These Abatements having been approved pursuant to Chapter 288 of the 1943 Session Laws of the State of South Dakota.

John Giedd appeared before the Board in regard to the abatement of taxes on real estate purchased by him from Charles Mix County, being property acquired by the county through foreclosure of a Permanent School Fund Mortgage, such taxes having been abated above.

N.D. Smith appeared before the Board in regard to obtaining a Permanent School Fund Loan on real estate owned by him, and land to be purchased by him.

A.G. McBride, Social Security Director for Charles Mix County, met with the Board in regard to relief matters.

W.H. Frei met with the Board of County Commissioners in regard to a compromise settlement of his Permanent School Fund Loan, and filed a written Offer to Compromise said loan, and the following resolution was adopted by the Board: "RESOLUTION APPROVING COMPROMISE SETTLEMENT OF PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND LOAN. WHEREAS, the State of South Dakota, care of County Treasurer, of Lake Andes, South Dakota, is the owner and holder of a Real Estate Mortgage of \$4,000.00, dated June 6th, 1930, and covering Lots 4 and 197 and the SW 1/4 of SE 1/4 of Section 14, in Township 94 North, of Range 64, West of the 5th P.M., containing 100 acres, given by W.H. Frei & wife, and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, on June 9th, 1930, at 9 o'clock A.M. in Book 56 of Mortgages, on Page 559; and WHEREAS, the said Mortgage is delinquent as to payment of a balance ~~due~~ due on the said \$4,000. principal of \$3,500, the sum of \$250. having been paid on the principal on February 9th, 1942, and the sum of \$250. having been paid on the principal on April 9th, 1943; and WHEREAS, the said Mortgage is delinquent as to the payment of the interest on said loan in the sum of \$2,058.65; and WHEREAS, the said W.H. Frei is desirous of making final and complete settlement of said loan in full by a compromise settlement pursuant to Chapter 12.1916 of the State of South Dakota Code of 1939, and he having met with the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, on January 4th, 1944, in regard to a Compromise Settlement of said loan, and he having signed an Offer to Make Compromise Settlement of Permanent School Fund Loan in the sum of \$3,500.00 in complete settlement of the principal and interest due on said mortgage; and WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, have viewed, inspected and appraised said land at \$3,500; and WHEREAS, the total amount due on said mortgage for principal and interest is greater than the value of the real estate securing said mortgage, and it is impossible to collect the full amount of said mortgage indebtedness by foreclosure of said mortgage, or otherwise, and in the opinion of the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, it would be to the advantage and best interests of said county to

compromise said mortgage. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, that the above entitled School Fund Mortgage or Loan be and the same is hereby compromised for the sum of \$3,500.00 in cash, which compromise shall be in full satisfaction of the said balance of principal due of \$3,500., and \$2,058.65 interest due and delinquent on said mortgage, and upon payment of the said sum of \$3,500.00 cash by the said W.H.Frei the said mortgage will be released. Dated at Lake Andes, South Dakota, this 4th day of January, 1944. Albert J. Soukup offered the above resolution, which was seconded by Joseph Novak, and, upon roll call, all members voted "aye". Edward O. Holter, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, Charles Mix County, South Dakota. Attest: F.E.Nedved, County Auditor. (seal)."

Passed July 7th, 1944. Joseph Novak, Chairman of Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, Attest: F.E. Nedved, County Auditor. (seal)".

Rudolph Gleich, of Geddes, S.D., appeared before the County Board of Equalization in regard to the 1944 assessed valuation of All of Block 7, in the Town of Ravinia, S.D., being property owned by his wife, Anna Gleich. It appears from the Assessor's Book that the Assessor placed a valuation of \$125. on the residence, and \$200. on the real estate, or a total of \$325. The town equalization board then raised the valuation of the residence to \$250., and left the real estate at \$200., making a total of \$450. All of Block 7, in the town of Ravinia, contains 7,307.88 square feet, or ~~M~~ 307.88 square feet more than one resident lot 50x140 feet or 7,000. square feet, in the town of Ravinia. It appears from the Assessor's book that the assessor had been valuing residence lots at \$35. & \$40. each. Therefore, the County Board of Equalization reduced the value of the real estate to \$40., from \$200. The Board and Mr. Gleich all agreed that the value of the residence, as compared to other residences, was low, and therefore the value of the residence was raised from \$250. to \$350., making a total valuation of \$390., as equalized by the County Board of Equalization.

A representative group of land owners of Choteau Creek township met with the County Board of Equalization in regard to the average assessed valuation per acre of the real estate in their township, and the matter was thoroughly discussed at length. It appears from the various assessors' books for that township that the average assessed valuation of the real estate without structures for the past four years as assessed by the assessor, and certified by the Township Equalization Boards, were as follows: 1940 \$27.91; 1941 \$27.73; 1942 \$27.70, and 1943 \$27.78, and that these figures were not changed by the Township Equalization Board, the County Equalization Board, or the State Equalization Board. The assessor for 1944 assessed such real estate at an average of \$25.41 per acre, and the Township Equalization Board certified such averages without change. The ~~MMM~~ tax payers of Choteau Creek township feel that their average assessed valuation has been high in comparison to adjoining townships, and asked that some adjustments be made. The County Board of Equalization agreed that some adjustment was necessary, but that \$25.41 per acre was entirely too low in comparison to other townships in the county, and therefore this average was fixed at \$26.91 per acre by the County Board of Equalization, and other adjustments were made in other townships surrounding said Choteau Creek township, as shown by the published result of the said County Equalization Board.

A representative group of ~~MM~~ residents of Geddes, and vicinity, met ~~MMMMMM~~ with the Board of County Commissioners in regard to the condition of the roads leading into the City of Geddes, and requested that some much needed repair be made to bridges, culverts and roads, and that some graveled roads be resurfaced, and that such roads be more thoroughly maintained. The matter was thoroughly discussed, and many suggestions were advanced, and the Board of County Commissioners all feel that many of the roads in the County are very much in need of repair and more maintainance, and an attempt will be made to replace some of the bridges or culverts, and to build up some of the grades and re-gravel the worst places. However the Board is of the opinion that with the shortage of help and equipment at this time it is practically impossible to do any extensive road building or resurfacing.

The Board spent the remainder of the day as the County Board of Equalization.

The second petition recites: In order to provide educational facilities for children now of school age and who otherwise may be deprived of the benefits of education, the undersigned, constituting a majority of the voters and also free holders of Wahehe School District No. 4 of Charles Mix County, do respectfully petition that you declare a consolidation of Wahehe School Districts No. 3 and 4 into one district, such consolidation to leave present debts unaffected and not to be assumed by the new district, all in accordance with Sec. 15.2304 SDC 1939. (Signed by 15 petitioners). On August 1st, 1944, the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, while in regular session as such Board, called in the County Superintendent of Schools for consultation in regard to this matter of consolidation, and the matter was thoroughly discussed, the States Attorney being also present, and the matter was tabled for further investigation. Now, on August 4th, 1944, the matter was again taken up, the present School Board of said District No. 4 being present, and it was found and determined by the Board of County Commissioners that such petitions were signed by sufficient voters and free holders of such districts; and the following Consolidation of School Districts was approved by the Board, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried.
