The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular session at nine o'clock A. M. with all members present: Soukup, Novak and Holter; and County Auditor.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, and, upon motion being duly made and seconded, the same were approved.

The County Auditor reported the following sales of County Tax Deed Property, and the Board of County Commissioners passed and signed Resolutions Approving such sales: On December 14th, 1945, she sold at public auction Lot 8, of Block 41, Milwaukee Land Company's Third Addition to Platte, S.D., to Albert Boetker, for \$25. cash; On December 14th, 1945, she sold at public auction Lot 13, of Block 26, in Milwaukee Land Company's First Addition to Platte, S.D., to W. A. League, for \$50. cash; On December 21st, 1945, she sold at public auction Lot 3, of Block 15, in the City of Geddes, S.D., to Ernest Beck, for \$260. cash; On December 21st, 1945, she sold at public auction Lot 3, of Block 14, in the City of Geddes, S.D., to Virginia Minahan, of Sioux Falls, S.D., for \$154: \$100. paid, and \$54. payable in 12 monthly payments of \$4.50 each, with 5% interest.

The County Auditor reported that on December 28th, 1945, at 2 o'clock P.M., she sold at public auction at the front door of the court house in the City of Lake Andes, S.D., a tract of land in the SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Sec. 24-99-68, described by metes and bounds as follows: Beginning at a point 33 feet East and 120 feet South of the Northwest corner of the SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Sec. 24-99-68; thence running East 1419 feet; thence South 500 feet; ~~thence West 600 feet~~ thence West ~~600 feet~~ 600 feet; thence North 250 feet; thence West 819 feet; thence North 250 feet, to the place of beginning, to Abe Jekel and H. T. Ringling for the sum of \$5,000: \$1,666.66 paid, and \$3,333.34 payable in three annual payments of \$1,111.11 each on Jan. 1st each year, with 5% interest, and the Board of County Commissioners passed and signed a Resolution Approving such sale.

The County Auditor reported that the following described properties which were acquired by the County through Tax Deed proceedings were not sold at the front door of the court house in Lake Andes, S.D., on December 21st, 1945, at 2 o'clock P.M., as advertised: The East 103 feet of Lots 16, 17 & 18, of Block 16, in Platte, S.D., for the reason that the record owner, Arthur Everson, had paid up all the taxes against said premises and has made full redemption of said premises; and the S<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> of the West 37 feet of Lot 16, in Block 16, in Platte, S.D., for the reason that said premises had not been appraised separately, and had not been advertised to be sold separately.

Application having been made and filed by Arthur Everson requesting a Re-conveyance of The East 103 feet of Lots 16, 17 & 18, of Block 16, in Platte, S.D., the following Resolution was passed and adopted by the Board: "RESOLUTION. Whereas, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, holds tax title to Lots 16, 17 & 18, of Block 16, in Platte, S.D.; and Whereas, Arthur Everson, the record owner of such real property, has requested a re-conveyance of said property by Quit Claim Deed, pursuant to SDC 57.1125, as amended by Chapter 292 of the 1943 Session Laws of the State of South Dakota, and has offered as consideration for such re-conveyance the sum of \$541.79, being the total amount of principal, interest and costs of all taxes represented in

the Tax Deed, as well as all other and subsequent taxes on said land, up to the year of 1945, and interest thereon, and all other costs in connection with said premises expended by Charles Mix County in relation thereto, and Whereas, it conclusively appears to the said Board of County Commissioners that such offer is just and fair, and that the amount aforesaid is equal to the full value of said real property, and that the best interests of the said County will be served by the acceptance of such offer. Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Treasurer and Auditor of said Charles Mix County, South Dakota, be, and they are hereby authorized to execute a Quit Claim Deed to the said Arthur Everson for the real property herein described, and to deliver such Quit Claim Deed to the said Arthur Everson upon payment by him of the said sum of \$541.79 and upon the expiration of the period allowed by law for an appeal from this resolution. Dated at Lake Andes, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, this 2nd day of January, A.D. 1946. The adoption of the foregoing Resolution was moved by Edward O. Holter, and seconded by Joseph Novak, and, upon roll call, all members voted "aye". Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, By A. J. Soukup, Chairman. Attest: L.C. A committee from the Chamber of Commerce of the City of Wagner met with the Board in regard to road improvement in the Wagner vicinity, and road matters were thoroughly discussed, and the Board informed the committee that post war road work would be commenced throughout the county in the spring, and just as soon as weather conditions would permit, and machinery and labor could be obtained.

On motion the Board adjourned at five o'clock P. M. to meet again in regular adjourned session at nine o'clock A. M. on Thursday, January 3rd, 1946.

Venzel Warejcka and Louis Warejcka, Sr., of Bovee, S.D., and E. C. Green, ~~James Leddy and Wm. G. Leddy~~, of Armour, S.D., met with the Board of County Commissioners, and filed and presented a petition signed by 199 citizens and patrons of Signal, Rhoda and Moore townships in Charles Mix County, S.D., requesting the Board of County Commissioners of Charles Mix County to improve and gravel that 15½ miles of county road described as follows: Commencing at the section corner common to Sections 1, 2, 11 and 12-98-68, in Signal township, and running in an easterly direction 15½ miles to the Douglas county line, through Rhoda and Moore townships, and one mile of Signal township. 




It was, therefore, decided to commence graveling in District No. 1, where a screen loader could be operated.


