

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Lake Andes, South Dakota,
Tuesday, January 2nd, 1945.

The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular session at nine o'clock A. M. with all members present: Novak, Holter and Soukup; and County Auditor.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, and, upon motion duly made and seconded, the same were approved.

Melcher, County Judge, \$1,000; Chas. Stedronsky, Jr., County Coroner, \$500; Frank B. Morgan, States Attorney, \$1,000; Joseph W. Bouza, Clerk of Courts, \$1,000; Nita Evans Breen, County Treasurer, \$35,000; Vivian Jones Lutz, Deputy County Treasurer, \$2,500; Frank Jerman, Justice of the Peace, \$500; Loretto C. Conway, County Auditor, \$2,000; Joe E. Smejkal, Clerk of Ree School Dist. No. 6, \$500.

The County Auditor reported that on December 8th, 1944, he sold at public auction at the front door of the court house in the City of Lake Andes, South Dakota, at two o'clock P.M., the Lots 1023, 1024, 1025, 1032, 1033, 1034, 1047, 1048, 1049, 1056, 1057 and 1058, in Township 93, Range 62, according to the survey of the Yankton Indian Reservation, being real estate acquired by the county through foreclosure of a Permanent School Fund Loan, to Albert F. Soukup, for \$5,000: \$1,000. cash, and \$4,000. when sale is approved; and the Board of County Commissioners signed a Resolution Approving such sale.

The County Auditor reported that on December 22nd, 1944, at two o'clock P.M. he sold at public auction at the front door of the court house in the City of Lake Andes, South Dakota, the following real estate which had been acquired by the county through Tax Deed proceedings:

And the Board of County Commissioners signed Resolutions Approving such sales.

The County Auditor also reported that on December 22nd, 1944, at two o'clock P.M. he offered for sale at public auction at the front door of the court house in the City of Lake Andes, South Dakota, the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Block 6, in Steinbrenner's Second Addition to South Platte, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, being property acquired by the county through Tax Deed proceedings, and appraised at \$700., and that such property was not sold for the reason that no bids were received, and that at the same time and place he offered the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Block 6, in Steinbrenner's Second Addition to South Platte, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, being property acquired by the county through Tax Deed proceedings, and appraised at \$800., for sale at public auction, and that such property was not sold for the reason that no bids were received.

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The Board of County Commissioners appraised the $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec.10-97-64, being real estate acquired by the county through Warranty Deed given in settlement of a Permanent School Fund Loan, at \$2,400; and signed a Resolution Directing Sale of said land; and the County Auditor signed the Notice of Sale.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the Application for Abatement of the following real estate taxes by W.A.Prather was approved: Residence in SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.24-100-70, 1943 valuation of residence \$387; Real Estate \$20; Total \$407; Total tax \$3.79; Tax on residence only was \$3.60, and this amount was abated for the reason that the residence on such real estate was sold and removed from the premises in February of 1943, and therefore it should not have been assessed with said real estate, leaving a tax of 19 cents on the real estate.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the Application for Abatement by the Northwestern Public Service Company for abatement of the following taxes was approved for the reason that such property was also assessed with said company's Public Utilities taxes through the State of South Dakota Division of Taxation at Pierre, South Dakota, and such Division having approved the Application for Abatement: 1942-Lots 1,2,3,4, Ex. W. 150 ft, Blk.52, Platte,S.D., \$4.63; 1943-\$4.80; 1944-\$4.70; Sub.Station 40x40ft. in SE part of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.13-99-68: 1942-\$1.49; 1943-\$2.23; 1944-\$2.35.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the Application of Adam Greger, of Wagner, South Dakota, for Poor Relief, was approved, and the County Auditor was instructed to place the name of the applicant in the County Poor Book.

Atty. M. E. Miller appeared before the Board as representative of Mary Hauzer and presented his check in the sum of \$10., and requested that the Board accept said sum in partial satisfaction of County Liens filed against said Mary Hauzer, and asked that the Board pass a Resolution releasing the said Mary Hauzer's Undivided 1/2 interest in Lot 3 & NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ & N $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. ~~26-97-68~~ 26-97-68 from all County Poor Liens of the said Mary Hauzer upon payment of the said sum of \$10. to the County. Upon motion made by Edward O. Holter and seconded by Albert J. Soukup a Resolution was passed and signed releasing said land from the ~~MMMM~~ lien and operation of the County Liens filed against Mary Hauzer upon payment of such sum of \$10., the balance of said County Liens to remain as a lien against the $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ & E $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.26-97-68, and the residence property of the said Mary Hauzer in the City of Lake Andes, now of record in her name.

