





And WHEREAS notice was given to said school districts, that the Co. Commissioners of Charles Mix Co., S. D. would together with the Supt. of Schools consider such proposed change on the the 4th day of January 1955 & no one having appeared in opposition to said proposed change, BE IT RESOLVED That the boundaries of said School District No. 1 to be as follows: all of Section 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 34, 35, & 36 all in 97-62; & Section 30, 29, 31 (except the S $\frac{1}{2}$ -SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 31), and 32 all in 97-61; & Lot 5 of Sec. 15-97-62. Varuska, are hereby approved. That Lylla Hamik, County Treasurer, having appointed Rose Donovan, Victor I. Hamik & Lois Wade as her deputies and Marlene Long as Clerk in said office, their appointments hereby approved. That Leona Mead, Register of Deeds having appointed Martha Melmer as her Deputy, her appointment is confirmed. That L. E. Schreyer, State's Att'y. having appointed Opal R. Curtin as Clerk & Stenographer in said office, her appointment is confirmed & her salary is fixed at \$135. per month. That Margaret B. Sprick, Co. Supt. of Schools having appointed Helen Benner as her deputy, her appointment is hereby approved and Delores Bouza having been appointed as clerk, her appointment was also approved.
