



The Charles Mix County Board of Equalization met at 1:00 P.M. with all members present. The board agreed to make no further changes in valuations submitted by the director, and accepted all local board decisions other than those stated above. The Board adjourned as a board of equalization and reconvened as a board of County Commissioners. 2:00 P. M. being the time set for bids on seal coat for twenty miles of county road, bids were opened from Reynolds Construction co, as follows aggregate per ton in place 4.40; asphalt per ton in place 50.00 accompanied by check for \$3000.00 This being the one and only bid it was moved by Svatos and seconded by Carda to accept this bid. Voting aye Pranger, Svatos, Carda. Nay none. Reynolds Construction to post performance bond in lieu of check. It was moved by Carda 2nd by Svatos to accept Western Surety Co. policy for Workmans Compensation Insurance. Voting Aye Pranger, Svatos, Carda. Nay none. The Commissioners reviewed the history of 30% raise in valuation of real estate that Charles Mix County received last year due to an appeal made by Douglas County to The State Board of Equalization pursuant to SDCL 1967 10-11-42 and 10-11-47. On or about August 26, 1969 the Commissioners met the States Attorney, Lee Tappe, to discuss an appeal to the Circuit Court in regard to the said 30% raise on all agricultural land outside corporate limits. This notice of appeal was made by the States Attorney, but with an expressed doubt to the commissioners as to any good grounds for appeal. The States Attorney advised that to contest an action of the State Board there are three ways which basically are: 1. Was the Statute constitutional? 2. Was the State Board vested with powers to raise the valuation under the Statute; 3. If the Statute is constitutional and if the Board was given such powers was their action arbitrary and capricious?. The States Attorney delved into the three questions and found that the constitutionality of the law has been tried in both Hanson and Minnehaha County and the Court upheld the constitutionality of

the law. The law explicitly gives the State Board of Equalization the power to raise or lower valuation in overlapping school districts if the county Commissioners of the overlapping district appeals to the State Board (This is what the Douglas County Commissioners did).

The record shows that the raise was based on sales ratio and there is nothing to show that the State Board acted arbitrarily or capriciously.

With this explanation the State Attorney advised the commissioners to drop the appeal. He suggested that Charles Mix County appeal Gregory, Brule and possibly Aurora counties all of which have overlapping school districts in Charles Mix County, with agricultural land averages below that of Charles Mix County. The Charles Mix County Commissioners voiced their reluctance to accept the 30% raise by the State Board of Equalization, but in view of the States Attorney opinion and explanation, and until some change can possibly be made in the law agreed that the practical procedure would be to drop the appeal.






