WORKING HOUR: Courthouse Employees: Five days a week, Eight Hours a day, 8:00 A.M. to 4:30 PM, ½ hour off for lunch, Courthouse to remain open over noon hour; Monday through Friday.

HIGHWAY ROAD CREW: About April 1, to October 1, 10 hours per day and 4 days per week, about October 1, to March 31, 8 hours per day and five days per week. Anyone required to work on a holiday will receive time and one half pay.

EXAMPLE: If Daily wage is \$22.00, Holiday pay will be \$33.00 per day. Saturday or Sunday pay will be time and one-half or comp time. (To be worked out with the Highway Supt.) Comp Time is accumulative to 40 hours per year. Over 40 hours, will be time and one-half pay.

JAILER DISPATCHERS: Anyone required to work on Holidays and days the Courthouse is closed for days declared holidays by the Governor will receive time and one-half pay or time and one-half comp time; and when a holiday or declared holiday falls on his Regular day off, on these days he will get 8 hours comp time for each day. This does not pertain to snow days. In the event a substitute is paid by the county to work his regular shift which falls on a holiday or a declared holiday (while he is taking annual, comp, sick leave, funeral leave, etc.), he will receive no compensation; however, he will not be required to credit his time for time taken on this holiday/for declared holiday, such as annual, sick leave, etc. Comp time is accumulative to 100 hours per year. Over 100 hours will be time and one-half pay.

SICK LEAVE: All full time employees who have completed 90 days satisfactory employment shall be entitled to 12 days a year sick leave which can be used at any time during the year. This may be accumulated at the rate of one (1) day a month up to sixty (60) days. The foregoing leave is for sickness only, and if at any time the employer questions the validity of the sickness the employee shall be required to furnish adequate proof of actual illness, which the employer may request from either the hiring officer or the employee. If an employee terminates, and has used more than the one day per month sick leave, his monthly pay will be adjusted accordingly. Anyone who uses 2 weeks or more of sick leave in 1 month will not be credited

MATERNITY LEAVE: Six weeks (6) including prenatal and postnatal leave. Must use 6 weeks sick leave or overall leave or combination of both or leave without pay. Employee may take advanced sick leave of 5 days to be deducted from pay if terminated prior to the 5 days accumulation.

VACATION: Courthouse Employees, after serving one (1) year continuous service shall be entitled to one (1) week, five (5) working days annual leave, and after two (2) years employment shall be entitled to two (2) weeks, Ten (10) working days annual leave. Road Employees, will be allowed after one (1) year service, 40 hours annual leave and after two (2) years service eighty (80) hours annual leave. If an employee is terminated his vacation time will be prorated and he will be paid vacation time earned. Employee will consult and make arrangements in regard to vacation and comp time with hiring officer or Highway Supt. as case may be.

After serving the ten (10) years continuous service, Courthouse employees shall be entitled to three (3) weeks, fifteen (15) working days annual leave and Road Crew shall be entitled to one hundred twenty (120) hours annual leave. Vacation time is not accumulated from one year to the next.

HOLIDAYS: AS PER STATUTE, AND DAYS DECLARED HOLIDAYS BY GOVERNOR.

STORM DAYS: Allow employees 3 storm days, anything after 3 days will be used as Vacation or NO PAY days. Storm days are up to the discretion of the County Commissioners. This does not pertain to road crew.

FUNERAL LEAVE: In the event of death in the immediate family, and upon agreement by employer the employee will be allowed up to three days time off with pay. Specifically stressed that if more than one day is used permission must be obtained from employer. Immediate family includes the following of either the employee or his or her spouse, son, daughter, mother, father, stepson, stepdaughter, brother, sister, grandmother, grandfather, aunts, and uncles. With employers permission reasonable time will be granted for other funeral attendance with out pay, or use of vacation time.

MILEAGE AND PER DIEM: Employees to be compensated at 20.5¢ per mile, except the Sheriff and Deputies who will receive 27¢ per mile. Meals: Breakfast \$3.50, Lunch \$5.50, and Dinner \$7.00, for out of County Business. Motel rooms reimburseable upon presentation of receipt.

HIRING HELP: If help is to be hired the Commissioners are to be informed before advertising for help.

No two people from the same family can work in the same office

The Commissioners shall not take extra meeting pay that comes out of the County Budget.

*Anyone who uses 2 weeks or more of sick leave in 1 month will not be credited with their one day sick leave for that month.

GENERAL POLICY FOR HIGHWAY EMPLOYEES: No purchase by employees other than emergency repair, etc. permitted without authorization from Highway Supt. Loaning or selling County Highway equipment, planks, tools, culverts, etc. by employees is not permitted without authorization from Highway Supt. or County Commissioners. Excessive loss of tools, lost or left lying at projects, will not be tolerated, and cost of same may be deducted from wages of person responsible. Highway Supt. is instructed to restrict unnecessary driving of county trucks and pickups, or of driving more vehicles to projects than necessary. Operators of County equipment and trucks are responsible for the service and maintenance of same. Major break downs or damage due to negligence of the operator will be considered cause for release from employment. Highway Supt. is required to run the County Highway Department, Supervise the road work be responsible for proper accounting, do the hiring and firing. The County Commissioners will determine the policy of the Highway Department as designated by statute.

WHEREAS, the audit report for Charles Mix County for the years ended December 31, 1985 and 1986 has identified certain deficiencies in internal accounting controls over transactions of the Napa-Platte Community Development Block Grant project, and

WHEREAS, the above said audit report recommends that internal accounting controls on federal funds received by Charles Mix County be strengthened, and

WHEREAS, the Charles Mix County Board of Commissioners agrees with the audit report recommendations and the need for adequate internal accounting controls on federal funds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following internal accounting controls shall be implemented for all federal funds received by Charles Mix County:

- 1) All disbursements of federal funds shall be made on checks signed by the county treasurer and county auditor.
