The Board of County Commissioners convened at 10:00 O'Clock A.M. with all members present; Commissioners Nielsen and Pranger, Chairman Novak and Auditor Stork. Chairman Novak called the Board to order and opened the meeting at 10:00 O'Clock A.M.

At 10:05 O'Clock A.M. Chairman Novak ordered the Auditor to open and read the Bids presented for the purpose of selling Charles Mix County a Motor Grader complying with the Specifications set out in the notice for Bids.

County Auditor, Stork read the Notice for Bids as published in the County papers for three consecutive weeks prior to the date of Dec. 15th, 1958 calling for Bids on one Motor Grader with the following specifications; DIESEL MOTOR- minimum H.P. 115, 13:00 x 24 -12 ply tires on all wheels, minimum weight exclusive of attachments 23, 100 lbs., 12 ft Blade with mechanical or hydraulic controls and two (2) 2 ft extensions, Power Steering, enclosed cab, Cab heater, Electric lights, Windshield wiper, Defroster, Tools and parts catalogue.

Two Bids were received containing the following descriptions;

A certified check drawn on The First National Bank of Sioux Falls, So. Dak. for \$ 1005.00 accompanied either bid.

The bids were considered by the Board and it was the opinion of all members that the best interests of the County would be served by accepting the Motor Grader listed in the # 1 Bid since this machine was only slightly used, and was bid at a saving of nearly \$ 7,000.00 to the County.

Commissioner Pranger moved that the Board accept the # 1 Bid of Foster-Bell Co. for the machine described above for the purchase price of \$ 13,043.17, this motion was seconded by Commissioner Nielsen, all members voted AYE and Chairman Novak declared the motion passed and ordered the County Auditor to complete the necessary forms to complete the purchase.



Business for the year 1958 having been completed the Board was adjourned upon motion by Nielsen, Seconded By Pranger and all members voting AYE. Chairman Novak declared the Board adjourned and commended Niels H. Nielsen for his devoted service to Charles Mix County during his several terms as Commissioner from the First District.

The Board immediately convened with Commissioner Pranger as Elected Commissioner from District 3, Commissioner Steve Thaler as elected Commissioner of District 1, and Commissioner Novak who was elected in 1956 for a four year term. Chairman of the Board for the year 1959 being the first topic for discussion was taken up at once. A Resolution allowing Convention Expense for the 1959 Annual County Officers and County Commissioners convention to be held in Mitchell on Oct. 1-2-3rd, 1959 was passed upon motion by Commissioner Thaler, seconded by Chairman Novak and all members voting AYE, and Commissioner Novak declaring the motion passed and the Resolution adopted. Application for poor relief by James C. Kubal was read and approved.

The appointment of Arlene Clemens to the position of Clerk in the office of County Treasurer, S.C. Johnson, was approved by the Board.

Frank Bartunek filed two petitions requesting the Board to put five miles of road from Dante west to the Wagner Cemetary Road on the County System. These petitions were signed by 50 Lawrence Township residents, Joe Pekas Sr. Filed one petition for the same road signed by 50 Lone Tree Township residents. The Board advised these men that the County Road System is now at its maximum and an equal amount of miles of road will have to be taken from the County Highway System before the request can be granted.
