A letter from the South Dakota Highway Dept. was placed on file stating that objection had been received to the abandonment of that part of the County Highway System in Charles Mix County described as beginning at the section corner common to Sections 14, 15, 22 and 23 in Township 96 North and Range 66, and thence running in an irregular southerly direction along the common boundaries of Sections 22 and 23 and Sections 26 and 27 Township 96 North, Range 66 to the St. Phillips Bay area on Fort Randall Reservoir. Therefore, the State Highway Commission has taken action at their regular meeting on September 1, 1964, stating that this road be retained on the County Highway System of Charles Mix County.

Nita E. Breen appointed Mrs Donna Vesely as clerk, for temporary employment at a salary of 200.00 per month. The appointment was approved.

A Tax Deed was issued to Percy Archambeau on the following described property; Lot 4, of Section 27, in Township 94 North, of Range 64 West of the 5th P.M. in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, containing 24 acres.

An Easement was approved and filed, for Royal Holter of Platte S. Dak. for construction and maintenance of a pipe line located on 758 feet west of the half mile line between Section 4 and Section 9, - 98 -68, Signal Twp.

Edward Krell appeared before the Board of County Commissioners with references to an under-pass to be built into the Federal Aid Road adjacent to his premises.
