Will allow reasonable time for Doctor Appointments. (If sick leave time is abused, it will result in requiring a signed statement from physician before sick leave can be allowed.) HOLIDAYS: New Years Day, Presidents Day, 1/2 day Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day. VACATION: 120 Hours. Consult and make arrangements with Highway Superintendent before taking. WAGE SCALE: All wages retroactive until March 1, 1972. Starting Wage, Truck Drivers, Misc. Work 435.00 per month; Semi-skilled and starting equipment operator 475.00 per month; Equipment Operator 500.00 per month; Foreman 525.00 per month. MILEAGE: Employees to be paid 12c per mile for use of own vehicle. GENERAL POLICY: No purchases by employees other than emergency repair, etc., permitted without authorization from Highway Superintendent. Loaning or selling county highway equipment, planks, culverts, tools, etc., by employees is not permitted without authorization from Highway Superintendent or County Commissioners. Excessive loss of tools, etc., lost or left lying at projects, etc., will not be tolerated, and cost of same may be deducted from wages of person responsible. Highway Superintendent is instructed to restrict unnecessary driving of county trucks and pickups, or of driving more vehicles to projects, etc., than are necessary. Operators of County equipment and trucks are responsible for the service and maintenance of same. Major breakdown or damage due to negligence of operator will be considered cause for release from employment. Highway Superintendent is required to run the County Highway Department, Supervise the Road work, be responsible for the proper accounting, do the hiring and firing. The County Commissioners will determine the policy of the Highway Department as designated by statute. GRIEVANCE: 1. If an employee has a grievance based on any policy the County Commissioners of Charles Mix County have established, he shall be entitled to bring same, either alone or with his foreman, to the attention of his Superintendent, and to have an answer at the same time. 2. If no satisfactory solution is reached at that time he shall have ten (10) working days in which to put in writing that which occurred, and to present to the Board of County Commissioners a full outline of the grievance. The Employer shall then have thirty (30) days in which to air the grievance, and to make its decision in writing. If no answer is received in that time the grievance is considered ruled in favor of the grieved employee. 3. If no satisfactory results are reached by the employer at that time it can be subject to the South Dakota Department of Labor and Management Relations.
