



December 16, 1976

The auditor presented a letter from Reed Johnston, agents for Time Insurance Co, noting various additional coverages and additional premiums there-on. No definite action was taken.


A letter from the Department of Revenue was read where in the Dept stated that the percentages of 45% of true and full value on urban property and 35% of full and true value on rural property for taxable purposes was not acceptable by the Department, contending that the procedure was not conforming to the legislative established classes. The Commissioners agreed that the classes should have stated Ag and Non Ag rather than Rural and urban, but this is not acceptable by the department of Revenue either. The Department requires that one percentage must be used or fix a separate percentage for each of the four classed to wit; Agricultural Property, both personal and real with in school districts, Non agricultural property, both personal and real, with in school districts for school taxation only. Real Property with in all other sub divisions for all other tax purposes, personal property with in all other sub divisions for all other tax purposes. The Commissioners determined that 35% applied to all properties would result in sufficient valuation to satisfy tax needs for school and county purposes, but 35% applied against city properties would not suffice for city budgets. Applying four percentages, (only other alternative) would result in many complications in figuring levies and computing taxes. City officials were notified of the situation.

Mayor Les Howard of Platte and Mayor Gil Gau of Lake Andes met with the board in regard to the matter.

In as much as 34 counties in the State are involved with the same problem, a meeting has been scheduled at Pierre for August 10 at 1:00 p.m. for all counties who have not come to any agreement.

Harold Arshem, John Buitenbos and Raymond Fransens of Hamilton Township met with the board in regard to road problems.

An Easement was granted to Jim Ehrisman to run a water line under a county road between section 3-96-64 and section 10-96-64 Plain Center Township.