Louis Meis, Sheriff, met with the Board in regard to the taking over the duties of the office of Sheriff of Charles Mix County.

Emil Wolff met with the Board in regard to settlement of some delinquent personal property taxes.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the Board approved the Application of Linford Engel for Abatement of his 1943 personal tax in the City of Wagner of \$4.82, for the reason that he had been previously assessed in 1943 in Bryan Township.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the Board approved the Application of F.E. Upon motion duly made and seconded the Bond of Mrs. Emma Rhein, as Clerk of Ravinia Consolidated School District, in the sum of \$500. was approved.

The Board of County Commissioners appraised Lots 1 & 2, of Block 11, of B.W. LaShier's Addition to Wagner, being real estate acquired by the county through Quit Claim Deed in settlement of taxes on said premises, at \$75; and signed a Resolution Directing Sale of said premises; and the County Auditor signed the Notice of Sale.

G.H.Gilbertson, of Sioux Falls, S.D., having submitted his check in the sum of \$1,513.26 in full settlement of the real estate taxes against the NW 1/4 of Block 8, in Steinbrenner's Third Addition to Platte, South Dakota, formerly owned by John Mortenson, now deceased, and the title to said premises having been acquired by the county through Tax Deed proceedings, and the said G.H.Gilbertson having also submitted his check in the sum of \$10. and requesting that the personal taxes of Alpha Mortenson be released as a lien upon said premises upon such payment of \$10., the following Resolution was passed by the Board: "Resolution. Whereas, the County heretofore acquired title by tax deed proceedings to the Northwest quarter of Block 8 Steinbrenner's Third Addition to Platte, South Dakota, from the former owner, to wit, John Mertenson, now deceased, and, Whereas, Alpha Mortenson, devisee under the Will of the said John Mortenson, deceased, has tendered to the County the sum of \$1,513.26 for the restoration of the title as provided for by Chapter 292 Laws 1943 which is sufficient to cover the principal and interest of taxes to date and, Whereas, it appears to the Board of County Commissioners that such amount represents the actual value of said premises and is sufficient in amount to meet the requirements of Chapter 292 of the Laws of 1943: Therefore be it resolved that the County accepts such sum and reconvey said property to the said Alpha Mortenson and the County Treasurer and Auditor of the County are authorized and directed to execute a quit claim deed in the form and to the affect as provided by said law. Be it further resolved that certain taxes heretofore assessed against the said Alpha Mortenson were in fact cancelled as a lien on said property by the tax deed proceedings and said premises being the homestead of the said Alpha Mortenson and not subject to the lien of personal taxes therefore be it resolved that in consideration of the payment of \$10.00, that said personal taxes assessed against the said Alpha Mortenson, and also poor relief liens against her, be abated in so far but in so far ~~MINIMUM~~ only as said taxes and poor relief liens might appear to be a lien on said premises. Upon motion duly made and seconded the monthly salaries of Deputies in the county offices were raised to \$115. per month.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the amount to be paid for funerals for County Poor was raised from \$60. to \$75.

Frank J. Kozak, Deputy Sheriff, met with the Board for consultation in regard to law enforcement and investigations.

