck appeared before the Board in regard to acquiring a right-of-way to an isolated tract of land owned by him in Choteau Creek township. The matter was tabled for investigation.

M.E. Miller, Atty. for the Town of Ravinia, met with the Board in regard to a compromise settlement of the bonded debt of said town, and the Town of Ravinia having on July 14th, 1943, confessed judgments in the Circuit Court of Charles Mix County in the sum of \$9,562.50 in favor of Charles Mix County, and in the sum of \$14,354.34 in favor of E.H. Sexauer, of Brookings, S.D., on their total bonded debt, an Agreement was entered into by and between all of said parties for a settlement of said judgments by the issue of \$10,500. in new bonds, in denominations of \$250. each, payable serially in 20 years, and drawing 2% interest. Each judgment holder to receive its proportionate share of said \$10,500. in bonds, and the excess of each of said judgments, above the face or par value of the bonds of the previous issue, (being \$7,500. for the county, and \$13,500. for Sexauer) will be paid to the county and E.H. Sexauer, respectively, in cash by the Town of Ravinia. Said Judgments to remain in full force and effect until payment of all new bonds and interest in full, together with such excess amounts, as shown by Agreement on file in the office of the Clerk of Courts of Charles Mix County, South Dakota.

"RESOLUTION-Whereas, Charles Mix County failed to provide in its Budget for the year 1943 sufficient funds to discharge its obligations; and Whereas, due to the fact that Supplemental Budgets were made in 1942 and were on January 1st, 1943, taken out of the 1943 budgeted amounts for the various funds, and which Supplemental Budgets were made after the adoption of the 1943 Budget, and therefore there is a shortage in such funds which could not have been anticipated at the time of adoption of the 1943 Budget. Those funds having been so supplemented are as follows: Tree Bounty \$554. on 9-15-42; Clerk of Courts office expense \$100. 8-19-42; County Treasurer office expense \$250. 11-20-42; Expense on County Property Foreclosed \$1500. on 8-19-42, and \$500. on 11-20-42; and WHEREAS, it now appears that there are insufficient funds in such budget funds to pay the necessary claims which will be filed and to be paid out of the 1943 budget during the balance of the year of 1943; and Whereas, it is the lawful duty of the county to discharge its obligations, and the Board of County Commissioners deem it necessary, because of such budget shortages, to adopt a Supplemental Budget; Therefore

be it Resolved, that Notice of Intention to make and adopt a Supplemental Budget as provided by law, stating the purpose, object and item and amount appropriated for each item, stating the ~~month~~ time and place when said Supplemental Budget will be considered by the Board of County Commissioners before being finally adopted, be given by posting a true copy of said proposed supplemental budget on the bulletin board at the north front entrance to the court house in the City of Lake Andes, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, at least ten days prior to the date set for the hearing thereof. Albert J. Soukup moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution, and it was seconded by Joseph Novak, and, upon roll call, all members voted "aye". It is therefore resolved that said proposed Supplemental Budget, as originally noticed, with the appropriations therein contained, be and the same is hereby adopted as the Supplemental Budget of Charles Mix County, South Dakota.
