The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular session at 9:00 o'clock A.M., with all members present: Soukup, Novak and Holter; and County Auditor. Commissioner elect, Nielsen, was also in attendance.

The County Auditor reported that on September 27th, 1946, at 2:00 o'clock P.M., at the front door of the Court House in the City of Lake Andes, Charles Mix County, South Dakota, at public auction Lots 10 & 11, of Block 34, Harding's 2nd Add. to Lake Andes, S.D., being real estate acquired by the county through Quit Claim Deed given in settlement of real estate taxes, and appraised at \$100. per lot, and that at such sale no bids were received, but that on December 26th, 1946, Robert A. Blankenfeld and Emma H. Blankenfeld, of Niobrara, Nebr., offered the sum of \$200. for said lots, which was the appraised price, pursuant to Chapter 34 of the 1943 Session Laws of the State of South Dakota; and the Board of County Commissioners passed and signed a resolution approving the sale of said lots to said purchasers for said sum and directing that a deed be executed and delivered to said purchasers, said purchase price having been paid in full.

Ernest J. Melmer appeared before the Board and filed an application signed by Martha Melmer, asking for a partial release of county liens filed against her, as to the S 1/2 of Lots 7, 8 and 9, in Block 20, in the City of Lake Andes, S.D., and offering to pay the sum of \$25. for such partial release, and a check for such amount being attached to such application; and said Ernest J. Melmer having offered to pay in full the county liens filed against Mrs. Rose Melmer, for Freddie Melmer, in the sum of \$103.25; the Board of County Commissioners passed and signed a Resolution approving such settlement, and a partial release as requested was duly executed, and Ernest J. Melmer having paid said sum of \$103.25, a full release of said liens against Mrs. Rose Melmer was duly executed.

L.H. Beemer, City Auditor, of the City of Lake Andes, S.D., met with the Board and stated that the City Council of the City of Lake Andes had requested that the Board of County Commissioners take some action to collect the delinquent real estate taxes on the East 2/3 of Lots 4, 5 & 6, of Block 37, in Harding's 1st Add. to Lake Andes, and assessed in the name of Alberta Wolf. The matter was referred to the States Attorney for action.

The Township Board of Rouse township met with the Board in regard to road work done by the county in said township for said township during the past year, and made full settlement with the county for such road work.

A representative of the Mid-Continental Paint & Sandblasting Service, of Sioux Falls, S.D., met with the Board in regard to some much needed repairs to the roof and outside walls of the court house, and the matter was discussed at length, and the said representative was requested to make up an estimate and specifications in writing and mail same to the Board for cleaning and waterproofing the outside walls and inside fire walls.

A. G. McBride, County Director of Social Security; and Nettie Sadler, of Geddes, S.D., met with the Board in regard to relief matters.

Upon motions duly made and seconded the following Bonds were approved: William Hron, Clerk, Choteau Creek School Dist. No. 6, \$500; G.S. Smith, Treasurer, Wagner Independent School Dist. \$7,500.

Several road machinery salesmen met with the Board in regard to selling road machinery to the county, and spent much time in explaining the advantages of their machinery to the Board. No definite action was taken by the Board at this time for the purchase of such machinery.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the claim of Frank Delire of \$21. for glasses prescribed for Cornelius Odefy was rejected.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the Board adjourned at 5:00 o'clock P. M., to meet again in regular adjourned session at 9:00 o'clock A. M. on Wednesday, January 8th, 1947.