The Legislature of the State of South Dakota at the 1945 session having passed two laws, with emergency clauses attached, requiring the county to expend monies where no budget has been provided for the fiscal year of 1945: Senate Bill No. 230 is entitled: "An Act to allow a portion of the additional expenses of certain elective county officers, Whereas the present scale of Salaries for said officers is not sufficient under the existing increased expenses of living; and declaring an Emergency. This Act shall be effective immediately and remain in full force and effect only to and until July 1, 1947." This law requires the Board of County Commissioners to pay to the County Treasurer, County Auditor, County Superintendent of Schools, County Register of Deeds, the States Attorney, County Judge, and County Clerk of Courts, the sum of \$300. per annum, payable monthly, and the law will require a Supplemental Budget of \$1,738.73 for the period from March 3rd, 1945, to December 31st, 1945. Senate Bill No. 20 is entitled: "An Act relating to the employment of a Veterans Service Officer by counties, and Declaring an Emergency." This law authorizes and empowers the Board of County Commissioners to employ a County Veterans Service Officer, and pay the salary and office expense, etc. of such officer, and will require the expenditure of an undetermined amount of money for the balance of the year of 1945, but the Board is of the opinion that ~~MEMBERSHIP IN THE BOARD~~ a Supplemental Budget of \$1,000. should be supplied to pay the salary and office expense of such Service Officer for the remainder of the year. Edward O. Holter moved the adoption of a Resolution for Adoption of a Supplemental Budget for the above amounts and items, and it was seconded by Joseph Novak, and, upon roll call, all members voted "aye". Supplemental Budget for adoption shows: PURPOSE: General Fund: County Officers' Expense Allowance, amount of Budget \$1,738.73, and such amount to be raised by tax; Salary and Expense of County Service Officer, amount of Budget \$1,000.00, and such amount to be raised by tax, a total Supplemental Budget of \$2,738.73. Notice of Hearing on Such Supplemental Budget fixes time and place of hearing as follows: At the office of the Board of County

Commissioners at the Court House in the City of Lake Andes, in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, on May 1st, 1945, at two o'clock P.M., and notice of such hearing to be ~~given~~ given by posting a copy of said proposed Supplemental Budget on the bulletin board at the north front entrance to the court house in the City of Lake Andes, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, at least ten days prior to the date set for such hearing. Such Resolution for Adoption of a Supplemental Budget, and Notice of Hearing on Supplemental Budget for the Fiscal Year of 1945, are both dated April 5th, 1945, and signed by A.J.Soukup, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and Attested by L.C.Conway, County Auditor, with Seals affixed.



The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular adjourned session at nine o'clock A.M. with all members present: Soukup, Novak and Holter; and County Auditor.

August 14th, 1945

Atty.R.K.Janda, of Wagner,S.D., met with the Board of County Commissioners, requesting a compromise settlement of County Poor Liens and personal taxes of Emma and Ed. Fechner, and the partial release of such liens and taxes as to a residence property in Wagner. No action was taken by the Board in the matter, and no written application was filed.

Representatives of the Gustaffson Construction Co., of Sioux Falls, met with the Board of County Commissioners in regard to doing some road work in the county, and particularly as to the filling in of some washed out grades on county roads in Moore township. These representatives, together with all three members of the Board of County Commissioners, made a trip to Moore township for the purpose of inspecting three washed out grades in two miles of county road. As these two miles have been entirely closed to traffic for several years, and as the county scrapers are to small for moving such a large amount of dirt to advantage, it was decided that such Construction Co. would commence work on the filling of the two east grades the fore part of September, and that easements for borrow pits would be obtained before that time.

As noticed, at two o'clock P.M., the hearing on the division of Wahehe School Districts numbered 2 and 3-4 was taken up. The only appearances made at this hearing on the part of such school districts was by Wm. Greiff and Frank Cermak, both from Wahehe School District 3-4. Margaret B. Sprick, County Superintendent of Schools, was also in attendance at the hearing. The matter of taking all of Sections 5 and 8, in Twp. 94, Range 64, out of School District No. 3-4, and placing them in School District No. 2, was thoroughly discussed. After a search of the 1944 Assessor's Book, and the 1944 Recapitulation sheet of the county, it was found that the transfer of such sections would result in the taking a valuation of \$16,783., according to the 1944 Assessor's Book, out of School District No. 3-4, and placing it in School District No. 2. Also that \$36. of the \$38. school polls of School District No.3 would go to School District No. 2. The Board found that, owing to the present financial condition of School District No. 3-4, that such division should not be made, and therefore the petition was rejected. The Board suggested that the School Board of School District No. 3-4 make arrangements with Wahehe School District No. 2 for three school children in Dist. No.3-4 to attend school in Wahehe No. 2.

Monday, August 6th, 1945, being the last day for filing Applications for Tree Bounty for the year of 1945, the Board proceeded to examine the applications on file, and each commissioner took the applications from his district for invistiagtion of the trees and the cultivation thereof.
