RESOLUTION

Policies, appointments, wage scale as adopted by the Board of County Commissioners at a Special Meeting, January 16, 1973, pertaining to the Highway Department, in regard to administration, equipment, road employees, and all other employees of Charles Mix County. This to be effective January 1, through December 31, 1973.

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the best interest of the County of Charles Mix and necessary for the prompt and accurate dispatch of business in the various departments, the following appointments were approved, ... wage scale and policies established:

SALARIES AND SALARY SCALE:

Be it resolved that the starting wage for inexperienced help, Court House Employees be \$ 270.00 per month for the first three (3) months of employment and after three (3) months of satisfactory employment an increase of \$10.00 per month be given every three (3) months until the established pay scale has been reached. No part time help shall draw more than a clerk's wages. Starting hourly wage will be \$1.55.00 per hour, with increases to be determined by recommendation of the hiring Officer with approval of County Commissioners.

WORKING HOURS: Highway Employees Road Crew: November 15 to April 15, eight (8) hour days, from 8:00 A. M to 4:30P. M. (one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) hour for lunch) April 15 to November 15, ten(10) hours per day, from 7 A. M. to 5:30 P. M. (one half($\frac{1}{2}$) for lunch). First two hours over regular eight (8) hour day, considered compensation time, which may accumulate to(40) forty hours. Anything over ten (10) hours in a work day will be compensated at the regular hourly wage. Saturday, Sunday and Holidays paid regular hourly wage. Any one required to work on the roads on a holiday is paid for the Holiday plus regular time. Court House Employees work five day week eight (8) hour day according to statute, Monday through Friday.

SICK LEAVE: All employees who have completed ninety (90) days satisfactory employment shall be entitled to twelve (12) days a year sick leave which can be used at any time during the year and may be accumulated at the rate of one (1) day a month up to a maximum of sixty (60) days. The foregoing leave when granted is for sickness only, and if at anytime the employer questions the validity of the sickness the employee shall be required to furnish adequate proof of actual illness, which the employer may request from either the hiring Officer or the employee. If an employee terminates, and has used more sick leave than the one day (1) a month he is allowed, his monthly pay will be adjusted accordingly.

VACATION: Court House Employees, after serving one (1) year continuous service, shall be entitled to one (1) week (Five (5) working days) annual leave and after two (2) years employment be entitled to two (2) weeks (ten (10) working days) annual leave. Road Employees will be allowed, after one (1) year service, fifty (50) hours annual leave and after two (2) years service, one hundred (100) hours annual leave, If an employee's employment is terminated his vacation time will be pro rated and he will be paid vacation time earned. Employees will consult and make arrangements with the hiring officer or Highway Superintendent as the case may be.

HOLIDAYS: As set by statute plus one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) day for Good Friday.

FUNERAL LEAVE: In the event of death in the immediate family and upon agreement by employer, the employee will be allowed up to three days time off with pay. Immediate family includes spouse, son, daughter, mother, father, step son, step daughter, brother sister, mother-in-law, father-in-law, grandmother and grandfather. With employers permission reasonable time will be granted for other funeral attendance with out pay, or with use of vacation time.

No change was made in Mileage, grievance or General Policy as was drawn up last year and is as follows:

MILEAGE: Employees to be paid 12¢ per mile for use of own vehicle. *Rd + Budget Crew*
GENERAL POLICY:

No purchases by employees other than emergency repair, etc., permitted without authorization from the Highway Superintendent.
Lending or selling county highway equipment, planks, culverts, tools, etc., by employees is not permitted without authorization from Highway Superintendent or County Commissioners.
Excessive loss of tools, etc., lost or left lying at projects, etc., will not be tolerated, and cost of same may be deducted from wages of person responsible.

Highway Superintendent is instructed to restrict unnecessary driving of county trucks and pickups, or of driving more vehicles to projects, etc., than are necessary.

Operators of county equipment and trucks are responsible for the service and maintenance of same. Major breakdown or damage due to negligence of operator will be considered cause for release from employment.


Highway Superintendent is required to run the County Highway Department, supervise the road work, be responsible for the proper accounting, do the hiring and firing. The County Commissioners will determine the policy of the Highway Department as designated by statute.

GRIEVANCE:

1. If an employee has a grievance based on any policy the County Commissioners of Charles Mix County have established, he shall be entitled to bring same, either alone or with his foreman, to the attention of his superintendent and to have an answer at the same time.
2. If no satisfactory solution is reached at that time he shall have (10) working days in which to put in writing that which occurred, and to present to the Board of County Commissioners a full outline of the grievance. The Employer shall then have thirty (30) days in which to air the grievance, and to make its decision in writing. If no answer is received in that time the grievance is considered ruled in favor of the grieved employee.
3. If no satisfactory results are reached by the employer at that time it can be subject to the South Dakota Department of Labor and Management Relations. The Commissioner of the Department of Labor and Management Relations shall investigate and issue a recommended decision.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Board of Commissioners pool their mileage allowance.
