The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular adjourned session at 2:00 o'clock P. M. with all members present: Holter, Nielsen, Novak & Co. Auditor Conway.

WHEREAS, the Co. Commissioners of Charles Mix Co., S. D. have failed to provide in their annual budget for the year 1955 sufficient revenue to enable Charles Mix Co., S.D. to conduct the indispensable functions of government in the General Fund & the Special Salary Fund and WHEREAS, it is the lawful duty of the County to discharge its obligations and the Board of Co. Commissioners deem it necessary, on account of the enactment of such laws to adopt a supplemental budget pursuant to Chapter 33 of the 1945 Session Laws of the State of S. D., THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT NOTICE OF INTENTION to make and adopt a supplemental budget as provided by law stating the purpose, object, item and amount appropriated for each item & for the time & place when said supplemental budget will be considered by the Board of Co. Commissioners of Charles Mix Co., S. D. before being finally adopted, be given by posting a true copy of said proposed supplemental budget on the bulletin board at the North Front Entrance of the Court House, in the City of Lake Andes, Charles Mix County, S. D. at least 10 days prior to the date set for hearing thereon. The Board signed the Notice of Hearing on such Supplemental Budget fixing the time & place of hearing to be on the 3rd day of January 1956 at 10:00 o'clock A. M. at the office of the Board in the Court House in Lake Andes, S. D. Funds and amounts to be supplemented are as follows: General Fund--Co. Comm. Exp. \$15.; Co. Treas. Exp. \$400; Board of Prisoners \$80; Juror Fees \$400; Special Salary Fund--States Att'y. \$106.50; all from cash on hand, nothing to be raised by taxation.

After due consideration and investigation the bid of Foster-Bell Co. for one Sheepfoot Roller in the amount of \$3557.50 was accepted. Motion was made by Novak, seconded by Nielsen that said bid be accepted as it was considered the best bid for the interest of Charles Mix County.







Treas. having appointed Rose Donovan & Lois Wade as her deputies at \$210. per month; Victor I. Hamik also as her deputy ~~with his~~ salary fixed at ~~\$1.00 per year~~; Marlene Long and Evelyn Johnson are appointed as Clerks in the Treasurer's office at a salary of \$185. per month. Leona Meade, Register of Deeds having appointed Martha Melmer as her deputy at \$210. per month. L. E. Schreyer, State's Att'y. having appointed Opal R. Mix County for services rendered in the performance of their duties.



A petition, signed by electors of Charles Mix County requesting a change in the number of County Commissioners from 3 to 5, was submitted to the Board of County Commissioners. Following an examination of said petition the Board requested the States Attorney for advice as to further procedure. The following opinion was given:

May 1, 1956

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners
Charles Mix County, South Dakota
Gentlemen:

You have requested an opinion from me regarding the matter of the petition submitted to you on May 1, 1956 by taxpayers of Charles Mix County, South Dakota, for an increase of the number of Commissioners in this County.

Accordingly I have examined the law and find that Sec. 12.0603, SDC 1939 reads as follows: "Commissioner districts: increase or decrease of number; method; petition; election; notice; form of ballots. The number of County commissioners of any county may be increased to five or reduced to three in the manner following whenever the legal voters of the county, equal in number to 20% of the votes cast for Governor in the county at the preceding general election, petition the board of county commissioners for an increase or decrease in the number of county commissioners, said board shall submit the question to a vote of the electors of the county at an election to be held at the next primary election. Notice of the submission of such question shall be given in the notice of such primary election. If the petition is for an increase in the number of commissioners, the proposition shall be submitted by separate ballot in the following form . . ."

It is further found that Sec. 16.0213 of the SDC 1939, as amended by Chapter 54 of the 1955 Session Laws, Section 2, reads as follows:

"Notice of primary election: notice of registration; form and publication required. Not less than forty days prior to the date of holding the primary election, the county auditor shall prepare and cause to be published three times in each official newspaper published in his county, a notice of substantially the following form: . . ."

In this instance the primary election is scheduled for June 5, 1956 and the Notice of the primary election has been published and the time for publishing the notice to increase the number of commissioners along with the notice of primary election, as required by SEC. 12.0603, SDC 1939, has passed so that it is impossible to publish such notice as required by law. The publication of such notice is mandatory and accordingly there is no legal way in which the issue can be presented to the voters at this primary election.
