The Board of County Commissioners convened in session at 9:30 O'Clock A.M. with all members present; Novak, Nielsen, Holter and County Auditor Stork.

The business of the Equalization Board was taken up immediately, Mary Varuska brought the assessors valuations of the various taxing districts into the Commissioners room and each district was considered for average valuations on the classes of property comparing them to other districts. This study of values resulted in the following changes; STRUCTURES Bryan-up 18%, Carroll-up 72%, Castalia-up 73%, Choteau Creek-up 26% Darlington-up 65%, Forbes-up 87%, Goose Lake-up 41%, Hamilton-up 31%, Howard-up 28%, Highland-up 29%, Jackson-up 19%, Kennedy-up 47%, Lake George-up 23%, LaRoche-down 9%, Lawrence up 11%, Lone Tree-down 9%, Moore-up 3%, Plain Center-up 25%, Platte Twp.-up 38%, Ree-up 51% Rhoda-up 45%, Rouse-up 43%, Signal-down 5%, Wahahe-up 15%, and White Swan-up 12% BUSINESS STRUCTURES; Lawrence-up 100%, Lone Tree-up 100%, Platte Twp.-up 100%, and White Swan-up 50%. HORSES AND MULES were valued at \$50.00 all over the County and resulted in the following raises; Bryan-up 18%, Kennedy-up 18%, Lake George-up 13%, Plain Center-up 24%, Platte Twp.-up 20%, Rhoda-up 100%, and Signal-up 59%. Town of Dante-Agri. land-up 20%, Lake Andes-Structures-up 20%, Business Structures-up 49%, Platte, Residence Structures On Agricultural land-up 53%, Residences on Out Lots-up 121%, Residences on City lots-up 121% and Business Structures-up 121%. Elevators on leased sites, Dante-up 150%, Geddes-up 50%, Lake Andes-up 150%, Platte-up 10%, Ravinia-up 150% and Wagner-up 150% other Valuations were all left as turned in by the Township and Town Equalization boards.
